1. UNKEMPT (adjective) - गंदा

Pronunciation: uhn kempt
Meaning: having an untidy or disheveled appearance
Synonyms: untidy, messy, scruffy, disordered, disheveled, disarranged, rumpled
Antonyms: tidy, neat
Usage: After being locked in the dungeon for two years, the prisoner looked pale and unkempt.

2. PROHIBIT (verb) – निषेध

Pronunciation: pruh·hi·buht **Meaning:** formally forbid something by law, rule, or other authority **Synonyms:** forbid, ban, bar, interdict, veto, proscribe, outlaw **Antonyms:** permit, authorize **Usage:** The government decided to <u>prohibit</u> the import of toxic waste.

3. LACKADAISICAL (adjective) – उत्साहविहीन

Pronunciation: la·kuh·dei·zuh·kl
Meaning: lacking enthusiasm and determination
Synonyms: careless, lazy, lax, unenthusiastic, uninterested, lukewarm, indifferent
Antonyms: enthusiastic, excited
Usage: My son's lackadaisical attitude about studying is causing him to do poorly in school.

4. QUAINT (adjective) – विचित्र, विलक्षण

Pronunciation: kweint
Meaning: attractively unusual or old-fashioned
Synonyms: unusual, different, attractive, charming, picturesque, sweet
Antonyms: modern, ugly, normal, ordinary
Usage: Tabitha looked adorable in her <u>quaint</u> homemade dress.

5. FLIPPANT (adjective) – अविनीत

Pronunciation: fli·pnt **Meaning:** not showing a serious or respectful attitude



Synonyms: frivolous, superficial, shallow, glib, thoughtless, carefree, irresponsible Antonyms: serious, respectful

Usage: If you are <u>flippant</u> during your job interview, you will not be offered a position.

6. INAUGURATE (verb) – उद्घाटन करना

Pronunciation: uh·naw·gyuh·reit
Meaning: begin or introduce
Synonyms: initiate, begin, start, institute, launch, establish, commence
Antonyms: end, wind up
Usage: Officials in Japan say they will inaugurate a new bullet train route in August.

7. STEEP (adjective) – तीव्र ढलानवाला

Pronunciation: steepMeaning: rising or falling sharplySynonyms: precipitous, sheer, abrupt, sharp, perpendicular, vertical, bluffAntonym: gentleUsage: His brakes failed on a steep hill.

8. IMPEACH (verb) – दोषी ठहराना

Pronunciation: uhm · peech Meaning: to charge a public official with a crime Synonyms: indict, charge, accuse, arraign, prosecute Antonym: acquit Usage: We must <u>impeach</u> the judge for taking bribes.

9. CHIVALROUS (adjective) - उदार

Pronunciation: shi·vuhl·ruhs
Meaning: courteous and gallant, especially towards women
Synonyms: gallant, gentlemanly, respectful, thoughtful, considerate, protective
Antonyms: rude, boorish, unmannerly
Usage: During the heavy rain, the <u>chivalrous</u> man gave the woman his umbrella.

10. SNEAKY (adjective) – गुप्त

Pronunciation: snee kee
Meaning: behaving in a sly or secretive manner
Synonyms: sly, crafty, cunning, furtive, wily, clever, artful, scheming
Antonyms: honest, open
Usage: The <u>sneaky</u> thief snuck into the jewelry store and stole several thousand dollars' worth of diamonds without anyone knowing.
