

1. SAPIENT (adj.) : बुद्धिमान

Pronunciation: Say·pee·uhnt

Meaning: wise or attempting to appear wise. **Synonyms:** perceptive, prudent, sagacious **Antonyms:** unperceptive, unwise, stupid

Sentence: If you follow her <u>sapient</u> advice, you will be sure to succeed.

2. GAINSAY (verb) : विरोध करना

Pronunciation: gayn·say

Meaning: deny or contradict (a fact or statement).

Synonyms: deny, dispute, disagree with

Antonyms: admit, allow, avow

Sentence: No one dared to gainsay him.

3. NAGGING (adj.): काम करने के लिए परेशान करना

Pronunciation: nag·uhng

Meaning: (of a person) constantly harassing someone to do something.

Synonyms: grumbling, hounding, scolding

Antonyms: acclaiming, applauding

Sentence: He wanted to get away from his <u>nagging</u> parents.

4. CONCEITED (adj.) : अभिमानी

Pronunciation: kuhn·seet·uhd

Meaning: excessively proud of oneself; vain.

Synonyms: vain, narcissistic, pleased with oneself

Antonyms: egoless, humble, modest

Sentence: I thought him conceited and arrogant

5. ESTRANGEMENT (noun) : मनमुटाव

Pronunciation: uh·straynj·muhnt

Meaning: the fact of no longer being on friendly terms or part of a social group.

Synonyms: antipathy, disaffection, hostility **Antonyms:** reconcilement, reconciliation

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Sentence: They finally came together after years of <u>estrangement</u>.

6. FEIGN (verb) : ढोंग करना

Pronunciation: fayn

Meaning: to present a false appearance of

Synonyms: simulate, fakes, ham **Antonyms:** simulate, fake, sham

Sentence: Some animals <u>feign</u> death when in danger.

7. INSOUCIANCE (noun) : लापरवाही

Pronunciation: uhn·soo·see·uhns

Meaning: casual lack of concern; indifference.

Synonyms: nonchalance, unconcern, lack of concern

Antonyms: concern, interest, regard

Sentence: For all her apparent <u>insouciance</u>, she was desperately unhappy.

8. RADIANCE (noun) : चमक

Pronunciation: ray·dee·uhns

Meaning: light or heat as emitted or reflected by something.

Synonyms: light, shining, brightness **Antonyms:** dark, darkness, dullness

Sentence: She seemed to shine with an inner <u>radiance</u>.

9. ACCEDED (verb): स्वीकार कर लिया

Pronunciation: uhk-seed-uhd

Meaning: Agree to a demand, request, or treaty.

Synonyms: agree to, consent to, accept **Antonyms:** dissented, rebuffed, refused

Sentence: The government <u>acceded</u> to public pressure to review the tax.

10. ABYSMAL (adj.) : बह्त बुरा

Pronunciation: uh·biz·muhl


Meaning: extremely bad; appalling. **Synonyms:** very bad, dreadful, awful

Antonyms: cheering, comforting, soothing

Sentence: The film was so <u>abysmal</u> that I fell asleep.

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
