1. SHIRKER (NOUN): कामचोर

Pronunciation: Shir-ker

Meaning: someone who avoids something, especially work. Synonyms: Slacker, Avoider, Dodger Antonyms: Hard worker, Responsible Sentence: The boss was annoyed with the shirker who always found excuses to leave work early.

2. FIDDLING (ADJECTIVE): तुच्छ

Pronunciation: fi·duhl·uhng

Meaning: not important, or of no real interest. Synonyms: petty, trivial, minor Antonyms: Important, significant, major Sentence: He wasted his time on fiddling tasks instead of focusing on the important ones.

3. STIFLE (VERB): दबाना

Pronunciation: stai·flMeaning: restrain (a reaction) or stop one self acting on (an emotion).Synonyms: suffocate, choke, smotherAntonyms: inspire, breathe, reviveSentence: The children tried to stifle their laughter during class but couldn't hold back their giggles for long.

4. STARTLE (VERB): चौंकाना

Pronunciation: staa·tl
Meaning: cause to feel sudden shock or alarm.
Synonyms: shock, stun, astonish
Antonyms: assure, soothe, cheer
Sentence: If the music is too loud, it will startle the sleeping baby.

5. MISDEMEANOURS (NOUN): खराब आचरण

Pronunciation: mis·de·mean·or

Meaning: an action that is slightly bad or breaks a rule but is not a crime.



Synonyms: violation, trespass, misconductAntonyms: innocence, obedience, goodnessSentence: He is charged with several misdemeanors, including driving without a valid license and creating a disturbance.

6. TROVE (NOUN): खज़ाऩा

Pronunciation: troveMeaning: a store of valuable or delightful things; discovery, find.Synonyms: treasure, miscellanea, assortmentAntonyms: pile , jumble , heap.Sentence: The museum is a treasure trove for antique lovers.

7. STASH (VERB): छिपाने की जगह

Pronunciation: stashMeaning: store (something) safely in a hidden or secret place.Synonyms: stockpile, store, cacheAntonyms: dump, ditch, unloadSentence: Lindsey uses an old shoe box to stash all of her photos.

8. COMPLY (VERB): प़ालन करना

Pronunciation: kuhm·plaiMeaning: act in accordance with a wish or command.Synonyms: consent, defer, accedeAntonyms: disagree, differ, dissentSentence: The man was arrested because he refused to comply with the airline's no smoking policy.

9. INDICT (VERB): दोष लग़ाऩा

Pronunciation: uhn·dite

Meaning: formally accuse of or charge with a crime. Synonyms: accuse, prosecute, incriminate Antonyms: acquit, exonerate, vindicate Sentence: The district attorney decided to indict the suspect for the murder, charging him only after his bloody fingerprints were found at the crime scene.

10. EMPATHY (NOUN): सम़ानुभूति

Pronunciation: em·puh·thee

Meaning: the ability to understand and share the feelings of another. **Synonyms:** sympathy, pity, compassion



Antonyms: ruthlessness, mercilessness, apathy Sentence: Doctors should develop empathy between themselves and patients.
