

### 1.MORBIDITY (noun) : रोग

**Pronunciation:** maw·bid·uh·tee

**Meaning:** the condition of suffering from a disease or medical condition.

**Synonyms:** illness, sickness, macabre

**Antonyms:** cheer, cheerfulness, confidence.

**Sentence:** The therapy can substantially reduce respiratory morbidity in infants.

### 2.EXTRADITE (verb) : अपराधी देना

**Pronunciation:** ek·struh·dite

**Meaning:** hand over (a person accused or convicted of a crime) to the jurisdiction of the foreign state in which the crime was committed.

**Synonyms:** deport, hand over, send back

**Antonyms:** repatriate, reject, expatriate.

**Sentence:** The police have refused to extradite a man wanted for a bank robbery in France.

### 3.SEQUESTERED (adj.) : एकान्त

**Pronunciation:** suh·kveh·stuhd

**Meaning:** (of a place) isolated and hidden away.

**Synonyms:** secluded, cloistered, hidden away

**Antonyms:** desegregate, integrate, assimilate

**Sentence:** I found a sequestered spot at the bottom of the garden and lay down with my book.

### 4.GRUDGE (noun) : ईर्ष्या

**Pronunciation:** gruhj

**Meaning:** a persistent feeling of ill will or resentment resulting from a past insult or injury.

**Synonyms:** grievance, resentment, bitterness

**Antonyms:** goodwill, amiability, civility

**Sentence:** There's been a grudge between the two families for years.

### 5.RECESSED (verb) : स्थगित

**Pronunciation:** ruh·sest

**Meaning:** to bring to a formal close for a period of time

**Synonyms:** adjourned, prorogued, suspended

**Antonyms:** inaugurated, launched, opened

**Sentence:** The judge recessed the court for lunch.

### 6.STARTLED (adj.) : चौंका

**Pronunciation:** staa·tld

**Meaning:** feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm.

**Synonyms:** surprised, amazed, astonished

**Antonyms:** disinterested, incurious

**Sentence:** She was momentarily startled by the sight before her.

### 7.DRENCH (verb) : भिगाना

**Pronunciation:** drench

**Meaning:** wet thoroughly; soak.

**Synonyms:** soak, saturate, wet through

**Antonyms:** desiccate, dry, parch

**Sentence:** We were drenched by the sudden rainstorm.

### 8.ENDURANCE (noun) : धैर्य

**Pronunciation:** uhn·dyoh·ruhns

**Meaning:** the fact or power of enduring an unpleasant or difficult process or situation without giving way.

**Synonyms:** toleration, bearing, sufferance

**Antonyms:** cessation, end

**Sentence:** She showed great endurance in the face of pain.

### 9.NAUGHT (noun) : शून्य

**Pronunciation:** nawt

**Meaning:** the numerical symbol 0 or the absence of number or quantity represented by it

**Synonyms:** nil, nothing, zero

**Antonyms:** cheerful, unregretful, unrepentant

**Sentence:** He's naught but a worthless fool.

### 10.FORMIDABLE (adj.): दुर्जेय

**Pronunciation:** fuh·mi·duh·bl

**Meaning:** inspiring fear or respect through being impressively large, powerful, intense, or capable.

**Synonyms:** intimidating, forbidding, redoubtable

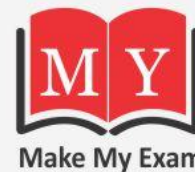
**Antonyms:** calming, comforting, consoling

**Sentence:** No government can be long secure without a formidable opposition.

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
