# 1. VIGNETTE (Noun): लघुचित्र, चित्र

Pronunciation: vuh·nyets

**Meaning:** a short, descriptive literary sketch or scene that captures a moment, character, or

impression in a concise and vivid manner.

**Synonyms:** Glimpse, Portrayal

**Antonyms:** Detailed, Comprehensive

**Sentence:** Her travel journal was filled with <u>vignettes</u> of the people she met and the places

she visited.

### 2. EXILED (Adjective): निर्वासित

Pronunciation: ek·siled

**Meaning:** having been sent away from one's home country or place of residence, typically as a punishment or as a result of political, social, or personal reasons.

**Synonyms:** Expelled, Banished **Antonyms:** Embraced, Reinstated

Sentence: The artist felt like an outcast in the art community, leading to a self imposed

exile from the art scene.

## 3. WOBBLING (Verb): डगमगाता ह्आ

Pronunciation: vaw·buhl·uhng

Meaning: to move unsteadily from side to side; to sway or rock with an unsteady motion.

**Synonyms:** Sway, Totter, Falter **Antonyms:** Stable, Firm, Fixed

Sentence: The political situation in the country has been wobbling for months, causing

concern among the citizens.

### 4. ALLEGIANCE (Noun): निष्ठा

Pronunciation: uh·lee·jns

**Meaning:** a commitment to support and uphold the interests and values of the entity to

which one owes allegiance. **Synonyms:** Fealty, Loyalty

Antonyms: Rebellion, Defection

Sentence: Despite facing numerous challenges, her unwavering <u>allegiance</u> to her principles

made her a respected leader.





### 5. PLAQUE (Noun): तख़्ती

**Pronunciation: plaak** 

**Meaning:** a flat, thin, and typically rectangular or circular plate or tablet.

Synonyms: Plate

**Antonyms:** Indentation

**Sentence:** Regular brushing and flossing help prevent the buildup of dental plaque.

### 6. RESURGENCE (Noun):पुनरुत्थान

Pronunciation: ruh·suhj·uhns

Meaning: a revival or renewal of something that was previously less significant or

dormant.

**Synonyms:** Recovery, Reawakening

**Antonyms:** Decay, Decline

**Sentence:** The team's <u>resurgence</u> in the playoffs surprised everyone, as they went from

being underdogs to championship contenders.

# 7. DYSTOPIAN (Noun): दुःस्थानिक या डायस्टोपियन

Pronunciation: duh·stoh·pee·uhn

**Meaning:** an imaginary or fictional society or world characterized by oppressive,

undesirable, and often nightmarish conditions.

**Synonyms:** Apocalypse **Antonyms:** Utopia

Sentence: The artist's painting portrayed a bleak and desolate dystopia, with crumbling

buildings and a polluted sky.

### 8. PERCOLATE (Verb): रसना

Pronunciation: puh·kuh·layt

Meaning: the gradual spreading or dissemination of ideas, information, or influences.

**Synonyms:** Defuse, Penetrate **Antonyms:** Stagnate, Clog

Sentence: Rainwater percolates through the soil, replenishing the underground aquifers.

## 9. PREDELICTIONS (Noun): झुकाव

Pronunciation: pree·duh·lek·shnz

**Meaning:** inherent tendencies or inclinations that make a person or thing more likely to exhibit certain behaviour or react in a particular way often due to genetic, psychological, or

environmental factors **Synonyms:** Propensities **Antonyms:** Aversions



**Sentence:** Early exposure to music can create a <u>predisposition</u> for a lifelong love of the arts.

#### 10. GUISE (Noun): भेष

**Pronunciation:** gize

**Meaning:** The external appearance or manner in which someone or something appears.

Synonyms: Façade, Mien

**Antonyms:** Reality, Authenticity

Sentence: The abandoned mansion had an eerie and dilapidated guise, but beneath the

decay, it held a rich history waiting to be uncovered.

### 11. PORE OVER (PHRASAL VERB): अद्धय्यन करना

**Pronunciation:** pore over

**Meaning:** to look at and study something, usually a book or document, carefully.

**Synonyms:** contemplate, ponder, consider, study

**Antonyms:** ignore, disregard, overlook

Sentence: The judges will have to pore over the 22 volumes of evidence already

accumulated and hear the 66 witnesses for the prosecution.

### 12. NEOTERIC (ADJECTIVE): नवीन

Pronunciation: ne·o·ter·ic

**Meaning:** new or modern; recent. **Synonyms:** latest, modern, recent

Antonyms: old, oldfangled

**Sentence**: The <u>neoteric</u> design of the building stood out among the surrounding traditional

structures.

### 13. SMIDGEN (NOUN): थोडा

Pronunciation: smi·jn

Meaning: a small amount of something.

**Synonyms:** bit, driblet, little

Antonyms: abundance, barrel, a boatload

**Sentence**: The amount of sand I can hold in my hand is a <u>smidgen</u> compared to all the sand

on the beach.

### 14. SNAZZY (ADJECTIVE): अत्यधिक आकर्षक

Pronunciation: sna·zee

**Meaning:** modern and stylish in a way that attracts attention. **Synonyms:** stylish, flashy, cool, fashionable, custom, jazzy



Antonyms: simple, modest, plain, unadorned

**Sentence**: Innovation is about more than designing <u>snazzy</u> products. It's also about

improving customer experiences and services.

#### 15. GAUGE (VERB): मापना

**Pronunciation:** gayj

Meaning: to calculate an amount, especially by using a measuring device; to make a

judgment about something, usually people's feelings.

**Synonyms:** measure, calculate, determine, assess, appraise, evaluate.

Antonyms: estimation, guess, speculate

**Sentence:** We need to gauge the amount of work required before committing to the

project.

### 16. BATTERED (ADJECTIVE): क्षतिग्रस्त

Pronunciation: ba·tuhd

Meaning: hurt by being repeatedly hit; damaged, especially by being used a lot.

Synonyms: beaten up, damaged, worn out, weathered, dilapidated

Antonyms: undamaged, unspoiled, new, pristine

**Sentence:** The old, battered car was still running, but it was clearly on its last legs.

# 17. STRANDED (ADJECTIVE): फंसा हुआ

Pronunciation: strand·uhd

**Meaning:** unable to leave somewhere because of a problem such as not having any transportation or money (lacking what is necessary to leave a place or to get out of a situation).

Synonyms: marooned, stuck, abandoned, isolated

Antonyms: rescued, assisted, aided

**Sentence:** The travelers were <u>stranded</u> in the desert when their car broke down.

## 18. VIRULENCE (NOUN): अनिष्ट करता

Pronunciation: vi·ruh·luhns

Meaning: the danger and speed of spreading of a disease; very strong feelings of hating

or opposing something or someone.

Synonyms: toxicity, malignancy, bitterness, acrimony

**Antonyms:** harmlessness, benignity

**Sentence:** The virulence of the virus made the disease very dangerous and deadly.

# 19. AGITATION (NOUN): व्याकुलता

Pronunciation: a · juh · tay · shn





**Meaning:** anxiety.

Synonyms: perturbation, disquiet

**Antonyms:** calmness

**Sentence:** She was wringing her hands in <u>agitation</u>.

#### 20. ADJOURNMENT (NOUN): स्थगन

Pronunciation: uh·juhn·muhnt

Meaning: suspension.

**Synonyms:** interruption, postponement

**Antonyms:** continuation

**Sentence:** She sought an <u>adjournment</u> of the trial.

#### 21. CRAMMING (VERB & NOUN): रटना

Pronunciation: kram·uhng

**Meaning:** the action of engaging in intensive, last minute studying or memorization.

**Synonyms:** Swot, Cram in **Antonyms:** Steady, learning

Sentence: She had to cram all night to prepare for the presentation she forgot about until

the last minute.

### 22. ABROGATION (NOUN): अभिनिषेध

Pronunciation: a·bruh·gay·shn

Meaning: the act of formally repealing or abolishing a law, rule, agreement, or custom,

especially by an authority or government.

Synonyms: Annulment, Revocation

**Antonyms:** Validation

Sentence: The council voted for the abrogation of the outdated bylaws that no longer

served the community's needs.

## 23. ANTHROPOGENIC (ADJECTIVE): मानवजनित

Pronunciation: an·thruh·puh·jeh·nuhk

Meaning: relating to or resulting from human activities, particularly those that have a

significant impact on the natural environment, climate, or ecosystem.

**Synonyms:** Man. made **Antonyms:** Organic, Wild

Sentence: The construction of the dam was criticized for its significant anthropogenic

impact on the local ecosystem and wildlife.

### 24. ASSIMILATE (VERB): पचाना



Pronunciation: uh·si·muh·layt

**Meaning:** to take in and incorporate information, ideas, or culture into one's own

understanding or way of life. **Synonyms:** Imbibe, Acquire **Antonyms:** Isolate, Segregate

Sentence: It took him a while to assimilate the complex scientific concepts, but with time

and effort, he mastered them.

### 25. DUTIFUL (Adjective): आज्ञाकारी

Pronunciation: dyoo·tuh·ful

**Meaning:** obedient and respectful in carrying out tasks or following orders.

**Synonyms:** Devoted, Compliant **Antonyms:** Negligent, Rebellious

**Sentence:** His dutiful response to his teacher's instructions earned him praise for his

respectful behaviour in the classroom.

### 26. TRAVESTY (NOUN): उपहास, विडंबना या किसी गंभीर चीज़ का खराब

Pronunciation: tra·vuh·stee

**Meaning:** an event or situation that is a complete failure, disappointment, or mockery of

what it was supposed to be. **Synonyms:** Spoof, Ridicule **Antonyms:** Honesty, Realism

**Sentence:** His attempt to imitate the famous singer's voice turned into a travesty that left

the audience in stitches.

## 27. VINDICTIVE (ADJECTIVE): तामसिक

Pronunciation: vuhn·dik·tuhv

**Meaning:** having a strong desire for revenge or a tendency to seek revenge when wronged,

often with a malicious or spiteful attitude.

Synonyms: Revengeful, Spiteful Antonyms: Magnanimous, Gracious

Sentence: The vindictive rivalry between the two sports teams often led to heated and

aggressive matches on the field.

# 28. DUPING (VERB): भोला. भाला · धोखा खाने वाला

Pronunciation: dyoop·uhng

Meaning: deceiving or tricking someone into believing something that is not true,

typically with the intention of taking advantage of them.

**Synonyms:** Swindling, Conning **Antonyms:** Honesty, Sincerity



**Sentence:** The magician's act was all about duping the audience with his clever illusions.

## 29. INUNDATION (NOUN): सैलाब

Pronunciation: i·nuhn·day·shn

**Meaning:** an overwhelming abundance or surge of something, such as emotions,

information, or requests.

**Synonyms:** Avalanche, Deluge **Antonyms:** Desiccation, Drainage

Sentence: Despite the inundation of negative reviews, the movie still managed to attract a

large audience.

### 30. GENEOLOGY (NOUN): वंशावली

Pronunciation: jee·nee·a·luh·jee

**Meaning:** the study or tracing of the descent and history of a family, including the identification of ancestors, their relationships, and their biographical information.

Synonyms: Heritage

**Antonyms:** Anonymity, Alienation

Sentence: The genealogy of the royal family was meticulously recorded in historical

documents dating back centuries.

## 31. VIGOROUS (ADJECTIVE): ज़ोरदार

Pronunciation: vi·guh·ruhs

Meaning: strenuous

Synonyms: powerful, potent

**Antonyms**: weak

**Sentence:** It is said that vigorous exercise increases oxygen consumption.

### 32. EXQUISITE (ADJECTIVE): उत्कृष्ट

Pronunciation: ek·skvuh·zuht

**Meaning:** beautiful

Synonyms: lovely, elegant

Antonyms: crude

Sentence: The Indians brought in exquisite designs and beadwork to sell.

### 33. LABYRINTHINE (ADJECTIVE): जटिल

Pronunciation: la·buh·rin·thine

Meaning: complicated

**Synonyms:** intricate, complex **Antonyms:** straightforward



**Sentence:** The film was filled with labyrinthine plots and counterplots.

### 34. TEMPORAL (ADJECTIVE): लौकिक

Pronunciation: tem·puh·ruhl

Meaning: secular

**Synonyms:** non-spiritual, worldly

**Antonyms:** spiritual

**Sentence:** The Church did not imitate the secular rulers who thought only of temporal

gain.

## 35. BAILOUT (NOUN): जमानत पर छुड़ाना

Pronunciation: bayl·awt

Meaning: an act of giving financial assistance to a failing business or economy to save it

from collapse.

**Synonyms:** underwrite, give a helping hand **Antonyms:** disagreement, infringement

**Sentence:** The government crafted the bailout scheme with little public discussion and

without determining who was responsible for the losses.

### 36. Nuance (Noun): बारीकी

Pronunciation: nyoo·aans

Meaning: a very slight difference in appearance, meaning, sound, etc; a quality of

something that is not easy to notice but may be important.

Synonyms: fine distinction, minute difference

Antonyms: grossness, coarseness

**Sentence:** The painter has managed to capture every nuance of the woman's expression.

# 37. Exuberant (Adjective): उत्साहपूर्ण

Pronunciation: uhgz•yoo•buh•ruhnt

Meaning: full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness.

**Synonyms:** joyful, effervescent, vivacious, lively **Antonyms:** low-spirited, sullen, apathetic, dull

**Sentence:** I heard a noisy bunch of exuberant youngsters.

### 38. GLUM (ADJECTIVE): उदास

**Pronunciation: gluhm** 

Meaning: looking or feeling dejected; sad.

**Synonyms:** bleak, sad, depressed **Antonyms:** cheerful, cheery, bright



**Sentence:** You look glum. What's up?

39. STRIFE (NOUN): झगडा

**Pronunciation: strife** 

**Meaning:** angry or bitter disagreement over fundamental issues; conflict.

**Synonyms:** friction, discord

**Antonyms:** harmony

**Sentence:** The country was torn apart by political strife, leading to protests and unrest.

# 40. SABOTAGE (VERB): नुक़सान पहंचाना

Pronunciation: sa·buh·taazh

Meaning: deliberately destroy, damage, or obstruct (something), especially for political or

military advantage.

Synonyms: vandalize, destroy

Antonyms: strengthen

**Sentences:** The rival team attempted to sabotage our chances winning by spreading false

rumors about our star player.

#### 41. PROLIFERATION (Noun): प्रसार

Pronunciation: pruh·li·fuh·ray·shn

Meaning: the rapid and widespread increase or growth in the number or quantity of

something.

Synonyms: Escalation, Advancement

Antonyms: Decline, Abatement

**Sentence:** Concerns have been raised about the proliferation of nuclear weapons in certain

regions of the world.

### 42. DECAPITATED (Verb): सिरकाटना

Pronunciation: duh·ka·puh·tayt·uhd

Meaning: to cut off the head of a person or animal, typically as a form of execution or as a

result of a violent act.

**Synonyms:** Executed, Beheaded **Antonyms:** Spared, Preserved

Sentence: The horror movie featured a gruesome scene in which one of the characters was

decapitated by a supernatural force.

43. HINGES (Noun): काज

Pronunciation: hinj·uhz

Meaning: a crucial or pivotal point or factor upon which something depends or turns.



**Synonyms:** Fulcrum, Swivel **Antonyms:** Rigid, Immobile

**Sentence:** The success of the project hinges on securing adequate funding from investors.

# 44. DISSIDENTS (Noun): असंतुष्ट

Pronunciation: di·suh·dnts

**Meaning:** individuals or groups who publicly express strong disagreement, opposition, or dissent, especially against established political, social, or religious authorities or policies.

**Synonyms:** Agitators, Insurgents **Antonyms:** Acquiescent, Followers

**Sentence:** The dissidents gathered in the town square to protest against the government's

repressive policies.

#### 45. STIFLE (Verb): दबाना

Pronunciation: stai-fl

**Meaning:** to smother or suffocate someone or something by restricting airflow.

Synonyms: Quash, Curb

**Antonyms:** Unleash, Promulgate

Sentence: The heavy smoke in the room made it difficult to breathe, and she felt like it

was stifling her.

#### 46. FODDER (Noun): चारा

Pronunciation: faw-duh

**Meaning:** food that is given to farm animals.

**Synonyms:** Forage, Silage **Antonyms:** Abstain, Deny

**Sentence:** In winter, cattle eat fodder which lacks pigment and dairy products are naturally

paler.

# 47. ENGRAVE (Verb): उत्कीर्ण

Pronunciation: uhn·grayv

**Meaning:** to cut words or designs on metal, stone, etc.

Synonyms: Carve, Inscribe

Antonyms: Obliterate, Expunge

**Sentence:** She had the ring engraved with her initials.

#### 48. INCURSION (Noun): आक्रमण

Pronunciation: uhng·kuh·shnz

Meaning: a sudden attack by foreign armies etc., usually across international borders.



Synonyms: Aggression, Attack

**Antonyms:** Retreat

**Sentence**: The rebels made frequent incursions into the area controlled by the government.

### 49. EXPEDITIOUS (Adjective): शीघ्र

Pronunciation: ek·spuh·di·shuhs

**Meaning:** done with speed and efficiency.

Synonyms: Speedy, Swift

**Antonyms:** Slow

**Sentence:** The judge said that arbitration was a fair and expeditious decision.

making process.

## 50. COMMUNIQUE (Noun): सरकारी परिपत्र

Pronunciation: kuh·myoo·nuh·kay

Meaning: an official statement, especially from a government, a political group, etc.

**Synonyms:** Bulletin, Missive **Antonyms:** Secret, Concealment

Sentence: The palace has issued a communique denying the rumour.
