1.FRETTING (verb): बेचैन रहना

Pronunciation: fret uhng **Meaning:** be constantly or visibly worried or anxious. **Synonyms:** worry, be anxious, feel uneasy **Antonyms:** calm, cool, easy **Sentence:** What are you <u>fretting</u> about?

2.RECOMPENSE (noun) : मुआवज़ा

Pronunciation: reh·kuhm·pens **Meaning:** compensation or reward given for loss or harm suffered or effort made. **Synonyms:** compensation, reparation, indemnification **Antonyms:** borrow, deny, withdraw **Sentence:** She received a gift as <u>recompense</u>.

3.APPRENTICE (noun) : शिक्षु

Pronunciation: a pren tubs
Meaning: a person who is learning a trade from a skilled employer, having agreed to work for a fixed period at low wages.
Synonyms: trainee, learner, adjunct
Antonyms: old hand, old-timer, old stager
Sentence: He decided to be an apprentice to an electrician after he graduated.

4.HOWBEIT (adv.) : परन्तु

Pronunciation: hau·bee·uht Meaning: nevertheless; however.
Synonyms: even so, however, nevertheless
Antonyms: all the same
Sentence: I've never written a poem before; howbeit, I feel my first attempt is quite good

5.THRALL (noun) : ग़ुलाम

Pronunciation: thrawlMeaning: the state of being in someone's power or having great power over someone.Synonyms: bondage, enslavement, servilityAntonyms: freedom, libertySentence: He treats his wife like a <u>thrall</u>.



6.CALIGINOUS (adj.) : अंधेरे से

Pronunciation: ca·lig·i·nous
Meaning: being without light or without much light
Synonyms: black, dark, darkened
Antonyms: bright, brightened, illuminated
Sentence: Without a flashlight, there was no way to tell what kind of creatures lurked in the caliginous cave.

7.GIDDY (adj.) : चक्कर

Pronunciation: gi·dee
Meaning: having a sensation of whirling and a tendency to fall or stagger; dizzy.
Synonyms: dizzy, lightheaded, faint
Antonyms: clearheaded, stable, steady
Sentence: I feel giddy; I must sit down.

8.ESURIENT (adj.) : लालची

Pronunciation: esu·ri·ent
Meaning: having a huge appetite
Synonyms: edacious, gluttonous, greedy
Antonyms: glutted, sated, satiated
Sentence: It would be silly to leave your <u>esurient</u> brother in charge of the three dozen cupcakes you baked for a birthday party.

9.FORGERY (noun) : जालसाजी

Pronunciation: forg ery
Meaning: the action of forging or producing a copy of a document, signature, banknote, or work of art.
Synonyms: counterfeiting, fraudulent copying, fraudulent imitation
Antonyms: original
Sentence: He spent 5 years in prison for <u>forgery</u>.

10.ALLEY (noun) : गली

Pronunciation: a·lee **Meaning:** a narrow passageway between or behind buildings. **Synonyms:** passage, lane, path **Antonyms:** roadblock,room,hearth **Sentence:** He took a shortcut along an <u>alley</u>.

11.LOATHE (verb): घृणा करना

Pronunciation : lodhe



Meaning: feel intense dislike or disgust for. Synonyms: hate, detest, abhor Antonyms: love, cherish, like Sentence: She <u>loathed</u> him on sight.

12.INDECISIVE (adj.) : अनिर्णायात्मक

Pronunciation : in·duh·sise·uhv
Meaning: not settling an issue.
Synonyms: inconclusive, undecided, unsettled
Antonyms: conclusive, decisive, definable
Sentence: He was criticized as a weak and <u>indecisive</u> leader.



13.PRODIGIOUS (adj.) : अद्भुत

Pronunciation : pruh·di·juhs

Meaning: remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree.

Synonyms: enormous, colossal, immense

Antonyms: unimpressive, common, ordinary

Sentence: What a prodigious opportunity you have missed.

14.JEOPARDY (noun) : ख़तरा

Pronunciation : jeh·puh·dee
Meaning: danger of loss, harm, or failure.
Synonyms: danger, peril, endangerment
Antonyms: safety, secure, security
Sentence: The lives of thousands of birds are in jeopardy as a result of the oil spillage.

15.STRIFE (noun) : कलह

Pronunciation : strife
Meaning: conflict.
Synonyms: conflict, disagreement, argument
Antonyms: agreement, peace, harmony
Sentence: Racial <u>strife</u> is tearing our country apart.



16.ERRANT (adj.) : भटकनेवाला

Pronunciation : eh·ruhntMeaning: traveling in search of adventure.Synonyms: traveling, wandering, itinerantAntonyms: motionless, still, immobileSentence: She went to Paris to bring back her <u>errant</u> son.

17.MANIFOLD (adj.) : विविध

Pronunciation : ma·nee·foled
Meaning: many and various
Synonyms: many, numerous, multiple
Antonyms: one, single, less
Sentence: Despite her manifold faults, she was a strong leader.

18.REPRIMANDS (noun) : फटकार

Pronunciation : reh·pruh·maandz
Meaning: a rebuke, especially an official one
Synonyms: rebuke, reproof, admonishment
Antonyms: citations, commendations, endorsements
Sentence: Listen as she <u>reprimands</u> him and gives him an ultimatum.

19.IMPUGN (verb) : बहस करना

Pronunciation : uhm · pyoon
Meaning: dispute the truth, validity, or honesty of (a statement or motive)
Synonyms: call into question, debate, dispute
Antonyms: justify, pardon, remit
Sentence: I did not mean to impugn her professional abilities.

20.AMBIT (noun) : सीमा

Pronunciation : am·buht
Meaning: the scope, extent, or bounds of something.
Synonyms: scope, extent, bounds
Antonyms: uniformity, consistency, equability, oneness
Sentence: Her case falls within the <u>ambit</u> of moral law.

21.GLOSSARY (noun): शब्दकोष

Pronunciation: glaw suh ree

Meaning: an alphabetical list of terms or words found in or relating to a specific subject, text, or dialect, with explanations; a brief dictionary. **Synonyms:** dictionaries, wordbooks, catalogues **Antonyms:** acclaimed, applauded, exalted



Sentence: The book includes a <u>glossary</u> of financial terms.

22.PARLOUS (adj.) : जोखिमी

Pronunciation: paa·luhs
Meaning: full of danger or uncertainty; precarious.
Synonyms: dangerous, grievous, hazardous
Antonyms: harmless, innocent, innocuous
Sentence: Window washing can indeed be a parlous occupation on a skyscraper.

23.DISPARAGED (verb) : अपमानित करना

Pronunciation: duh·spae·ruhjd
Meaning: regard or represent as being of little worth.
Synonyms: denigrate, deprecate, depreciate
Antonyms: acclaimed, applauded, exalted
Sentence: Her bad behaviour has <u>disparaged</u> her whole family.

24.ATTRITION (noun) : धीरे-धीरे कमजोर होना

Pronunciation: uh·tri·shn
Meaning: a gradual weakening, loss, or destruction
Synonyms: weakening, debilitation, enfeebling
Antonyms: buildup, gain
Sentence: The council is trying to wear down the opposition by <u>attrition</u>.

25.DERELICT (adj.) : त्याग किया हुआ

Pronunciation: deh·ruh·luhkt
Meaning: in a very poor condition due to disuse and neglect.
Synonyms: dilapidated, ramshackle, neglecting
Antonyms: conscientious, nonnegligent
Sentence: He purchased an old <u>derelict</u> mansion that was rumored to be haunted.

26.PRODIGIOUS (adj.): अद्भुत

Pronunciation: pruh·di·juhs
Meaning: remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree.
Synonyms: enormous, colossal, immense
Antonyms: unimpressive, common, ordinary
Sentence: What a prodigious opportunity you have missed.

27.BALK (verb) : बाधा डालना

Pronunciation: bawk **Meaning:** to prevent from achieving a goal **Synonyms:** block, hinder, thwart



Antonyms: facilitate, assist, encourage Sentence: Their strategies to <u>balk</u> at the enemy had failed.

28.PANTOMIMED (verb) : अभिव्यक्त करना

Pronunciation: pan·tuh·mimed
Meaning: express or represent (something) by extravagant and exaggerated mime.
Synonyms: gestured, signed, signalized
Antonyms: bluntness,candor,confidence.
Sentence: The clown candidates pantomimed different emotions.

29.EDIFY (verb) : उपदेश देना

Pronunciation: eh·duh·fai
Meaning: instruct or improve (someone) morally or intellectually.
Synonyms: educate, instruct, teach
Antonyms: confuse, perplex, puzzle
Sentence: They tried to edify the child with music.

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30.DAZE (verb) : मति-मंद करना

Pronunciation: dayz
Meaning: make (someone) unable to think or react properly; stupefy; bewilder.
Synonyms: stun, stupefy, dumbfound
Antonyms: bore, calm, clarify
Sentence: The fall <u>daze</u> him for a moment, causing him to become disoriented.

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31.AUTONOMOUS (adj.): स्वायत्तशासी

Pronunciation: aw taw nuh muhs **Meaning:** (of a country or region) having the freedom to govern itself or control its own affairs.

Synonyms: independent, self-governed, self-governing

Antonyms: dependent, non-self-governing, subject, unfree

Sentence: They proudly declared themselves part of a new <u>autonomous</u> province.

32.SOLACE (verb) : आश्वासन



Pronunciation: saw-luhs

Meaning: give comfort or consolation. Synonyms: comfort, console, cheer Antonyms: anguish, distress Sentence: She smiled, as though <u>solaced</u> by the memory.

33.FLEDGLING (noun) : अनुभवहीन मनुष्य

Pronunciation: flej·luhng
Meaning: a person who is just starting out in a field of activity
Synonyms: learner, student, trainee
Antonyms: expert, master, veteran
Sentence: He trained his <u>fledgling</u> stewardesses in Miami, Florida.

34.INSOLVENCY (noun) : दिवालियापन

Pronunciation: uhn·sawl·vuhn·see **Meaning:** The state of being insolvent. **Synonyms:** bankruptcy, insolvency, failure **Antonyms:** increase, solvency, achievement **Sentence:** We look at your options if you are facing <u>insolvency</u>.

35.EFFRONTERY (noun) : गुस्ताख़ी

Pronunciation: uh·fruhn·tuh·ree
Meaning: insolent or impertinent behavior.
Synonyms: impudence, impertinence, audacity
Antonyms: civility, courtesy, gentility
Sentence: One juror had the <u>effrontery</u> to challenge the coroner's decision.

36.MORATORIUM (noun) : रोक

Pronunciation: maw·ruh·taw·ree·uhm
Meaning: a temporary prohibition of an activity.
Synonyms: stop, ban
Antonyms: continuance, continuation
Sentence: The debt was to be subject to a five-year moratorium.

37.PRUDENCE (noun) : विवेक

Pronunciation: proo.dns
Meaning: the quality of being prudent; cautiousness.
Synonyms: wisdom, judgment, sagacity
Antonyms: carelessness, heedlessness, incaution
Sentence: We need to exercise <u>prudence</u> in such important matters.



38.ARDENT (adj.) : उत्साही

Pronunciation: aa·dnt
Meaning: enthusiastic or passionate.
Synonyms: passionate, avid, impassioned
Antonyms: dispassionate, emotionless, impassive
Sentence: All her life she was an <u>ardent</u> feminist.

39.PRODIGIOUS (adj.) : अद्भुत

Pronunciation: pruh·di·juhs
Meaning: remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree.
Synonyms: enormous, colossal, immense
Antonyms: unimpressive, common, ordinary
Sentence: What a prodigious opportunity you have missed.

40.BEGUILE (adj.) : मोहना

Pronunciation: buh⋅gile
Meaning: charm or enchant (someone), sometimes in a deceptive way.
Synonyms: charm, attract, enchant
Antonyms: disgust, offend, undeceive
Sentence: Games are usually used to beguile small children.

41.UNCONSCIONABLE (adj.): अनर्थक

Pronunciation: uhn•kawn•shuhn•uh•bl Meaning: not right or reasonable. Synonyms: unethical, amoral, immoral Antonyms: ethical, moral, principled Sentence: You take an <u>unconscionable</u> time getting dressed!

42.MUTINY (verb) : बग़ावत करना

Pronunciation: myoo•tuh•nee
Meaning: refuse to obey the orders of a person in authority.
Synonyms: rebel, revolt, riot
Antonyms: comply (with), follow, obey
Sentence: Thousands of the soldiers <u>mutinied</u> over the non-payment of wages.

43.VEHEMENCE (noun) : उत्साह

Pronunciation: vee•uh•muhns **Meaning:** the display of strong feeling; passion. **Synonyms:** passion, ardor, fervor **Antonyms:** impassiveness, impassivity, aloofness **Sentence:** She was astonished at his <u>vehemence</u>.




44.RUGGED (adj.) : ऊबड़ - खाबड़

Pronunciation: rug•ged
Meaning: (of ground or terrain) having a broken, rocky, and uneven surface.
Synonyms: rough, uneven, bumpy
Antonyms: even, flat, smooth
Sentence: The path to glory is always <u>rugged</u>.

45.DEBASEMENT (noun) : मानमर्दन

Pronunciation: duh•bays•muhnt
Meaning: the action or process of reducing the quality or value of something.
Synonyms: abjection, corruptness, debauchery
Antonyms: morality, righteousness, virtue
Sentence: The outcome is rot and <u>debasement</u> of the system.



46.RUSES (noun) : चाल

Pronunciation: rooz•uhzMeaning: an action intended to deceive someone; a trick.Synonyms: ploy, stratagem, tacticAntonyms: frankness, honesty, openness.Sentence: Eleanor tried to think of a <u>ruse</u> to get Paul out of the house.

47.SULLEN (adj.) : उदास

Pronunciation: suh•luhnMeaning: bad-tempered and sulky; gloomy.Synonyms: surly, sulky, poutingAntonyms: cheerful, cheery, gladsomeSentence: Bill sat in sullen silence and refused to eat his lunch.

48.CRUCIFY (verb) : आलोचना करना

Pronunciation: kroo•suh•fai **Meaning:** criticize (someone) severely and unrelentingly. **Synonyms:** condemn, criticize severely, denounce



Antonyms: commend, endorse Sentence: He's going to <u>crucify</u> me when he finds out what I've done!

49.ABROGATE (verb) : अभिनिषेध करना

Pronunciation: a•bruh•gayt
Meaning: repeal or do away with (a law, right, or formal agreement).
Synonyms: repudiate, revoke, repeal
Antonyms: enact, lay down, legislate
Sentence: Both governments voted to <u>abrogate</u> the treaty.

50.SECLUSION (noun) : एकांत

Pronunciation: suh•kloo•zhn **Meaning:** the state of being private and away from other people. **Synonyms:** isolation, solitude, retreat **Antonyms:** companionship, company, comradeship **Sentence:** I live very much in <u>seclusion</u> these days.

51.ALLOCATION (noun): आवंटन

Pronunciation: a·luh·kay·shn
Meaning: the action or process of allocating or distributing something.
Synonyms: allotment, assignment, issuing
Antonyms: disenfranchise, forfeit
Sentence: Inconsistency in the <u>Allocation</u> of funds led to a negative balance in one account.

52.PROMULGATE (verb) : घोषणा करना

Pronunciation: praw muhl gayt
Meaning: promote or make widely known
Synonyms: make known, make public, publicize
Antonyms: silence, suppress, criticize
Sentence: The actor makes use of social media to Promulgate the release of his film projects.

53.ENVISION (verb) : कल्पना करना

Pronunciation: uhn·vi·zhn
Meaning: imagine as a future possibility
Synonyms: visualize, imagine, envisage
Antonyms: disregard, ignore, look away
Sentence: They didn't Envision any problems with the new building.

54.SUNDRY (adj.) : विविध



Pronunciation: suhn drai

Meaning: of various kinds; several

Synonyms: various, varied, miscellaneous **Antonyms**: alike, identical, like **Sentence:** This cream can be used to treat Sundry minor injuries.

55.PREDICAMENT (noun) : कठिन परिस्थिति

Pronunciation: pruh·di·kuh·muhnt
Meaning: a difficult, unpleasant, or embarrassing situation.
Synonyms: difficult situation, awkward situation, problematic situation
Antonyms: advantage,agreement,benefit,blessing.
Sentence: If you had told the truth in the first place, we wouldn't be in this <u>Predicament</u>.

56.PLIABILITY (noun) : लचीलापन

Pronunciation: plai·uh·bil·uh·tee
Meaning: the quality of being easily bent; flexibility.
Synonyms: flexibility, pliancy, elasticity
Antonyms: inflexibility, rigidity, stiffness
Sentence: Outstanding <u>Pliability</u> and the cable is wearable.

57.INDIGNATION (noun) : रोष

Pronunciation: in duhg nay shn
Meaning: anger or annoyance provoked by what is perceived as unfair treatment.
Synonyms: resentment, umbrage, anger
Antonyms: delight, pleasure
Sentence: He was blazing with Indignation.

58.INNATE (adj.) : जन्मजात

Pronunciation: uh nayt Meaning: inborn; natural Synonyms: natural, inbred, congenital Antonyms: adventitious, extraneous, extrinsic Sentence: He never lost his <u>Innate</u> sense of fun.

59.APTNESS (noun) : उपयुक्तता

Pronunciation: apt·nuhs
Meaning: the quality of being appropriate or suitable.
Synonyms: suitability, appropriateness, appropriacy
Antonyms: improperness, impropriety, inappositeness
Sentence: Michael's long legs gave him an <u>Aptness</u> for being a good track athlete.



60.DEMEAN (verb) : नीचा दिखाना

Pronunciation: duh·meen
Meaning: cause a severe loss in the dignity of and respect for (someone or something)
Synonyms: shaming, debase, degrade
Antonyms: uplift, ennoble, elevate
Sentence: Don't Demean yourself by telling such obvious lies.
