

1. CAPACIOUS (ADJECTIVE): विशाल

Pronunciation: kuh·pay·shuhs

Meaning: a space or container that is able to hold or accommodate a

significant amount.

Synonyms: Spacious, Roomy, Ample **Antonyms:** Compact, Cramped, Narrow

Sentence: The house had a capacious living room with high ceilings and large

windows, providing a sense of openness and comfort.

2. PRANCE (VERB): उछल-कूद

Pronunciation: praans

Meaning: to move with high spirits or lively steps, especially in a playful or proud

manner.

Synonyms: Dance, Skip, Strut, Caper, Frolic **Antonyms:** Stumble, Trudge, Plod, Lumber

Sentence: The little girl couldn't contain her excitement and began to prance around

the room, twirling and leaping with joy.

3. VEILED (ADJECTIVE): घूंघटमें

Pronunciation: vayld

Meaning: concealed or hidden.

Synonyms: Covered, Masked, Obscured **Antonyms:** Revealed, Exposed, Clear

Sentence: The veiled figure stood silently in the corner, her face hidden beneath a

black veil.

4. VANDALISED (VERB): तोड़-फोड़

Pronunciation: van·dal·ized

Meaning: to intentionally damage, destroy, or deface property or public belongings.

Synonyms: Defaced, Desecrated

Antonyms: Restored, Repaired, Preserved

Sentence: The abandoned building had been vandalized with graffiti and broken

windows, leaving a sad and neglected impression on the neighborhood.

5. LANGUISH (VERB): क्षीणहोना

Pronunciation: lang·gvuhsh

Meaning: to remain in an unpleasant or undesirable situation without improvement or

progress.

Synonyms: Weaken, Wane **Antonyms:** Strengthen, Prosper

Sentence: The abandoned building languished, becoming a home for rats and weeds.

6. LOOMING (VERB, ADJECTIVE): धुंधला दिखाई देना

Pronunciation: loom·uhng

Meaning: to appear as a shape that is not clear and in a way that seems frightening.

Synonyms: Hovering, Threatening

Antonyms: Appeared

Sentence: The looming deadline for the project added pressure to the team to work

more efficiently.

7. PETULANT (ADJECTIVE): त्नक मिज़ाज

Pronunciation: peh·tyu·luhnt

Meaning: bad-tempered and unreasonable, especially because you cannot have or do

what you want.

Synonyms: Peevish, Moody **Antonyms:** Calm, Tranquil

Sentence: The tired child became petulant when her parents told her it was time to

leave the playground.

8. DISSIPATED (VERB, ADJECTIVE): नष्टचरित्र

Pronunciation: di·suh·payt·uhd

Meaning: someone who wastes their time, energy, or resources on excessive

Synonyms: Profligate, Indulgent **Antonyms:** Frugal, sensible

Sentence: The dissipated lifestyle of constant partying and drinking led to his

downfall.

9. FIERY (ADJECTIVE): उग्र

Pronunciation: fai·uh·ree

Meaning: burning or emitting flames.

Synonyms: Fervent, Blaze **Antonyms:** Cool, Apathetic

Sentence: The fiery dragon breathed out flames, scorching everything in its path.

10. DISASTROUS (ADJECTIVE): विनाशकारी

Pronunciation: di·zaa·struhs
Meaning: causing great damage.

Synonyms: Catastrophic, Calamitous **Antonyms:** Fortunate, Auspicious

Sentence: The earthquake had a disastrous impact on the city, causing widespread

destruction and loss of life.
