

1. CONSCIENCE (noun) : अंतरात्मा की आवाज

Pronunciation: kawn·shns

Meaning: an inner feeling or voice viewed as acting as a guide to the rightness or

wrongness of one's behavior.

Synonyms: sense of right, moral sense, inner voice

Antonyms: wrongness, impure, pure

Sentence: Her conscience told her to find the lost wallet's owner.

2. PUERILE (adj.): बचकाना

Pronunciation: pyu·rile

Meaning: having or showing the annoying qualities (as silliness) associated with children

Synonyms: childish, immature, infantile **Antonyms:** adult, experienced, mature

Sentence: I find his sense of humor rather <u>puerile</u>.

3. DEPORTATION (noun) : निर्वासन

Pronunciation: dee·pawt·ay·shn

Meaning: the action of deporting a foreigner from a country.

Synonyms: expulsion, expelling, banishment **Antonyms:** repatriation, return, immigration

Sentence: Several of the asylum seekers now face <u>deportation</u>.

4. DISTRAUGHT (adj.) : व्याक्ल

Pronunciation: duh·strawt

Meaning: deeply upset and agitated.
Synonyms: worried, upset, distressed
Antonyms: calm, peaceful, placid

Sentence: Her distraught mother had spent all night waiting by the phone.

5. RECALCITRANT (adj.): आज्ञा न माननेवाला

Pronunciation: ruh·kal·suh·truhnt

Meaning: having an obstinately uncooperative attitude toward authority or discipline.

Synonyms: uncooperative, obstinately disobedient, intractable

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Antonyms: amenable, biddable, compliant

Sentence: The University suspended the most <u>recalcitrant</u> students.

6. CAVALIER (adj.) : अभिमानपूर्ण

Pronunciation: ka·vuh·leeuh

Meaning: showing a lack of proper concern; offhand.

Synonyms: arrogant, assumptive, bumptious

Antonyms: humble, lowly, modest

Sentence: The club's owner showed a cavalier attitude to the licensing laws.

7. DEARTH (noun): कमी

Pronunciation: duhth

Meaning: a scarcity or lack of something.

Synonyms: lack, scarcity, shortage

Antonyms: abundance, adequacy, opulence

Sentence: There seems to be a <u>dearth</u> of good young players at the moment.

8. THROES (noun) : पीड़ा

Pronunciation: throze

Meaning: intense or violent pain and struggle, especially accompanying birth, death, or

great change.

Synonyms: agony, pain, paroxysm

Antonyms: comfort, peace

Sentence: The country is presently in the throes of the worst recession since the second

world war.

9. DELIVERANCE (noun) : मुक्ति

Pronunciation: duh·li·vuh·ruhns

Meaning: the action of being rescued or set free.

Synonyms: liberation, release, freeing

Antonyms: decline, death, evil

Sentence: We pray for <u>deliverance</u> from our sins.

10. SLIPSHOD (adj.) : असावधानीपूर्ण

Pronunciation: slip·shawd

Meaning: (typically of a person or method of work) characterized by a lack of care,


thought, or organization.

Synonyms: careless, lackadaisical, slapdash **Antonyms:** attentive, careful, conscientious

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Sentence: He'd caused many problems with his <u>slipshod</u> management.



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
