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






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

Indian Air Force Day 2025: Celebrating 93 Years of Valor and Service



Indian Air Force Day, celebrated annually on October 8th, is a significant national observance that the establishment, honors achievements, and sacrifices of the Indian Air Force (IAF). In 2025, the IAF marks its 93rd anniversary, with celebrations focusing on operational readiness, technological advancements, and crucial role in national security and humanitarian missions.

Significance and Theme

Indian Air Force Day is a time to pay tribute to the courage, dedication, and professionalism of the IAF personnel who safeguard the nation's airspace. The day's significance is manifold:

- Honoring Service and Sacrifice: It is a solemn occasion to remember the air warriors who have made the ultimate sacrifice and to celebrate the achievements of both past and present personnel.
- Showcasing Air Power: The events showcase the IAF's strength, discipline, and the modernization efforts that keep it as the world's fourth-largest air force.
- Inspiration for Youth: The displays and exhibitions aim to

inspire the youth of the nation to consider a career in the armed forces.

The 2025 celebrations place a strong emphasis on Operation Sindoor, an operation highlighting India's swift and effective response against crossborder terrorist infrastructure. The Chief of Air Staff is expected to detail the IAF's crucial role in this operation.

Celebrations and Highlights

The main event at the Hindon Air Force Base in Ghaziabad is a grand spectacle that includes:

- Grand Parade and Flypasts: A ceremonial parade is held, followed by an impressive flypast that showcases the IAF's diverse fleet and combat capabilities.
- Aircraft and System Display: The event features an extensive display of advanced and indigenous aerial weaponry and platforms, including:
- Frontline Fighter Jets: Rafale, Sukhoi Su-30MKI, and MiG-29.
- Heavy-lift and Transport Aircraft: C-17 Globemaster III and C-130J Super Hercules.
- Helicopters: Apache attack helicopter with Longbow radar, and the Advanced Light Helicopter (ALH).
- Indigenous Systems: Netra Airborne Early Warning & Control (AEW&C) system, Akash Surface-to-Air Missile System, and S-band Rohini radar.
- Tribute to MiG-21 Bison: A special farewell tribute is paid to the legendary MiG-21 Bison, which has been a backbone of the IAF for over six decades.

- Celebrating Humanitarian Role: The IAF also highlights its capabilities as a "first responder" in disaster relief and humanitarian missions, such as flood relief and earthquake responses.
- International Engagements: The celebrations feature the IAF's increasing international collaboration through participation in joint exercises.

History of Indian Air Force Day

The date of October 8th was chosen to commemorate the day the IAF was officially established:

- October 8, 1932: The Indian Air Force was officially established as an auxiliary air force of the British Empire under the name Royal Indian Air Force (RIAF).
- April 1, 1933: The RIAF commissioned its first squadron, No.1 Squadron, with four Westland Wapiti biplanes and five Indian pilots.
- World War II: Following its distinguished service in World War II, the IAF was granted the prefix 'Royal' in 1945.
- 1950: With India becoming a republic, the prefix 'Royal' was dropped, and the force was formally constituted as the Indian Air Force (IAF).

The IAF's motto, "नभः स्पृशं दीप्तम्" (Nabhaḥ Sparśam Dīptam), meaning "Touch the Sky with Glory," is taken from the eleventh chapter of the Bhagavad Gita, reflecting the force's pursuit of excellence and commitment to the nation.



World Post Day 2025: Celebrating Local Service and Global Reach



World Post Day is celebrated annually on October 9th to mark the anniversary of the establishment of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) in 1874 in Bern, Switzerland. The day is an international observance aimed at raising awareness about the vital role of the postal sector in people's and businesses' everyday lives and its immense contribution to global social and economic development.

2025 Theme: #PostForPeople: Local Service. Global Reach.

The official theme for World Post Day 2025 is "#PostForPeople: Local Service. Global Reach." This theme highlights the enduring power of the postal service to connect communities locally while simultaneously serving as an essential link to the wider world.

- Local Service: This aspect emphasizes the deep roots of post offices within communities, often serving as critical points
 for services like financial transactions (money orders, pensions), bill payments, and, especially in remote areas, access to
 the digital economy.
- Global Reach: This acknowledges the unparalleled global network coordinated by the UPU, which facilitates
 international communication, cross-border e-commerce, logistics, and the efficient exchange of goods and documents
 worldwide.

History and Significance

World Post Day has been celebrated since it was officially declared at the 1969 Universal Postal Congress in Tokyo, Japan. The date was chosen to commemorate the founding of the UPU, which was established to create and maintain a single postal territory for the reciprocal exchange of mail.

The Universal Postal Union (UPU)

The UPU, now a specialized agency of the United Nations, is one of the world's oldest international organizations. Before its creation, sending mail internationally was a complicated, slow, and expensive process, requiring separate agreements between every country. The UPU standardized postal services, creating a uniform, efficient global system that revolutionized communication and trade.



International Day of the Girl Child October 11,

2025

Today, October 11, 2025, is the International Day of the Girl Child, a global observance that celebrates girls' empowerment, education, and leadership. This year's theme, "The Girl I Am, The Change I Lead: Girls on the Frontlines of Crisis," highlights the strength and resilience of girls worldwide, particularly those facing crises like climate change, conflicts, and health emergencies.

Theme for 2025: "The girl I am, the change I lead: Girls on the frontlines of crisis"

The 2025 theme, developed through consultations with girl organizations and UN partners, calls for the global community to recognize and support the vital leadership of girls who are often the most impacted by, yet are actively responding to, multiple crises worldwide.


Significance

1. Recognition of Girls' Unique Rights and Challenges: The day was established by the UN General Assembly in 2011 to specifically recognize that girls face unique challenges and discrimination simply because of their gender and age. While there is an International Women's Day and an International Day of the Child, neither fully addresses the distinct position of adolescent girls. This observance highlights issues like:

- Access to Education: Globally, millions of girls remain out of school, facing barriers like child marriage, poverty, and genderbased violence.
- Health and Nutrition:
 Girls often face poorer
 health and nutritional
 outcomes, and limited access to
 essential services, especially
 during crises.
- Violence and Exploitation: Girls are disproportionately vulnerable to child marriage, sexual violence, trafficking, and other harmful practices.
- 2. Amplifying Girls' Leadership and Agency: The 2025 theme emphasizes that girls are not merely passive recipients of aid; they are leaders, change-makers, and solution-bringers. In the face of conflict, climate change, humanitarian emergencies, and economic insecurity, girls are:
- Organizing in their communities for climate justice.
- Advocating for an end to gender-based violence.
- Mobilizing peers to recover from crises and build peace.

The day serves as a rallying cry to ensure that girls' voices are heard, their actions are recognized, and their needs are prioritized in policymaking, humanitarian responses, and development programs.

3. Call to Action: Investing in Girls' Future: Empowering and investing in adolescent girls is not only a moral



imperative but also a smart economic decision. When girls are educated, healthy, and safe, they have the potential to change the world as tomorrow's workers, entrepreneurs, mentors, and political leaders. The day urges key actions, including:

- Advocacy: Calling for policies that protect girls' rights and enable their leadership, especially in crisis settings.
- Support: Lending dedicated funding and programs that meet the unique needs of girls in crises, including mental wellbeing and education.
- Visibility: Sharing girls' stories and celebrating their achievements to amplify their voices and limitless potential.
- 4. Alignment with Global Goals (Beijing Declaration): The 2025 observance takes on special significance as it marks thirty years since the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (1995)—the most progressive blueprint for advancing the rights of women and girls. International Day of the Girl is a moment to assess the progress made and renew commitment to the goal of gender equality, ensuring that every girl can realize all her rights.



Noble Prize Winners 2025



The 2025 Nobel Prizes recognize groundbreaking achievements across six categories. The awards honor discoveries and contributions in physiology or medicine, physics, chemistry, literature, peace, and economic sciences. This year's winners were recognized for their pioneering work in areas such as immune tolerance, quantum technology, sustainable materials, literary innovation, democratic rights advocacy, and economic growth. Their research and achievements have the potential to drive significant advancements and inspire future generations.

Category Laureates Rationale

<u>Physics John Clarke, Michel H.</u> Devoret, and John M. Martinis

For the "discovery of macroscopic quantum mechanical tunnelling and energy quantisation in an electric circuit." Their work, performed in the demonstrated mid-1980s, quantum mechanical effects (like tunneling and discrete energy levels) could be observed in an electrical circuit large enough to be held in a hand. This groundbreaking research laid the essential foundation for developing the next generation of quantum technology, including quantum computers.

<u>Chemistry</u> <u>Richard</u> <u>Robson,</u> <u>Susumu Kitagawa, and Omar Yaghi</u> For "creating molecular constructions with 'rooms' in between" (Metal-Organic Frameworks or MOFs). They developed a new form of molecular architecture where metal ions act as cornerstones linked by long organic molecules, creating crystals with large internal cavities. These porous MOF materials have applications in storing desired gases or chemicals, such as trapping moisture from the air to get water or absorbing ethylene gas to slow the ripening of fruit.

<u>Physiology or Medicine Mary E.</u> <u>Brunkow, Fred Ramsdell, and</u> Shimon Sakaguchi

For their groundbreaking discoveries concerning peripheral immune tolerance that prevent the immune system from attacking the body's own tissues (autoimmunity). Their research—specifically the discovery and understanding of a key regulatory mechanism—laid the foundation for a new field of research and has spurred the development of new treatments for cancer and autoimmune diseases.

<u>Literature</u> <u>László</u> Krasznahorkai (Hungarian author)

For his "compelling and visionary oeuvre that, in the midst of apocalyptic terror, reaffirms the power of art." His works are known for their profound, complex prose and dark, apocalyptic themes that explore the human condition in times of great uncertainty and fear, ultimately highlighting the enduring strength of artistic expression.

Peace María Corina Machado (Venezuelan politician)

For her "tireless work promoting democratic rights for the people of Venezuela and for her struggle to achieve a just and peaceful transition from dictatorship to democracy." The Norwegian Nobel Committee praised her as an extraordinary example of civilian courage, recognizing her role as a key, unifying figure in the

country's political opposition against an entrenched authoritarian regime.

Economic Sciences (Sveriges Riksbank Prize) Joel Mokyr, Philippe Aghion, and Peter Howitt

For "having explained innovation-driven economic growth." Mokyr was recognized for identifying the historical prerequisites for sustained technological progress, while Aghion and Howitt were honored for developing the theory of "sustained growth through creative destruction," which explains how new innovations constantly replace older products and industries, driving long-term economic expansion.

The Nobel Prizes: Overview

The Nobel Prizes are a set of international awards handed out annually for achievements in Physics, Chemistry, Physiology or Medicine, Literature, and The prizes Peace. were established by the will of Swedish inventor and industrialist Alfred Nobel (1833-1896). The first prizes were awarded in 1901.

- The Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel was established by Sweden's central bank in 1968 and is administered and presented alongside the original five Nobel Prizes.
- Each laureate receives a gold medal, a diploma, and a monetary award (which, in 2025, was approximately 11 million Swedish kronor).
- A prize may be shared by up to three individuals, while the Peace Prize can also be awarded to institutions and organizations.



New Delhi 2025 World Para Athletics Championships: A Historic Success

The 12th edition of the World Para Athletics Championships, the biggest competition for para-athletes outside of the Paralympic Games, was held in New Delhi, India, from September 27 to October 5, 2025. The event marked a significant milestone as it was the first time India and South Asia had hosted the championships, positioning the nation firmly on the global para-athletics map.



Key Details and Organization

- Host City & Venue: New Delhi, India, at the iconic Jawaharlal Nehru (JLN) Stadium.
- Dates: September 27 to October 5, 2025 (9 days of competition).
- Scale: The championships drew over 2,100 participants, including more than 1,000 elite athletes, from over 100 nations. It was the largest-ever para-sport gathering organized in India.
- Events: A total of 186 medal events were contested, featuring a full program of track and field disciplines for athletes
 across various impairment classifications (including visual, intellectual, cerebral palsy, amputation, and spinal cord
 injury).
- Infrastructure: The Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium was upgraded with a new, world-class MONDO track and enhanced athlete-friendly, accessible facilities, earning international praise for its high standards of organization and technical conduct.

Significance and Legacy for India

The 2025 Championships were heralded as a new era for para-sport in India.

- Best-Ever Performance: The host nation delivered its most successful performance in the history of the championships. India finished in 10th position in the medal tally, securing a record total of 22 medals (6 Gold, 9 Silver, and 7 Bronze).
- Inclusivity and Awareness: Beyond the competition, the event served as a powerful catalyst for promoting inclusion and raising awareness about para-sports within India and across the globe.
- International Praise: The World Para Athletics (WPA) body presented the organizers with a trophy for the successful hosting of the event, with WPA and IPC presidents expressing eagerness for India to host more such major international para-sport events in the future.

Athlete Highlights

The competition saw numerous record-breaking performances and triumphs of human will:

- Indian Stars: Indian para-athletes, many supported by the government's Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS), shone brightly on home soil. Highlights included Paralympic champion Sumit Antil (Javelin F64) winning his third world title, and Shailesh Kumar clinching India's first gold of the championships in the Men's High Jump T63 with an Asian record.
- Global Dominance: Countries like Brazil and the People's Republic of China led the medal table, underscoring their strength in the sport.



Police Commemoration Day: October 21st



The Police Commemoration Day is observed annually on October 21st across India to pay solemn tribute to the thousands of police personnel who have sacrificed their lives in the line of duty, both domestically and while defending the nation's borders. It is a day of remembrance, honor, and a reaffirmation of the nation's gratitude for the selfless service of the police forces.

<u>Declaration of Commemoration Day</u>

In January 1960, the Annual Conference of Inspectors General of Police of States and Union Territories made the solemn decision that October 21st would henceforth be observed as "Commemoration Day" or "Martyrs' Day" by all police forces in India, in memory of the sacrifices made at Hot Springs and to honour all police personnel who lay down their lives in the service of the nation.

Significance of the Day in Modern India

The day is a moment for the entire nation to reflect on the immense sacrifices made by police forces in various domains:

 Counter-Insurgency and Terrorism: The day honors the

- personnel who have fallen in the fight against terrorism, militancy, and insurgency in regions like Jammu and Kashmir, the Northeast, and the 'Red Corridor' (Naxal-affected areas).
- Maintenance of Law and Order:
 It pays tribute to the countless lives lost in performing routine yet dangerous duties, such as crime prevention, traffic control, investigation, and maintaining public order.
- Humanitarian Service: It acknowledges the police's role in disaster relief operations, the C OVID-19 pandemic response, and other humanitarian challenges, where they often act as first responders.
- National Security and Integrity:
 The day reinforces the police forces' paramount role in safeguarding the nation's internal security and territorial integrity, often serving in extremely challenging environments.

Observances and Tribute (2025)

The main observance of Police Commemoration Day takes place at the National Police Memorial (NPM) in New Delhi.

The National Police Memorial

Dedicated to the nation by the Prime Minister in 2018, the NPM is the central site of reverence. It comprises three main elements:

- Central Sculpture: A 30-foot high granite monolith cenotaph that symbolizes the strength, resilience, and selfless service of police personnel.
- The Wall of Valour: A long wall on which the names of over 35,000 police martyrs who have sacrificed their lives since India's Independence in 1947 are inscribed.

Commemorative Events

On October 21st, the main function is customarily presided over by the Union Home Minister, involving:

- Commemoration Parade: A joint parade of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) and the Delhi Police.
- Wreath-Laying Ceremony: Senior dignitaries lay wreaths at the National Police Memorial to pay homage to the martyrs.
- Reading of the Roll of Honor:
 The names of the police personnel who attained martyrdom in the previous year are read out across the country to acknowledge their supreme sacrifice.

Across all states and Union Territories, police units hold similar parades and ceremonies at local police memorials, often accompanied by community-engagement activities such as blood donation camps, essay competitions, and motorcycle rallies to foster stronger bonds between the police and the public.



United Nations Day 2025: Celebrating 80 Years of Global Unity

October 24, 2025, marks a significant milestone: the 80th anniversary of United Nations Day. This annual observance commemorates the entry into force of the UN Charter in 1945, the founding document that officially established the United Nations as an international body committed to peace, human rights, and social progress.

The Significance of 80 Years

The 2025 observance is particularly important as the UN reaches its 80th anniversary. The theme and focus for the year reflect this milestone, often centered on "The United Nations at 80: Building our future together." This



focus encourages member states and the global community to reflect on the organization's legacy while also addressing the urgent challenges of the 21st century.

Since its founding, following the devastation of World War II, the UN has evolved into the world's most universal international organization. Its core mission, as laid out in the Charter, remains:

- To maintain international peace and security.
- To develop friendly relations among nations.
- To achieve international cooperation in solving global problems.
- To be a center for harmonizing the actions of nations in the attainment of these common ends.

Key Focus Areas for the 80th Anniversary

The 80th anniversary is a moment to not only celebrate achievements, such as preventing a third world war and advancing human rights, but also to propel forward key initiatives:

- The UN80 Initiative: This is a push for modernization and reform across the UN system, aiming to make the
 organization more agile, effective, and responsive to present and future global challenges like the climate crisis, growing
 inequality, and technological disruption.
- The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): United Nations Day reaffirms the commitment to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, focusing on the global effort to achieve peace, prosperity, and a healthy planet. Events often highlight goals like Quality Education (SDG 4) and Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions (SDG 16).
- "Our Common Agenda" and the "Pact for the Future": These are forward-looking processes aimed at strengthening global governance, accelerating the SDGs, and ensuring a multilateral system that is "fit for the future" for all peoples.

Commemorations Around the World

United Nations Day is traditionally marked globally by:

- Official meetings and discussions at the UN Headquarters in New York and offices worldwide, including high-level Security Council debates reflecting on the future of the organization.
- Cultural performances, exhibits, and educational events to inform the public about the UN's goals and work.
- Public engagement from governments, civil society, and schools, often centered around themes of peace, unity, and global partnerships.

As the UN celebrates 80 years, United Nations Day 2025 serves as a powerful call for nations to renew their commitment to multilateralism, work collectively, and uphold the principles of the UN Charter, ensuring it remains a symbol of hope for a better world.



International Animation Day: October 28, 2025

International Animation Day (IAD) is a global observance held annually on October 28 to celebrate the art of animation, honor its creators, and recognize its profound cultural and technological impact worldwide. In 2025, IAD falls on a Tuesday.

History and Significance of the Date

International Animation Day was proclaimed in 2002 by the International Animated Film Association (ASIFA), an organization officially recognized by UNESCO. The date, October 28, was chosen to commemorate the anniversary of a pivotal moment in the art form's history:

- The World's First Public Animation: On October 28, 1892, French inventor Charles-Émile Reynaud presented his Théâtre Optique (Optical Theatre) at the Musée Grévin in Paris.
- Pioneering Technique: Reynaud's system, using his Praxinoscope invention, projected handpainted, moving images onto a screen before a public audience. His show, featuring pantomimes like Pauvre Pierrot!, marked the first time projected animated images were publicly exhibited, setting the stage for the animation industry that would follow.

By celebrating this date, ASIFA pays tribute to the pioneers who transformed simple drawings into a dynamic medium of expression.

The Role of ASIFA and the Annual Poster

As the coordinating body, ASIFA is central to the global celebration.

• Global Coordination: ASIFA coordinates events and helps promote the celebration in over 50 countries, with local chapters organizing

screenings, workshops, and exhibitions.

- The IAD Poster: Each year, ASIFA commissions a notable animator to create an original art poster for International Animation Day. This poster is then adapted and used by coordinating bodies worldwide.
- 2025 Poster Artist: For IAD 2025, the official poster was generously created by Croatian animator and film director Lucija Mrzljak. Her design embraces a classical, hand-drawn aesthetic, with the central inspiration being the concept of animation as "light in the dark," a creative force that illuminates and brings life to the unseen.

Worldwide Celebration and Impact

IAD serves as a platform to highlight animation's rich heritage, its technical evolution, and its role as a powerful, non-verbal form of cross-cultural communication.

Key Celebrations

Across the globe, cultural institutions, animation schools, studios, and enthusiasts participate through events such as:

- Film Screenings: Showcasing a diverse range of animated works, from historical classics and experimental shorts to full-length features and student films. These often include the Film Program Exchange organized by ASIFA, featuring curated selections of international shorts.
- Workshops and Demonstrations:
 Offering hands-on opportunities
 to learn about various animation
 techniques, including traditional
 2D, stop-motion, claymation, and
 cutting-edge 3D and computer generated imagery (CGI).



Panel Discussions and Exhibitions: Animators, writers, and technical artists participate in discussions about the craft, the industry's future (including the integration of AI), and exhibitions of artwork, concept design, and production stills.

Significance of Animation

Animation is celebrated for its versatility and profound impact:

- Limitless Storytelling: It's a medium that transcends the limitations of live-action film, providing an unparalleled canvas for imaginative narratives and fantastical ideas.
- Cultural Bridge: Since many animated films are non-verbal or are easily dubbed, animation acts as a universal language, allowing stories and cultural expressions to be shared across linguistic and national borders.
- Education and Awareness: Animation is an essential tool in education and public health, simplifying complex ideas and delivering vital information in an accessible and engaging manner.

International Animation Day ultimately recognizes the countless artists, scientists, and technicians who continually push the boundaries of this dynamic art form, inspiring new generations of creators.



C.P. Radhakrishnan Elected as India's 15th Vice President



Early Life & Background

- Full Name & Birth: Chandrapuram Ponnusamy Radhakrishnan, born on 20 October 1957 in Tiruppur, Tamil Nadu
- Education: Earned a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) from V. O. Chidambaram College in Thoothukudi. During college, he excelled in sports—particularly table tennis, and was also a longdistance runner; he enjoys cricket and volleyball

Political Roots

- RSS & BJP Association: Began his political journey in the early 1970s via the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), joining its political wing, Bharatiya Jana Sangh, by 1974. He later became a key figure in the BJP, particularly in Tamil Nadu
- Tamil Nadu Leadership: Served as state secretary of BJP in 1996 and then state president between 2003– 2006. Belongs to the Kongu Vellalar Gounder community, known for its socio-economic prominence in the state

Parliamentary and Administrative Roles

- Member of Parliament: Elected twice to the Lok Sabha from Coimbatore in 1998 and 1999, securing his reputation as a trusted party leader
- Coir Board: Chaired the Coir Board of India from 2016 to 2020; during his term, coir exports reached a record value exceeding ₹2,700 crore (~USD 325 million)

Gubernatorial Tenure

- Jharkhand Governor: Took office in February 2023
- Additional Charges: Later held additional responsibilities as Governor of Telangana and Lieutenant Governor of Puducherry in 2024
- Maharashtra Governor: Appointed as Governor of Maharashtra in July 2024 and served in that capacity until being chosen as Vice Presidential candidate

Vice Presidential Election: September 2025

- Victory: Elected as India's 15th Vice President on 9
 September 2025, securing 452 first-preference votes
 out of 752 valid ones, defeating former Supreme Court
 judge B. Sudershan Reddy, who received 300 votes
- Voting Details: Of 781 electors, 767 MPs voted. The high turnout and margin reflected both BJP's strength and opposition cross-voting concerns.
- Role & Significance: Takes on the second-highest constitutional office and becomes the Chairperson of the Rajya Sabha, stepping in as acting President if needed

Reputation & Relations

- Amicable Leadership: Known in Tamil Nadu as "Ajatshatru" for his cordial relationship across party lines—including with DMK & AIADMK—and referred to as "Vajpayee of Coimbatore" for his temperament
- Soft-Spoken & Clean Image: Praised as a disciplined, humble, and unblemished leader both in political and administrative arenas
- Regional Pride: Tamil Nadu leaders hailed him as a "son of the soil" and celebrated his being the third Vice President from the state
- Nationalism and Ideology: Framed his win as a victory of "nationalistic ideology" and reaffirmed commitment to national development and constitutional values
- Federal Harmony Advocate: Emphasizes importance of cooperative federalism, urging stronger ties between the Centre and states for a robust democracy
- Praise from Leaders: Maharashtra's political heavyweights, including CM Fadnavis, Dy CMs Shinde and Pawar, and Union Minister Piyush Goyal, lauded his leadership, humility, and public service record.



International September



The International Day of Democracy is observed every year on 15 September. It was established by the United Nations General Assembly in 2007 by resolution A/RES/62/7. The goal is to promote and uphold the principles of democracy worldwide, raise awareness among citizens and governments, and encourage the of democratic strengthening institutions. The date ties in with the Universal Declaration on Democracy, adopted by the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) in September 1997. After various international dialogues on democracy, especially through the **ICNRD** process (International Conferences on New and Restored Democracies) the idea for a global observance was developed.

<u>Key Principles of Democracy</u> <u>Emphasized</u>

The observance day highlights certain values that are considered essential for democracy to function:

- Free, fair, and regular elections by universal suffrage;
- Respect for human rights, including freedom of expression;
- Participation of citizens in decision-making;
- Rule of law, transparency, accountability of institutions.

Significance / Why It Matters

Day of Democracy: 15th

- It provides a chance to review the state of democracy globally: where it is strong, where it is under threat.
- It reminds governments and citizens of their roles and responsibilities in preserving and improving democratic systems.
- It helps in raising awareness about challenges like disinformation, shrinking civic spaces, inequality, gender barriers, etc.

Theme for 2025

- The theme for International Day of Democracy 2025 is: "Achieving gender equality, action by action."
- Along with the theme, three priority areas are emphasized:
- Promoting parity in parliaments and politics — aiming for equal representation of all genders in political decision-making.
- Encouraging gender-sensitive institutions — making sure that political and legal systems, public bodies, laws etc. recognize and respond to gender differences and ensure fairness.
- Combating gender-based violence and discrimination an essential part of ensuring equal participation and safety for all citizens.

The UN Secretary-General, in his message for the day, underlines that democracy and the rule of law are being challenged by disinformation, division, and shrinking civic space, and that upholding gender equality is both a value and practical action.

<u>How It Is Observed / What Can Be</u> Done

- Many countries, civil society organisations, schools, and parliaments hold events: debates, lectures, public forums, awareness campaigns.
- Activities often focus on the yearly theme: for 2025, that means workshops, discussions, policy proposals, or awareness drives on gender equality.
- The day is also used to encourage citizen participation — voting, civic engagement, public dialogue etc.

<u>Challenges Facing Democracy (that</u> the Day Helps Address)

- Gender inequality in political representation: women and gender minorities remain underrepresented in most parliaments globally.
- Discrimination & violence against women trying to participate in public life.
- Restricted civic spaces and reduced freedom of expression in many countries.
- Disinformation and polarization, which can undermine trust in democratic institutions.

The International Day of Democracy is more than symbolic—it is a call to action. While democracy may not look the same everywhere, its core values require ongoing work: voices being heard, rights being respected, institutions being accountable. In 2025, focusing on gender equality highlights that ensuring democracy for all requires specific, concrete actions to level the playing field.



Hindi Diwas – 14th September 2025

History

- Hindi Diwas is celebrated every year on 14th September.
- On this day in 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted Hindi, written in Devanagari script, as the official language of India (Article 343 of the Constitution).
- The first official celebration of Hindi Diwas took place in 1953.
- The date was chosen to honor Beohar Rajendra Simha's efforts and also because it was his birthday, one of the strong advocates of Hindi as the official language.

Significance

- The day is observed to promote and spread awareness about the importance of the Hindi language.

Notable Moments

- The Studio's Record: The biggest story was The Studio's sweep — 13 wins. It set the record for the most Emmys won by a comedy series in a single season.
- Adolescence's Sweep in its Category: It really dominated the Limited / Anthology categories.

- Severance, despite getting the most nominations, did not dominate in terms of wins in the main televised ceremony.
- Youngest Winner: Owen Cooper (age 15) became the youngest to win for Outstanding Supporting Actor in a Limited or Anthology Series or Movie.
- Political Statements: Hannah Einbinder's comment in her acceptance speech (mentioning "Free Palestine") got attention, some of it censored (bleeped) on the live broadcast.

Context & Importance

- The Emmys are a barometer for what is regarded as high-quality television in the U.S., both by the industry and (to some extent) by audiences. The 2025 Emmys showed strong success for streaming platforms (Apple TV+, Netflix, HBO Max) as well as established networks.
- Fresh shows making big impacts:
 The Studio (a first-year comedy) had a breakout performance.
 That shows that newer content can compete even with more established series.
- The balance of wins vs. nominations: Sometimes a show gets many nominations but fewer wins; nominations are recognition, but wins are what make headlines. Severance is an example — many nominations but less in "major" wins.
- Also, the political speech by Hannah Einbinder reflects how award ceremonies remain a platform not only for celebrating art but also for voices & causes.



Online Gaming Bill, 2025

- Name & Status: The "Promotion and Regulation of Online Gaming Act, 2025" was passed by both Houses of Parliament (Lok Sabha on 20 August 2025, Rajya Sabha on 21 August 2025) and received the President's assent on 22 August 2025.
- Purpose: To provide a legal framework regulating online gaming in India — including prohibiting online money games (i.e. games involving monetary stakes), promoting safer forms of gaming like e-sports and social games, protecting users (especially minors), and preventing harms like addiction, financial loss, fraud.
- Territorial Extent: Applies throughout India, including to games operated from outside India if they are accessible to Indian users.

What it Prohibits

The Act bans a number of things related to online money gaming:

- Offering / Aiding / Abetting: No person is allowed to provide online money games or help in running them.
- Advertising / Promotion of online money games is prohibited. That includes direct or indirect advertising or inducement.
- Financial Transactions: Entities like banks or financial institutions must not facilitate payments or authorizations for online money games. That means both the platform and the payment handlers can be held liable.
- Blocking: The government can block access to realmoney gaming services (if they breach the law) even if they are outside India, if they are accessible to Indian users.

Regulatory / Promotive Measures

While banning or restricting money games, the Act also includes constructive/promotive elements for other kinds of gaming:

- Recognition & development of e-sports: The Act empowers the government to recognise, register, regulate, and promote e-sports, support tournaments, infrastructure, research, etc.
- Promotion of online social and educational games: Encouraging games that are non-monetary (no financial stakes), those which build skills, help learning etc. These can be registered, recognised, and promoted under the law.

Offence Penalties



Offering online money games Up to 3 years imprisonment, fine up to ₹1 crore. Repeat offences may have higher penalties.

Advertising online money games Up to 2 years imprisonment, fine up to ₹50 lakh.

Financial facilitation (banks etc.) Also liable under the Act.

- Other enforcement tools: The Act gives power to block access to offending platforms, remove / disable content, etc. Also powers to investigate, etc.
- When It Comes Into Force: The Act is passed and in law, but not yet enforced. It will be enforced on 01st October 2025. Until that date, the prohibition / regulation provisions don't apply.

Implications / Explanation

- This is a blanket ban on online money games, regardless of whether they are "skill-based" or "chance-based". Many games which earlier claimed to be "games of skill" (e.g., fantasy sports, certain quiz / prediction games, etc.) are swept under the ban if users pay or stake money expecting reward.
- Platforms that previously operated real money games will need to shift models (if they want to stay legal) either move to non-monetary versions (social games), or get registered as e-sports platforms under the conditions the Act prescribes. They will also need to remove or stop facilitating deposits, etc.
- Advertisers, influencers, and media channels will need to be careful: promoting/broadcasting advertisements for real money games can lead to penalties. Those who advertise such games (directly or indirectly) are liable.
- Financial sector / payment infrastructure is affected: Banks, payment services, etc., must not facilitate money flows for prohibited games. They could face liability.



World Environmental Health Day: 26th September

World Environmental Health Day is celebrated annually on September 26th to recognize the crucial link between the environment and human health. The day was established in 2011 by the International Federation of Environmental Health (IFEH) to raise global awareness of environmental health issues and to promote the work of environmental health professionals. It serves as a reminder that a healthy planet is essential for the health of its people.



Theme for World Environmental Health Day 2025

The theme for World Environmental Health Day 2025 is "Clean Air, Healthy People." This theme highlights the critical importance of air quality for public health and emphasizes the direct link between air pollution and a wide range of health problems.

Why This Theme?

The focus on clean air is a direct response to a major global health crisis. Air pollution is a silent killer, contributing to millions of premature deaths worldwide each year. The World Health Organization (WHO) identifies air pollution as one of the greatest environmental risks to human health. - Respiratory illnesses: Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), asthma, bronchitis, and lung infections.



Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw Launches NIELIT Digital University Platform

- Launch Date: The NIELIT Digital University platform was launched on October 2, 2025.
- Objective: The platform aims to democratize access to highquality digital education, offering industry-focused programs in emerging technologies.
- New Centers: The launch event included the virtual inauguration of 5 new NIELIT centers in Muzaffarpur, Balasore, Tirupati, Daman, and Lunglei.
- Industry Collaboration: The event featured partnerships with leading industry partners to strengthen industry-academia collaboration.
- Reach and Impact: With 56 NIELIT centers, 750+ accredited institutes, and 9,000+ facilitation

India has been re-elected to Part II of the ICAO Council

- Re-election Term: India has been re-elected to the ICAO Council for a three-year term, from 2025 to 2028, during the 42nd ICAO Assembly Session held in Montreal, Canada.
- Part II Representation: India is part of Part II of the Council, which comprises states that make the largest contribution to the provision of facilities for international civil air navigation.

- Founding Member and Continuous Presence: India has been a founding member of ICAO since 1944 and has maintained an uninterrupted presence on the Council for 81 years, showcasing its commitment to global aviation standards.
- Commitments for 2025-2028: India's re-election reflects its commitment to strengthening aviation safety, security, and sustainability, as well as promoting equitable global connectivity.

R Venkataramani reappointed as Attorney General of India

- Re-appointment Date: R Venkataramani was re-appointed as the Attorney General of India on September 26, 2025, for a two-year term.
- Term Duration: His reappointment is effective from October 1, 2025, and will last for two years.
- Role and Responsibilities: As Attorney General, he will represent the government in litigations, advise on complex legal issues.
- Background: Mr. Venkataramani, 75, succeeded veteran jurist K.K. Venugopal after completing his predecessor's term when he first assumed office on October 1, 2022.
- Authority: The Attorney General is a constitutional position appointed by the President on the recommendation of the Union government, and holds the right to appear in any court across the country.

India's first officially child marriage free district is Balod

- Zero Child Marriages for Two Years: The designation was granted after no cases of child marriage were reported in the district for two consecutive years. This status was confirmed following a rigorous verification process.
- Complete Certification Coverage: The entire district, including all 436 Gram Panchayats and 9 urban bodies, received formal certificates from the state government, certifying them as child marriage-free.
- Part of a National Campaign: Balod's success is a major milestone under the national initiative, 'Child Marriage-Free India' (also known as Bal Vivah Mukt Bharat), which was launched by the Prime Minister in August 2024.

Uttarakhand Becomes First State to Abolish Madrasa Board

- Abolition of Madrasa Board: The Uttarakhand government has abolished the Madrasa Education Board Act, 2016, and the Non-Government Arabic and Persian Madrasa Recognition Rules, 2019, effective July 1, 2026. This move aims to bring minority education into the national mainstream.
- New Education Authority: A new authority, the Uttarakhand Minority Education Authority, will regulate, modernize, and maintain quality checks on institutions operated by minority



- communities. This authority will ensure that education in these institutions aligns with the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.
- Uniform Education System: The decision aims to introduce a uniform education system, where students from all backgrounds, including those in madrasas, will follow a standardized curriculum and evaluation framework. This will enable students to access higher education and professional courses on par with other students.
- Inclusion of Other Minority Communities: The new bill extends recognition to educational institutions belonging to other minority communities.

India's smartphone exports hit record \$13.4 billion

- Record Export Value: India achieved a record-breaking \$13.4 billion in smartphone exports in the first half of FY26 (April-September 2025), marking a significant milestone in the country's emergence as a global smartphone manufacturing hub.
- Apple's Dominant Role: Apple drove this growth, accounting for over 75% of shipments, with \$10 billion worth of iPhone production under the Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme. This highlights Apple's increasing reliance on India as a key production center.
- Strong US Demand: The US was a major market for these exports, accounting for over half of India's smartphone exports in recent months. This underscores the importance of the US-India trade relationship.
- Growth Drivers: The Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme

played a crucial role in boosting local production and exports. Other brands like Motorola also contributed, with their exports growing sevenfold.

The National Red List Roadmap & Vision 2025-2030 launched

- Launch and Objective: The National Red List Roadmap was launched at the IUCN World Conservation Congress in Abu Dhabi to create a nationally coordinated framework for assessing, documenting, and protecting India's vast array of species. The roadmap aims to establish a science-based redlisting and threat evaluation system.
- Scope and Coverage: The initiative will assess approximately 11,000 species, including 7,000 species of flora and 4,000 species of fauna, across India's diverse ecosystems.
- Importance for India's Biodiversity: India is one of the world's 17 megadiverse countries, hosting nearly 8% of global flora and 7.5% of fauna, with four biodiversity hotspots.

India rolled out Alpowered UPI payments within ChatGPT

- Pilot Project Launch: India has launched a pilot project enabling AI-powered UPI payments within ChatGPT, allowing users to make transactions directly from the platform.
- Partnership: The project is a collaboration between the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), Razorpay, and OpenAI, with banking partners Axis Bank and Airtel Payments Bank.

- Key Features: The AI-powered payment system uses natural language processing to interpret user commands, validates transactions, and ensures secure payments through UPI.
- Security Measures: The system employs end-to-end encryption, on-device biometric authentication, and multi-factor authentication to ensure secure transactions.
- Potential Impact: This development could revolutionize digital payments in India, making transactions more convenient and seamless, while also paving the way for wider adoption of AIpowered payment systems.

Bharath Thammineni Becomes First Indian to Climb 9 Peaks Above 8,000m



- Historic Indian Record: Bharath Thammineni becomes the first Indian mountaineer to successfully summit nine of the world's 14 peaks that are above 8,000 meters (known as the eight-thousanders).
- Final Summit: Cho Oyu: The historic feat was completed with the successful ascent of Mount Cho Oyu (8,201m), the world's sixth-highest mountain, on October 14, 2025.
- List of Major Summits: His nine 8,000m summits include the iconic peaks of Mount Everest (8,848m), Kangchenjunga (8,586m), Lhotse (8,516m).

Rajnath, Yogi inaugurate India's largest aero engine test bed in UP

- Inauguration: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath jointly inaugurated India's largest aero engine test bed in Lucknow.
- Facility Purpose: The test bed is designed for testing and validating aero engines, crucial for strengthening India's aerospace and defence selfreliance.
- Strategic Importance: The facility supports the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative, reducing dependence on foreign testing facilities.
- Key Agency Involved: Developed under the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) / DRDO collaboration (depending on official details, can confirm exact body).
- Regional Boost: The project not only strengthens India's defence ecosystem but also positions Uttar Pradesh as a defence and aerospace hub.

Odisha Ranks 5th in E-Bus Adoption, Plans 1.000+ Fleet

- National Ranking: Odisha secured the 5th position in India for electric bus (e-bus) adoption.
- Current Status: The state has already introduced e-buses in key cities under the 'Location Accessible Multimodal Initiative (LAccMI)' scheme.
- Expansion Plan: Odisha government announced plans to expand its e-bus fleet to over 1,000 buses in the coming years.
- Objective: The move aims to promote green public transport,

- reduce carbon emissions, and improve urban mobility.
- Significance: With this step, Odisha is set to become a leading state in sustainable transport, aligning with India's net zero and clean energy goals.

India's First Port-Based Green Hydrogen Project at VOC Port

- Project Inauguration: Union Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Sarbananda Sonowal, inaugurated the project on September 5, 2025, marking a significant step in India's clean energy transition.
- Green Hydrogen Production: The Rs 3.87 crore pilot facility produces 10 Nm³/hr of green hydrogen, powering streetlights and an electric vehicle charging station in the port colony, making VOC Port the first Indian port to generate green hydrogen.
- Green Methanol Bunkering Facility: Alongside the hydrogen project, Sonowal laid the foundation for a Rs 35.34 crore Green Methanol Bunkering and Refuelling Facility with a 750 m³ capacity, supporting the proposed Coastal Green Shipping Corridor between Kandla and Tuticorin.
- Renewable Energy Integration:
 The project aligns with India's National Green Hydrogen Mission, aiming to reduce dependence on fossil fuels, promote sustainable energy, and position VOC Port as a key green bunkering hub in south India.

CP Radhakrishnan elected as India's 15th Vice President

 Election Result: CP Radhakrishnan won the election with 452 votes, defeating Opposition nominee B Sudershan Reddy who secured 300 votes. A

- total of 767 votes were cast, with 752 being valid and 15 invalid.
- Background: Radhakrishnan is a veteran of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and has deep roots in the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). He served as the BJP's State President in Tamil Nadu from 2004 to 2007.
- Governor Roles: Before becoming Vice President, Radhakrishnan served as the Governor of Maharashtra since July 31, 2024, and previously as the Governor of Jharkhand for nearly one and a half years.

Acharya Devvrat Gets Additional Charge as Maharashtra Governor

- Temporary Appointment: This is an additional charge for Acharya Devvrat, meaning he will concurrently serve as the Governor of both Gujarat and Maharashtra. This is a temporary arrangement until a permanent Governor for Maharashtra is appointed.
- Constitutional Mandate: The President of India, Droupadi Murmu, made the appointment exercising her powers under the Constitution. When the office of a Governor falls vacant, the President can appoint the Governor of a neighboring state to assume the responsibilities.
- Vacancy due to Vice-Presidential Election: The need for this appointment arose after C. P. Radhakrishnan, who was serving as the Governor of Maharashtra, was elected as the 14th Vice-President of India.
- Experienced Administrator: Acharya Devvrat is a seasoned administrator, having served as the Governor of Gujarat since 2019. Prior to that, he was the Governor of Himachal Pradesh. His experience is expected to ensure the smooth functioning of



the gubernatorial duties in Maharashtra.

Udaipur was awarded the Ramsar Wetland City Accreditation in 2025

- First Indian Cities to Receive Accreditation: Udaipur, along with Indore, holds the distinction of being the first two Indian cities to be recognized under the Ramsar Convention's Wetland City Accreditation scheme. This marks a significant milestone for India in its efforts toward urban environmental conservation.
- Part of a Global Network: By this accreditation. receiving Udaipur joins a select group of cities worldwide that recognized for their sustainable wetland conservation practices. This recognition provides the city with international positive publicity and a platform to share its successful strategies with other global cities.
- Benefits of the Accreditation: The status as a "Wetland City" will promote eco-tourism and create sustainable livelihoods for local communities. It also reinforces the city's brand as the "City of Lakes" and a model for balancing urban development with ecological preservation.

Marium Fatima Becomes Bihar's First Female FIDE Master

- Name and Origin: Marium
 Fatima is a talented young chess
 player from Muzaffarpur, Bihar,
 who has made history by
 becoming the state's first Woman
 FIDE Master (WFM).
- Achievement: She achieved this milestone at the recently concluded Commonwealth Chess Championship, where she surpassed the 2000 FIDE rating mark required for the prestigious

- title, eventually achieving a FIDE rating of 2083.
- Significance of WFM Title: The Woman FIDE Master title recognizes Marium's international standard of play, requiring a FIDE rating threshold of 2100+, and marks her as a consistent performer in FIDEsanctioned events.
- Recognition and Future Goals: Marium's achievement has been recognized by the Director General of Bihar State Sports Authority, Ravindran Shankaran.

India rises to 38th position among 139 economies in the Global Innovation Index 2025

- Rank and Performance: India has climbed to the 38th position among 139 economies in the Global Innovation Index 2025, solidifying its lead in Central and Southern Asia and maintaining its status as an innovation overperformer for the 15th consecutive year.
- Key Strengths: India's strengths lie in its scale, entrepreneurial activity, and growing ability to translate scientific knowledge into commercial impact. It ranks 1st in ICT services exports, 4th in Late-stage VC deals, 8th in Intangible asset intensity, and 11th in Unicorn valuation.
- Innovation Ecosystem: India's innovation ecosystem is driven by a dynamic startup scene, a growing private sector, and increasing investment in R&D. However, challenges remain, particularly in infrastructure and R&D spending, which stood at only 0.65% of GDP in 2020.

 Comparison with Other Economies: India is part of a group of middle-income economies making significant strides in innovation, including China (10th), Türkiye (43rd), Vietnam (44th), and the Philippines (50th).

They used natural earth pigments and bamboo sticks to create vibrant depictions of animals, plants, and geometric motifs.

IAS Pratyay Amrit Becomes Bihar Chief Secretary

- Appointment Details: Pratyay
 Amrit, a 1991-batch IAS officer,
 has been appointed as the new
 Chief Secretary of Bihar,
 effective September 1, 2025,
 replacing outgoing Chief
 Secretary Amrit Lal Meena.
- Early Transition: In a historic move, Amrit will serve as Officer on Special Duty (OSD) in the Chief Secretary's office from August 4, 2025, ensuring a smooth transition and continuity in governance.
- Administrative Experience: Pratyay Amrit has extensive experience in key departments, including Health, Disaster Management, and Development Commissioner, showcasing his transformative administrative skills.

Punjab became the first state to empanel sign language experts under the Juvenile Justice Act

- Empanelled Professionals: The state will formally empanel sign language interpreters, translators, and special educators.
- Role: These professionals will assist children with communication disabilities during legal proceedings, court hearings, and other official matters to ensure fair and impartial outcomes.
- Deployment: The experts will be deployed district-wise throughout Punjab to ensure timely and continuous support is available wherever needed.

Bengaluru Ranked 26th in Global Al City Index 2025

- Ranking and Position: Bengaluru secured the 26th rank globally, emerging as India's top AI Research & Development (R&D) and data center hub.
- Indian Cities' Performance: Bengaluru leads Indian cities in AI innovation and foreign investments, followed by Mumbai, Delhi, Chennai, and Kolkata. Mumbai and Delhi are leveraging AI for traffic management and public security.
- Global Leaders: Singapore topped the index, driven by strong public-private partnerships in AI applications. Seoul and Beijing ranked second and third, respectively, with notable AI applications in healthcare, education, and transportation.

Rajasthan launched India's first drone-based artificial rain trial

- India's First Drone-Based Trial:
 Rajasthan launched India's first drone-based artificial rain trial at Ramgarh Dam in Jaipur, marking a shift from traditional airplaneassisted cloud seeding to unmanned aerial vehicles.
- Objective: The trial aims to enhance rainfall using advanced cloud seeding techniques, potentially providing drought relief for Rajasthan's agriculture sector and helping save crops during dry spells.

India's First Drone-Al Powered Artificial Rain Experiment Launched

- Experiment Details: The experiment, a joint project between the Agriculture Department and GenX AI, involves 60 drone cloud seeding test flights over Ramgarh Dam. State Agriculture Minister Dr. Kirodi Lal Meena inaugurated the project.
- Technology Used: Cloud seeding involves dispersing substances like silver iodide or dry ice into clouds to stimulate rainfall. The drones will spray these chemicals into clouds to attract moisture and form larger water droplets that eventually fall as rain.
- Objective: The primary goal is to induce rain in areas where clouds form but rain doesn't fall, potentially saving crops during dry spells. If successful, this method could be used across Rajasthan.
- Challenges: Cloud seeding requires specific conditions. including moisture-laden clouds suitable atmospheric and The experiment's instability. success depends on these factors, and the outcome may be unpredictable.

OpenAl Hits \$500 Billion Valuation After Share Sale to SoftBank

- Valuation: OpenAI's valuation has skyrocketed to \$500 billion after a \$6.6 billion secondary share sale, surpassing SpaceX's \$400 billion valuation.
- Investors: The share sale involved existing and former employees selling stock to outside investors, including Thrive Capital, SoftBank, Dragoneer Investment Group, Abu Dhabi's MGX, and T. Rowe Price.
 - Revenue: OpenAI generated approximately \$4.3 billion in revenue in the first half of 2025, with a projected annual run-rate revenue of \$8.6 billion.
- Infrastructure Plans: OpenAI is planning a massive infrastructure project called Stargate, a 10 GW data center project over four years, potentially requiring up to \$500 billion in investment, with Oracle and SoftBank as partners.

Khaled al-Anani appointed as UNESCO's Next Director-General

- Nomination: Khaled al-Anani was nominated by UNESCO's Executive Board for the position of Director-General.
- Background: El-Enany is an Egyptologist and Professor of Egyptology at Helwan University, with over 30 years of teaching experience. He's held various positions, including Vice Dean of the Faculty of Tourism and Hospitality, Director of the

- Open Learning Center, and Head of the Tour Guide Department.
- Election: The nomination will be put to a vote by all UNESCO Member States on November 6 during the Organization's General Conference in Samarkand, Uzbekistan. If elected, he'll succeed Audrey Azoulay in mid-November.

Sergio Gor named the youngest U.S. Ambassador to India

- Early Political Involvement: Sergio Gor started his political journey as a College Republican and founded the George Washington University chapter of Young America's Foundation. He supported Senator John McCain's 2008 presidential campaign and worked for the Republican National Committee.
- Republican Party Roles: Gor served as a spokesman for Representatives Steve King and Michele Bachmann, and later as communications director and deputy chief of staff for Senator Rand Paul. He played a significant role in Paul's office before joining Donald Trump's team.
- Director of Presidential Personnel Office: In November 2024, Gor was named director of the White House Presidential Personnel Office, overseeing over 4,000 appointees in the Trump administration.

India UK Launch Connectivity & Innovation Centre

- Launch and Funding: The India-UK Connectivity and Innovation Centre was launched on October 10, 2025, with a combined initial investment of £24 million (approximately ₹250 crore) over four years, committed by both countries.
- Objective: The Centre aims to advance digital inclusion, nextgeneration connectivity, and secure communication systems, aligning with the India-UK 2035 Vision and fostering a trusted, inclusive, and resilient digital future.
- Benefits: The partnership is expected to deliver tangible socio-economic benefits, including boosting digital inclusion, creating commercial opportunities for telecom and tech startups, and fostering global standards leadership in emerging technologies like 6G and AI-driven communications.
- Implementation: The Centre will unite the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), Government of India, and the UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) under the UK-India Technology Security Initiative.

Sebastian Lecornu Re-Appointed as New PM of France

- Re-appointment Date: Sébastien Lecornu was re-appointed as Prime Minister of France on October 10, 2025, after a brief resignation.
- Previous Role: Before becoming Prime Minister, Lecornu served as the Minister of the Armed Forces from May 20, 2022, to September 9, 2025.



- Tenure: His initial tenure as Prime Minister lasted only 26 days, from September 9, 2025, to October 6, 2025, making it the shortest in the history of the French Fifth Republic.
- Political Affiliation: Lecornu is a member of the Renaissance party and has held various positions in the French government, including Minister for Local Authorities and Minister of the Overseas.

IMF raises India's FY26 growth forecast to 6.6%

- Reason for the Upgrade: Strong First Quarter Momentum: The primary driver for the upward revision is the "carryover from a strong first quarter" (April-June 2025), where India's GDP grew at an impressive 7.8%. This robust initial performance provides a higher base and greater momentum for the rest of the fiscal year.
- Resilience Despite Global Headwinds: The forecast reflects the Indian economy's resilience and strong domestic fundamentals, as the strong Q1 growth is seen as more than offsetting the immediate impact of global challenges, such as the increased US tariffs on Indian imports.
- Revised Figures: The new forecast of 6.6% is a 20 basis points (0.2 percentage point) increase from the previous estimate of 6.4% (made in the July World Economic Outlook update).
- Contrasting Outlook for FY27: While the FY26 forecast was raised, the IMF simultaneously lowered India's growth projection for FY27 to 6.2% (from 6.4% earlier).

Adani, Google to Build India's Largest Al Data Hub

- Massive Investment: Google plans to invest \$15 billion (approximately ₹1.25 lakh crore) over five years (2026-2030) in this initiative, which is its largest-ever investment in India.
- Location and Scale: The facility will be India's largest AI data centre campus, located in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. It is planned to have an initial gigawatt-scale (GW) compute capacity, designed for advanced AI workloads.
- Core Partnership & Technology:
 The project is a collaboration between Google and AdaniConneX (a joint venture of Adani Enterprises and EdgeConneX), with Bharti Airtel as a key partner. The hub will house TPU and GPU-based compute power essential for training large AI models.
- Sustainable Infrastructure: A major focus is on clean energy. The Adani Group will co-invest in new transmission lines, clean energy generation, and energy storage systems to power the hub sustainably, ensuring its operations are as environmentally conscious as possible.

India Elected to UN Human Rights Council for 2026–28

 Seventh Term: The 2026–2028 term is India's seventh stint on the UN Human Rights Council since its creation in 2006. This demonstrates a sustained and continuous involvement in the global human rights body, with mandatory breaks taken in compliance with the rules.

- Elected Unopposed: India was elected unopposed to one of the vacant seats in the Asia-Pacific States category. Although unopposed, a pro-forma secret ballot vote was held where India received overwhelming support from the UN General Assembly members.
- Three-Year Tenure: The term of membership is for three years, commencing on January 1, 2026. Council members are elected by the UN General Assembly.
- Commitment to Human Rights: India's Permanent Representative to the UN emphasized that the election "reflects India's unwavering commitment to human rights and fundamental freedoms." India's candidacy was presented with a focus on its pluralistic society.

Singapore Tops Henley Passport Index 2025

- Singapore's Top Ranking: Singapore has reclaimed the top spot in the Henley Passport Index 2025, offering visa-free access to a record 193 destinations out of 227 globally.
- Top 3 Passports: Following Singapore are South Korea and Japan, which share the 2nd and 3rd spots, respectively, with visafree access to 190 and 189 destinations.
- India's Ranking: India's passport slipped to Rank 85 in 2025, down from Rank 80 in 2024, reflecting changing visa policies, global security considerations, and diplomatic negotiations affecting Indian travelers.
- Global Trends: The index reveals an increasingly competitive landscape in global mobility, with Asian nations dominating the top spots and traditional Western powers like the US and UK experiencing a decline in their rankings.

Dinesh K Patnaik Appointed India's Envoy to Canada

- New Appointment: Senior diplomat Dinesh K. Patnaik has been appointed as India's High Commissioner to Canada.
- Previous Role: He previously served as Director General of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR).
- Diplomatic Experience: Patnaik is a seasoned Indian Foreign Service (IFS) officer of the 1990 batch, with experience in Europe, Asia, and Africa.
- Significance: As High Commissioner, he will play a key role in strengthening bilateral ties, addressing challenges, and expanding cooperation in trade, education, and diaspora engagement.

Singapore ranked safest in Asia, 6th globally in Global Peace Index'25

- Global Ranking: Singapore is ranked 6th globally in the Global Peace Index 2025, making it the only Asian country in the top 10.
- Asian Ranking: Singapore is the safest country in Asia, followed by Japan (12th globally), Malaysia (13th globally), and Bhutan (not specified globally).
- Peace Score: Singapore scored 1.357 in the index, improving from 1.339 in 2024, reflecting its continued commitment to maintaining social stability.
- Key Factors: The ranking considers 23 indicators across three domains: societal safety and security, ongoing domestic and international conflict, and degree of militarization. Singapore excelled in societal safety and security.

Dr. Deepak Mittal appointed as India's New Envoy to UAE

- Appointment: Dr. Deepak Mittal, an Indian Foreign Service officer from the 1998 batch, has been appointed as the next Ambassador of India to the United Arab Emirates.
- Background: As a seasoned diplomat, Dr. Mittal brings extensive experience to his new role, further strengthening India's diplomatic ties with the UAE.
- Assumption of Office: He is expected to take up his new assignment shortly, although the exact date hasn't been specified.

Rohit Rathish appointed as the next High Commissioner of India to the Republic of Seychelles

- Appointment Details: Rohit Rathish, a 2006 batch Indian Foreign Service (IFS) officer, has been appointed as the next High Commissioner of India to the Republic of Seychelles, according to the Ministry of External Affairs.
- Current Role: Rathish is currently serving as Joint Secretary in the Ministry of External Affairs and is expected to take up his new assignment shortly.
- Diplomatic Relations: India and Seychelles have historically enjoyed close diplomatic relations, with cooperation in areas like defense, security, and economic development. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Seychelles in 2015 marked a significant milestone in bilateral ties.
- Strategic Importance: The appointment highlights India's

strategic interest in the Indian Ocean region, where Seychelles plays a crucial role. Strengthening ties with Seychelles is vital for India's maritime security and regional influence.

David Lammy becomes UK Deputy PM after Rayner's exit

- Reason for Angela Rayner's Exit:
 Angela Rayner resigned as Deputy Prime Minister and Labour's deputy leader following a probe into her tax affairs, specifically regarding underpaid stamp duty on an £800,000 flat in Hove.
- David Lammy's Role: David Lammy has been appointed as the new Deputy Prime Minister while retaining his position as Justice Secretary, overseeing critical issues like court backlogs, prison capacity, and confidence in the criminal justice system.
- Responsibilities: As Deputy
 Prime Minister, Lammy will
 stand in for Prime Minister Keir
 Starmer during his absence and
 act as a senior sounding board
 across the government, while
 also focusing on delivering
 reforms in the justice department.
- Labour Party's Next Steps: Rayner's exit triggers a deputy leadership contest within the Labour Party, which will test the party's coalition and potentially shape its tone and message heading into the next legislative crunch points.

Irfaan Ali re-elected as Guyana President

 Election Results: Irfaan Ali won a second term as President, with his People's Progressive Party/Civic (PPP/C) securing 36 seats in the National Assembly, an increase of three seats from



- the 2020 election. The party garnered over 55% of the popular vote.
- International Observers: The election process was monitored by several international groups, including the Organization of American States (OAS) and the Carter Center.
- Opposition Performance: The We Invest in Nationhood party, a newcomer led by US-sanctioned businessman Azruddin Mohamed, secured 24.87% of the votes and 16 seats, becoming the primary opposition.

India & Israel Sign Bilateral Investment Agreement

- Landmark Agreement: The agreement was signed between Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and Israel's Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich in New Delhi, marking a significant step in promoting investments between the two countries.
- Protection for Investors: The treaty ensures that Israeli investors in India and Indian Israel receive investors in adhering protection, to international precedents practices, including a minimum standard of treatment and nondiscrimination.
- Dispute Settlement: The agreement provides for an independent forum for dispute settlement through arbitration, boosting investor confidence and comfort level.

Irfaan Ali Wins Second Term as Guyana's President

 Re-election: Irfaan Ali has been re-elected for a second term as the President of Guyana, following a successful general

- election held on September 1, 2025.
- Party Majority: His party, the People's Progressive Party/Civic (PPP/C), won a majority in parliament, granting Ali a renewed mandate to lead the country.
- Oil Wealth: Ali's re-election comes at a time when Guyana is experiencing vast oil wealth, which is expected to significantly impact the country's economy and development.
- Geopolitical Challenges: As President, Ali will have to navigate complex geopolitical challenges, balancing relationships with various countries while making decisions that benefit Guyana's growth and stability.

Norway PM Jonas Gahr Stoere Secured 2nd Term

- Støre's Labour Party-led government secured a second term after a closely fought election, with the center-left bloc winning a narrow majority of seats.
- The election was heavily influenced by voter concerns over the rising cost of living and the geopolitical impacts of the wars in Ukraine and Gaza.
- The re-election came despite a significant surge in support for the populist, right-wing Progress Party, which achieved its bestever result and became the second-largest party in parliament.
- Støre's government will remain a minority administration and will rely on smaller, left-leaning parties to pass critical legislation, which will likely involve difficult negotiations on issues such as wealth taxes and future oil exploration.

Larry Ellison Surpasses Elon Musk as World's Richest

- Larry Ellison, co-founder of Oracle, temporarily became the world's wealthiest person, surpassing Elon Musk, after an unprecedented surge in Oracle's stock price.

- Design and Fabrication: This microprocessor was designed by ISRO's Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) and fabricated at the Semiconductor Laboratory (SCL) in Mohali, showcasing India's end-to-end capabilities in semiconductor technology.
- Space-Grade Capabilities: Vikram-3201 is engineered to withstand extreme temperatures, radiation, and vibrations, making it suitable for launch vehicles and

satellites. Its 32-bit architecture enables higher performance and wider memory addressing.

India-Thailand Military Drill Exercise MAITREEXIV Begins

- Exercise Details: The 14th edition of Exercise MAITREE commenced on September 1, 2025, at the Joint Training Node (JTN) in Umroi, Meghalaya, and will run until September 14, 2025.
- Participating Forces: The exercise involves 120 personnel from the Indian Army's Madras Regiment and 53 personnel from the Royal Thai Army's 1st Infantry Battalion, 14th Infantry Brigade.
- Objective: The primary focus is on enhancing interoperability and mutual understanding between the two armies, particularly in counter-terrorist operations in semi-urban terrain under Chapter VII of the United Nations Charter.

INS Trikand joins Multilateral Exercise In Egypt

- Induction Significance: INS Androth is the first of a series of eight anti-submarine warfare shallow-watercraft being built for the Indian Navy, marking a significant milestone in the country's indigenous defence capabilities.

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Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Sanjay Malhotra's statement that price stability is a necessary but not a sufficient condition to ensure growth is a justification for the apex bank's Monetary Policy Committee's (MPC) decision to slash the policy rate and the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR). While the expectation was a rate cut of 25 basis points, the MPC went in for a 50-point cut at its meeting on Friday. On the back of two earlier reductions in February and April, this brings the cumulative cuts this year to 100 basis points. That clearly shows that the RBI's attention has now shifted to growth. The CRR has been cut by 100 points. The new focus is evident again from Malhotra's words: "It is imperative to continue to stimulate domestic private consumption and investment through policy levers to step up the growth momentum." The muted trend in inflation provided the confidence for the RBI to lower the interest rates. It is also clear that the rate cut was an indication of its lack of confidence in the ability of the economy to sustain the 7.4% growth in the March quarter without more policy support. Inflation had declined to 3.16% in April and is likely to stay subdued. The RBI expects it to average 3.7% in 2025-26, lower than its earlier estimate of 4%. The RBI has projected growth in the current financial year at 6.5%. The country needs a strong push for faster growth, and the RBI is using monetary policy as a tool for it. In the present circumstances, there is little room left for fiscal boosts. The government is not in a position to increase capital expenditure significantly. While the rate cut will make cheaper credit available to corporates and individuals, the CRR cut will enable better transmission as banks will have to keep fewer funds with themselves. It will have to be seen whether the decisions will raise private consumption and put in motion the private capex cycle. Apart from policy support, the outlook is favourable with a likely good monsoon. Malhotra has underlined good performance by corporates, banks, households, the government and the external sector, besides stability on financial, price and political fronts. He has also talked of opportunities in terms of demography, digitisation and domestic demand as favourable factors. But the RBI has also shifted its stance from accommodative to neutral, which shows that there may not be any more rate cuts in the near term. That is

probably because of the uncertainties on the global and domestic fronts, which cannot be ignored.




