1. Labor Party's Anthony Albanese sworn-in as the new PM of Australia

- Labour Party leader Anthony Albanese was sworn in as Australia's 31st Prime Minister with four key Cabinet members, including new Foreign Minister Penny Wong.
- Richard Marles is the new Deputy Prime Minister and Employment Minister, Jim Chalmers is Treasurer, and Katy Gallagher is Attorney General and Finance Minister.
- It is Australia's first Labour Government in almost a decade.

2. International Day to End Obstetric Fistula 2022: 23 May

• United Nations (UN) International Day to End Obstetric Fistula is marked on 23rd May since 2013 to promote action towards treating and preventing obstetric fistula, a condition that affects many girls and women during childbirth in





developing countries. In 2003 the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and its partners launched the global Campaign to End Fistula, a collaborative initiative to prevent fistula and restore the health of those affected by the condition. The day was officially recognised in 2012.

3. Indian and Bangladesh Navies started Coordinated Patrol in Bay of Bengal

- 4th edition Indian and Bangladesh Navies has commenced two-day Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) in Northern Bay of Bengal.
- Indian Navy: Two indigenously built Ships Kora (a guided-missile corvette) and Sumedha (an offshore patrol vessel) are participating in the exercise.
- Bangladesh: Navy Ships BNS Ali Haider and BNS Abu Ubaidah are taking part in the coordinated patrol exercise.
- Both navies of Maritime Patrol Aircraft will also participate.

4. Manchester City crowned 2021/22 Premier League champions

- Manchester City (Football) have been crowned 2021/22 Premier League champions their fourth title success in the last five seasons.
- Manchester City win over Aston Villa in the final game of the season.
- In Manchester City's 38 league matches this season, they have won 29, drawn six, and lost three, scoring 99 goals in the process.
- City have now won four Premier League titles and eight major trophies under Pep Guardiola since his arrival in the summer of 2016.



5. Nobel winner Jose Ramos-Horta sworn in as East Timor president







- Former independence fighter and Nobel Peace Prize laureate Jose Ramos-Horta was sworn in as president of East Timor.
- He defeated incumbent Francisco "Lu Olo" Guterres (his fellow independence fighter) in election.
- Ramos-Horta was prime minister from 2006 to 2007 and president from 2007 to 2012.
- East Timor is marking the 20th anniversary of independence for Asia's youngest country.

8. IFS Vivek Kumar appointed as PS to PM Modi

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi has got IFS Vivek Kumar as his new Private Secretary (PS). The Cabinet Appointments Committee accepted Vivek Kumar's nomination as PM Modi's press secretary. Vivek Kumar is the director of the Prime Minister's Office and is a 2004 batch Indian Foreign Service (IFS) officer (PMO).
- The Cabinet Appointments Committee has approved the application for Vivek Kumar, IFS (2004) to be appointed as PS to PM at Joint Secretary level in the Prime Minister's Office, with salary at Pay Matrix level 14.
- Vivek Kumar will take over as PM Modi's private secretary from Sanjeev Kumar Singla. India's Ambassador to Israel, Sanjeev Kumar Singla, is ready to take over. Singla, an IFS officer from the 1997 batch, was named PS to the Prime Minister in 2014. Singla returned to India to work in the PMO after a brief stint in the Indian Embassy in Tel Aviv. He will now resume his duties as ambassador.

9. Haryana beat Jharkhand 2-0 to win Hockey India Sub-Junior Women's National Championship in Imphal

- Haryana Hockey team has emerged as the winners of the Hockey India sub-junior women's national championship 2022 after defeating Hockey Jharkhand by 2-0 in the final in Imphal.
- Uttar Pradesh Hockey has defeated Madhya Pradesh Hockey by 3-0 to secure third place in the tournament.
- Pushpanjali Sonkar, Manisha Patel, and Purnima Yadav scored a goal each to help Uttar Pradesh Hockey seal third place in the competition





for the second consecutive time.
