



1. M. Mohan Appointed as Director of ISRO's Liquid Propulsion Systems Centre

M. Mohan has been appointed as the Director of ISRO's Liquid Propulsion Systems Centre (LPSC), taking charge on January 27, 2025. He succeeds Dr. V. Narayanan, who was recently appointed as the ISRO Chairman. Mohan has held key leadership roles in ISRO, including Director (Projects) at the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) and Project Director for major GSLV missions. His contributions include leading the Moon Impact Probe on Chandrayaan-1, which placed the Indian flag on the lunar surface.



As LPSC Director, he will oversee the development of liquid propulsion systems for India's space missions.

2. Assam Announces Dibrugarh as Second Capital

The Assam government has announced Dibrugarh as the state's second capital, a significant move aimed at decentralizing administrative functions. The decision is expected to help ease the pressure on Guwahati, the current capital, by distributing governmental activities across the state. Dibrugarh, located in the eastern part of Assam, will serve as a hub for administration and development in the region. This step is also part of the state government's broader plan to promote balanced growth and better governance in the northeastern regions of Assam. The



move has been welcomed by many, as it promises to boost infrastructure, employment, and economic activities in Dibrugarh.

- The city has come a long way from its complex past, when it was once a center for militancy, particularly for the proscribed group ULFA(I).
- The Assam government is investing heavily in urban development, with the Chief Minister laying the foundation for four major flyovers costing Rs 377 crores to improve infrastructure and connectivity.
- Dibrugarh is being positioned as a hub for investment and business, with the government promoting it as a potential site for semiconductor manufacturing and collaborating with major corporations to develop the energy sector.
- The announcement coincided with Republic Day celebrations, marking a significant transformation for the city and its people, despite recent low-intensity blasts claimed by ULFA(I) on January 26, 2025.

3. Alexander Lukashenko re-elected as Belarus's President

Alexander Lukashenko has been re-elected as the President of Belarus, extending his long-standing rule since 1994. The election, however, was marred by allegations of fraud and a lack of transparency, sparking widespread protests across the country. Opposition leaders and international observers have criticized the electoral process,



calling it neither free nor fair. Despite these concerns, Lukashenko maintains strong support from the security forces and key allies like Russia. His re-election signals a continuation of his authoritarian governance, with potential crackdowns on dissent and tighter control over political opposition.

- Lukashenko's victory was widely expected, with the opposition calling the election a "farce" and a "sham" due to the lack of democratic freedoms and the repression of opposition candidates.
- The election saw a turnout of 85.70%, with Lukashenko winning 5,136,995 votes, while his closest rival, Sergei Syrankov, received just 189,930 votes.
- The European Union's foreign policy chief, Kaja Kallas, called the election a "blatant affront to democracy", and the exiled Belarus opposition leader, Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya, described it as a "senseless farce".
- Lukashenko's re-election has been congratulated by Russian president Vladimir Putin and Chinese president Xi Jinping, among others.
- The election has been criticized for its lack of transparency and democratic freedoms, with the opposition claiming that the vote was rigged and that Lukashenko's victory was predetermined.

4. Jasprit Bumrah Won ICC Men's Test Cricketer of the Year 2024

Indian fast bowler Jasprit Bumrah has been honored with the ICC Men's Test Cricketer of the Year award for 2024, following a remarkable performance throughout the year. After recovering from a back injury in late 2023, Bumrah emerged as the leading wicket-taker, claiming 71 wickets in 13 matches, surpassing his closest competitor, Gus Atkinson, by 19 wickets. His exceptional average of 14.92 and a strike rate of 30.1 set new benchmarks among bowlers with over 70 wickets in a calendar year. Notably,



during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy in Australia, Bumrah secured 32 wickets in five matches at an average of 13.06, earning him the Player of the Series title, even though India lost the series. This accolade marks Bumrah as the first Indian cricketer to receive this award since Virat Kohli in 2018.

• He took 71 wickets in 2024, the highest by any bowler in the year, with a stunning average of 14.92 and a strike rate of 30.1.



- Bumrah's performance was instrumental in India's wins against England and Bangladesh at home, as well as their impressive showings in South Africa and Australia.
- He became the fourth Indian bowler to claim more than 70 Test wickets in a calendar year, joining an elite group that includes Ravichandran Ashwin, Anil Kumble, and Kapil Dev.
- Bumrah's average of 14.92 was the lowest amongst all the 17 bowlers who registered more than 70 wickets in Test cricket in a calendar year.
- He also won the Sir Garfield Sobers Trophy for ICC Men's Cricketer of the Year, edging out nominees like Travis Head, Joe Root, and Harry Brook, and becoming the fifth Indian to win the award.
