# 1. ZENITH (noun) - शीर्षबिंदु

**Pronunciation**: zeh·nuhth

**Meaning**: the time at which something is most powerful or successful

Synonyms: height, top, peak, acme, pinnacle, apex, apogee

**Antonyms**: nadir, bottom

Usage: The singer reached her zenith when she sold over twelve million records in 2013.

#### 2. DREAD (noun) – भय

Pronunciation: dred

**Meaning**: great fear or apprehension

Synonyms: fear, apprehension, trepidation, anxiety, worry, concern, foreboding

**Antonyms**: confidence

Usage: Terror and <u>dread</u> filled the minds of all of the passengers aboard the failing aircraft.

## 3. SUPERCILIOUS (adjective) – घमंडी

**Pronunciation**: soo·puh·si·lee·uhs

**Meaning**: behaving or looking as though one thinks one is superior to others **Synonyms**: arrogant, haughty, conceited, disdainful, overbearing, pompous,

condescending

Antonyms: humble, modest

Usage: The supercilious woman bragged about living in a mansion to everyone at the

banquet.

### 4. TAME (adjective) – पालतू

**Pronunciation**: teim

Meaning: not dangerous or frightened of people

Synonyms: domesticated, trained, pet, docile, tamed, disciplined, gentle, mild





Antonyms: wild, fierce

Usage: The wild tiger lost its fight after a few days in the cage and eventually became

tame.

# 5. AFFLUENCE (noun) – समृद्धि

**Pronunciation**: a·floo·uhns

Meaning: the state of having a great deal of money

Synonyms: wealth, prosperity, opulence, fortune, richness, luxury, plenty

**Antonyms**: poverty

**Usage**: The businessman uses his <u>affluence</u> to help people in need.



## 6. CONSEQUENTIAL (adjective) – महत्त्वपूर्ण

**Pronunciation**: kon·suh·kwen·shl **Meaning**: important; significant

Synonyms: important, significant, major, serious, weighty, material, appreciable

Antonyms: insignificant, minor

Usage: The partial footprint was <u>consequential</u> in solving the case.

#### 7. FUSION (noun) - विलय



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Pronunciation: fyoo·zhn

Meaning: the process or result of joining two or more things together to form a single

entity

Synonyms: blend, merging, combination, amalgamation, joining, bonding

Antonyms: separation, segregation

**Usage**: Brass is formed by the fusion of copper and zinc.

#### 8. DISCOMFIT (verb) - शर्मिंदा करना

Pronunciation: duh-skuhm-fuht

Meaning: make someone feel uneasy or embarrassed

Synonyms: embarrass, abash, disconcert, nonplus, discompose, discomfort, unsettle

Antonyms: reassure

Usage: The manager's mean look served to discomfit me during the interview.

#### 9. FOOLPROOF (adjective) - अच्क

**Pronunciation**: fool·proof

Meaning: incapable of going wrong

Synonyms: infallible, unfailing, dependable, reliable, trustworthy, certain, unerring

Antonyms: flawed, inaccurate, faulty

**Usage**: He tried to devise a <u>foolproof</u> plan for getting rid of termites.

#### 10. ALIEN (adjective) – अजनबी

Pronunciation: ei·lee·uhn

Meaning: unfamiliar or unrecognized

Synonyms: unfamiliar, unknown, foreign, strange, peculiar, odd, bizarre

Antonyms: familiar, known

Usage: When I first went to New York, it all felt very <u>alien</u> to me.



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
