**1.MILIEU (noun):** प्रतिवेश

**Pronunciation:** muh·lyoo

**Meaning:** a person's social environment.

**Synonyms:** environment, ambient, atmosphere

**Antonyms:** advantage, boon, calm.

**Sentence:** Coming from another milieu, she found life as an actor's wife very strange at first.

**2.OBDURACY (noun) :** हठ

**Pronunciation:** awb·joo·ruh·see

**Meaning:** a steadfast adherence to an opinion, purpose, or course of action in spite of reason, arguments, or persuasion

**Synonyms:** obdurateness, obstinacy, stubbornness

**Antonyms:** broad-mindedness, open-mindedness, reasonability

**Sentence:** His error was sheer obduracy in refusing to admit a mistake.

**3.FORSOOTH (adv.) :** वास्तव में

**Pronunciation:** fuh·sooth

**Meaning:** Indeed (often used ironically or to express surprise or indignation).

**Synonyms:** actually, frankly, honestly

**Antonyms:** had, kept, possessed

**Sentence:** Forsooth, there is no one I trust more.

**4.CONFRONTATION (noun) :** आमना-सामना

**Pronunciation:** kawn·fruhnt·ay·shn

**Meaning:** a hostile or argumentative meeting or situation between opposing parties.

**Synonyms:** conflict, clash, brush

**Antonyms:** concord, harmony, peace

**Sentence:** The government was dragged willy-nilly into the confrontation.

**5.DISCONSOLATE (adj.) :** निराश

**Pronunciation:** duh·skawn·suh·luht

**Meaning:** without consolation or comfort; unhappy.

**Synonyms:** unhappy, doleful, woebegone

**Antonyms:** happy, cheerful, blissful

**Sentence:** The death of her father left Mary disconsolate.

**6.REMIT (verb) :** रद्द करना

**Pronunciation:** 'ri:mit

**Meaning:** cancel or refrain from exacting or inflicting (a debt or punishment).

**Synonyms:** cancel, revoke, abrogate

**Antonyms:** hold, keep, receive.

**Sentence:** The legislature has remitted the matter to the next session,

**7.HECTORED (verb) :** बदमाशी से बात करना

**Pronunciation:** fak·tuhd

**Meaning:** talk to (someone) in a bullying way.

**Synonyms:** bully, intimidate, browbeat

**Antonyms:** comforted, consoled, soothed

**Sentence:** Brooks had hectored employees who refused to work overtime.

**8.PERFERVID (adj.) :** उत्साही

**Pronunciation:** per-fur-vid

**Meaning:** intense and impassioned.

**Synonyms:** ardent, emotional, fervent

**Antonyms:** dispassionate, emotionless, impassive

**Sentence:** I feel the people of the city are perfervid.

**9.INDUBITABLE (adj.) :** ज़ाहिर

**Pronunciation:** uhn·dyoo·buh·tuh·bl

**Meaning:** impossible to doubt; unquestionable.

**Synonyms:** unquestionable, undoubtedly, indisputable

**Antonyms:** doubtful, dubious, iffy

**Sentence:** The indubitable evidence we produced bore down our opponents in the debate.

**10.RAPPROCHEMENT (noun) :** मेल-मिलाप

**Pronunciation:** ra·prawsh·mawn

**Meaning:** (especially in international relations) an establishment or resumption of harmonious relations.

**Synonyms:** reconciliation, fellowship, rapport


**Antonyms:** alienation, disaffection, disgruntlement

**Sentence:** I hope for a rapprochement between our two countries.

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
