1. UNIFIER (noun): एकीकारक

Pronunciation: unifier

Meaning: a person or thing that brings others together

Synonym: Consolidator, integrator, unite

Antonym: Divider, separator, segregate

Sentence: He was regarded as a unifier who could bridge the gap between diverse groups within the party.

2. DIATRIBE (noun) : अभियोगात्मक भाषण

Pronunciation: dai.uh.tribe

Meaning: a forceful and bitter verbal attack against someone or something

Synonym: Tirade, rant, harangue

Antonym: Praise, compliment, honor

Sentence: His speech turned into a diatribe against the failures of the previous administration.

3. FACADE (noun) : मुखौटा

Pronunciation: fuh.saad

Meaning: an outward appearance that is maintained to conceal a less pleasant reality

Synonym: Front, guise, face

Antonym: Reality, authenticity

Sentence: Behind the facade of a happy marriage was a couple struggling to communicate.

4. COMMISSION (noun) : आयोग

Pronunciation: kuh.mi.shn

Meaning : an official group of people who are asked to find out about something

Synonym: Mandate, task, work

Antonym: Discharge, dismissal, firing

Sentence: He received a commission to investigate the irregularities in the voting process.

5. EXAGGERATE (verb) : अतिशयोक्तिपूर्ण

Pronunciation: uhg.za.juh.rayt.uhd

Meaning: represent(something) as being larger, better, or worse than it really is

Synonym: Overstate, embellish , overplayed

Antonym: Understate, downplay

Sentence: He has a tendency to exaggerate the difficulties he faces at work.

6. PROPAGANDA (noun): प्रचार करना

Pronunciation: praw.puh.gan.duh

Meaning: information, especially biased or misleading, used to promote a political cause or point of view

Synonym: Disinformation, agitation

Antonym: Truth, reality

Sentence: The documentary was criticized for being more propaganda than fact.

7. DYNAMISM (noun): गतिशीलता

Pronunciation: dai.nuh.mi.zm

Meaning: the quality of being dynamic and energetic

Synonym: Vigor, energy, life

Antonym: Lethargy, stagnation , laziness

Sentence: The new CEO brought a sense of dynamism to the company that was contagious.

8. AKIN (adj) : (समान)

Pronunciation: uh.kin

Meaning: similar to something

Synonym: Similar, related, near

Antonym: Unrelated, dissimilar

Sentence: The two novels are akin in their themes of heroism and adventure.

9. INEXORABLE(adj) : कठोर

Pronunciation: uhn.ek.suh.ruh.bl

Meaning: impossible to stop or prevent

Synonyms: relentless , non-stop, steady

Antonyms: unsure , doubtful , unclear

Sentence: the doctors were inexorable, and there was nothing to be done

10. INDOLENT(adj) : आलसी

Pronunciation: in.duh.luhnt

Meaning: not wanting to work; lazy

Synonyms: lazy, idle, torpid

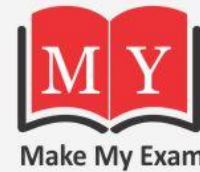
Antonyms: industrious , energetic

Sentence: cats are indolent creatures.

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
