

1.OUTWIT (verb) – चतुराई में मात देना

Pronunciation: awt·wit

Meaning: deceive by the quality of being clever, original, and inventive

Synonyms: outsmart, trick, outfox, outplay, deceive

Antonyms: surrender, lose

Usage: Speeders can outwit police radar with a variety of devices.

2.OVERSEER (verb) – देखरेख करना

Pronunciation: ow·vuh·see

Meaning: to direct or supervise

Synonyms: supervise, superintend, inspect, administer, organize, manage

Antonyms: ignore, neglect

Usage: The Home Secretary oversees the police service.

3.QUIXOTIC (adjective) – कल्पनायुक्त

Pronunciation: kwuh·so·tuhk

Meaning: extremely idealistic

Synonyms: idealistic, utopian, perfectionist, unrealistic, unworldly, impracticable

Antonyms: practical, realistic

Usage: To attempt such a thing would be quixotic.

4.LIMBER (adjective) – लचीला

Pronunciation: lim·buh

Meaning: lithe or flexible

Synonyms: flexible, lithe, supple, nimble, lissome, fit, spry

Antonyms: stiff, rigid, unbending

Usage: The limber gymnast was able to do the back flip with ease.

5.FRUGALITY (noun) - कमखर्ची

Pronunciation: froo·ga·luh·tee

Meaning: the quality of being economical with money or food

Synonyms: thriftiness, prudence, cautiousness

Antonyms: extravagance, lavishness, wastefulness

Usage: Abandon frugality and just buy me a real gold necklace.

6.NOSEY (adjective) - कौतूहली

Pronunciation: now·zee

Meaning: showing too much curiosity about other people's affairs

Synonyms: prying, inquisitive, curious, busybody, probing, spying

Antonyms: uninterested, indifferent, incurious

Usage: I have always found her unbearably nosey.

7.SEGREGATE (verb) - अलग करना

Pronunciation: seg·r·geit

Meaning: isolate or divide

Synonyms: separate, set apart, divide isolate, insulate

Antonyms: amalgamate, associate, connect

Usage: Schools should not segregate children with disabilities.

8 ECLECTIC (adjective) – विस्तृत

Pronunciation: uh·klek·tuhk

Meaning: deriving ideas, style, or taste from a broad and diverse range of sources

Synonyms: wide, broad, extensive, comprehensive, encyclopedic

Antonyms: narrow, particular, specific

Usage: He has an eclectic taste in music.

9.EMASCULATE (verb) – प्रभावहीन/शक्तिहीन करना

Pronunciation: uh·ma·skyuh·leit

Meaning: make someone or something weaker or less effective

Synonyms: weaken, debilitate, enfeeble, enervate, dilute, erode, undermine

Antonyms: strengthen, energize, invigorate

Usage: The company tried to emasculate the unions.

10.SURFEIT (noun) – आधिक्य

Pronunciation: suh·fuht

Meaning: an excessive amount of something

Synonyms: excess, surplus, abundance, oversupply, plethora

Antonyms: lack, want

Usage: A surfeit of food makes one sick.

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
