1. REBUFF (noun) : रोक

Pronunciation: ruh·buhf

Meaning: an abrupt or ungracious refusal or rejection of an offer, request, or friendly gesture.

Synonyms: rejection, snub, slight

Antonyms: acceptance, embrace, welcome

Sentence: He received a humiliating rebuff from his manager.

2. CACOPHONY (noun) : कोलाहल

Pronunciation: kuh·kaw·fuh·nee

Meaning: a harsh discordant mixture of sounds.

Synonyms: noise, discord, dissonance

Antonyms: quiet, silence, hush

Sentence: All around was bubbling a cacophony of voices.

3. RAILLERY (noun) : मज़ाक

Pronunciation: rayl·uh·ree

Meaning: good-humored teasing.

Synonyms: teasing, chaff, banter

Antonyms: flattery, bantering, praise

Sentence: She was greeted with raillery from her fellow workers.

4. FASTIDIOUS (adj.) : दुराराध्य

Pronunciation: fa·sti·dee·uhs

Meaning: very attentive to and concerned about accuracy and detail.

Synonyms: scrupulous, punctilious, assiduous

Antonyms: undemanding, unfastidious, unfussy

Sentence: Everything was planned in fastidious detail.

5. ADORATION (adj.) : आराधना

Pronunciation: a·duh·ray·shn

Meaning: deep love and respect.

Synonyms: love, devotion, worship

Antonyms: condemnation, disapproval, disdain

Sentence: He gazed at her with pure adoration.

6. SEDULOUS (noun) : परिश्रमी

Pronunciation: seh·joo·luhs

Meaning: (of a person or action) showing dedication and diligence.

Synonyms: diligent, careful, meticulous

Antonyms: idle, inactive, unbusy

Sentence: He watched himself with the most sedulous care.

7. RETICENT (adj.) : मौन रहने वाला

Pronunciation: reh·tuh·snt

Meaning: not revealing one's thoughts or feelings readily.

Synonyms: reserved, withdrawn, introverted

Antonyms: communicative, open, frank

Sentence: She was extremely reticent about her personal affairs.

8. UMBRAGE (noun) : अपमान

Pronunciation: uhm·bruhj

Meaning: offense or annoyance.

Synonyms: take offense, be offended, be affronted

Antonyms: appeasement, mollification, pacification

Sentence: She took umbrage at his remarks.

9. COMPLACENCY (noun) : शालीनता

Pronunciation: kuhm·play·suhns·ee

Meaning: a feeling of smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements.

Synonyms: smugness, self-satisfaction, self-approval

Antonyms: humbleness, humility, modesty

Sentence: Doctors have warned against complacency in fighting common diseases.

10. BALMY (adj.) : खुशबूदार

Pronunciation: baam·ee

Meaning: (of the weather) pleasantly warm.

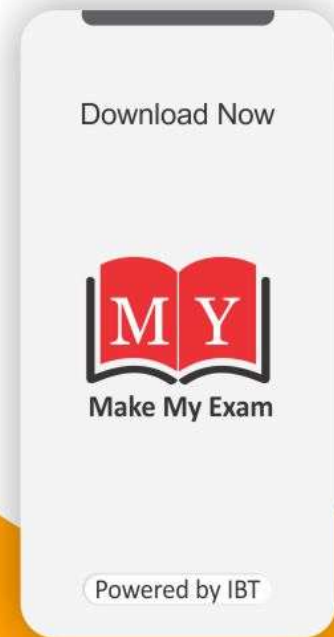
Synonyms: mild, gentle, temperate

Antonyms: harsh, inclement, intemperate

Sentence: Brilliant blue skies and unseasonably balmy weather prevailed.

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
