

VOCABULARY

1. REBELLIOUS (ADJECTIVE): अवज्ञापूर्ण

Pronunciation: ruh•bel•ee•uh

Meaning: defiant.

Synonyms: disobedient, insubordinate

Antonyms: conformist

Sentence: I became very rebellious and opted out.

2. MAGNIFICENCE (NOUN): अव्यता

Pronunciation: mag•ni•fuh•sns

Meaning: splendor.

Synonyms: grandeur, greatness

Antonyms: cheapness

Sentence: The magnificence of the surrounding countryside captured everyone's attention.

3. RUDDY (ADJECTIVE): लाल

Pronunciation: ruh•dee

Meaning: reddish.

Synonyms: red, rosy

Antonyms: pale

Sentence: He's got the classic ruddy cheeks and twinkle in his eye.

4. CONTEMPT (NOUN): तिरस्कार

Pronunciation: kuhn•tempt

Meaning: scorn.

Synonyms: disdain, disrespect

Antonyms: respect

Sentence: He stared at me with total contempt.

5. POPULIST (ADJECTIVE): जनवादी या लोकवादी

Pronunciation: paw•pyoo•luhst

Meaning: relating to or characteristic of a political approach.

Synonyms: Demagogue, people-oriented, grassroots.

Antonyms: Elitist, exclusive, establishment-friendly.

Sentence: The leader's populist message resonated with voters, promising solutions to their challenges.

6. CROSSROADS (noun): चौराहा

Pronunciation: kraw•srodez

Meaning: a point where two or more roads intersect.

Synonyms: Intersection, junction, turning point

Antonyms: Straight path, straightforward route, continuity.

Sentence: The company is at a major crossroads regarding its future plans.

7. COALITION (NOUN): गठबंधन

Pronunciation: koh•uh•li•shn

Meaning: a temporary alliance or partnership formed by different groups, individuals or parties

Synonyms: Alliance, union, partnership, federation, confederation.

Antonyms: Rivalry, opposition, discord, disunion.

Sentence: The two political parties formed a coalition to address the pressing economic issues facing the country.

8. RADICAL (ADJECTIVE): मौलिक

Pronunciation: ra•duh•kl

Meaning: favoring or making thorough or complete changes in political, economic.

Synonyms: extremist, drastic, thorough, sweeping.

Antonyms: Conservative, moderate, gradual.

Sentence: The new technology introduced a radical change in the industry.

9. INFLUX(NOUN): आगम

Pronunciation: in•fluhks

Meaning: the arrival or entry of a large number of people or things.

Synonyms: Inflow, arrival, incursion, incurrence, inundation.

Antonyms: Outflow, departure, exodus, egress.

Sentence: The city is preparing for a large influx of tourists this summer.
