

### 1. JEOPARDY (noun) – खतरा

**Pronunciation:** jeep·ar·dy

**Meaning:** danger of loss, harm, or failure.

**Synonyms:** danger, peril, endangerment

**Antonyms:** safety, secure, security

**Sentence:** The city's firefighters routinely put their lives in jeopardy by executing daring rescues.

### 2. ASSAIL (verb) – आक्रमण करना

**Pronunciation:** as·sail

**Meaning:** make a concerted or violent attack on.

**Synonyms:** attack, assault, rush

**Antonyms:** defend, guard, protect

**Sentence:** The Scots army assailed Edward's army from the rear.

### 3. TEMPTING (adj) – मोहक

**Pronunciation:** tempt·ing

**Meaning:** appealing to or attracting someone, even if wrong or inadvisable.

**Synonyms:** enticing, alluring, attractive

**Antonyms:** boring, irksome, tedious

**Sentence:** And maybe, I don't want you tempting me to do something I shouldn't.

### 4. MONOTONOUS (adj) – नीरस

**Pronunciation:** mo·not·o·nous

**Meaning:** dull, tedious, and repetitious; lacking in variety and interest.

**Synonyms:** tedious, boring, dull

**Antonyms:** engaging, engrossing, gripping

**Sentence:** The lecturer's monotonous speech put us to sleep.

### 5. ELOQUENT (adj) – सुवक्ता

**Pronunciation:** el·o·quent

**Meaning:** fluent or persuasive in speaking or writing.

**Synonyms:** persuasive, expressive, articulate

**Antonyms:** inarticulate, ineloquent, unvocal

**Sentence:** His speeches in the chamber were always eloquent and powerful.

**6. EMBELLISH (verb) – संवारना****Pronunciation:** em·bel·lish**Meaning:** make (something) more attractive by the addition of decorative details or features.**Synonyms:** decorate, adorn, enrich**Antonyms:** blemish, deface, disfigure**Sentence:** Grandma likes to embellish her knitting by hiding secret messages in the pattern.**7. MUSTER (noun) – एकत्र होना****Pronunciation:** mus·ter**Meaning:** assemble (troops), especially for inspection or in preparation for battle.**Synonyms:** assemble, bring together, gather**Antonyms:** entity, single, unit**Sentence:** 17,000 men had been mustered on Haldon Hill.**8. SOPPING (adj) – तर****Pronunciation:** sop·ping**Meaning:** saturated with liquid; wet through.**Synonyms:** watery, wet, moist**Antonyms:** arid, dry, unwatered**Sentence:** Get those sopping clothes off,**9. SHOVE (verb) – धकेलना****Pronunciation:** shuhv**Meaning:** push (someone or something) roughly.**Synonyms:** push, thrust, propel**Antonyms:** Discourage, dissuade, halt**Sentence:** They started pushing and shoving people out of the way.**10. PALATABLE (adj) – स्वादिष्ट****Pronunciation:** pal·at·able**Meaning:** (of food or drink) pleasant to taste.**Synonyms:** tasty, appetizing, eatable**Antonyms:** distasteful, flavorless, tasteless**Sentence:** The meal was barely palatable.

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
