1. CONTAMINATION (noun) – मलिनता

Pronunciation: kuhn·ta·muh·nei·shn

Meaning: including unwanted substances or factors

Synonyms: contagion, impurity, pollution, corruption, disease, epidemic, infection

Antonyms: cleanliness, purification, sterility

Usage: Water samples taken from streams were analyzed for contamination by chemicals.

2. RANDOM (adjective) – अनियमित, क्रमरहित

Pronunciation: ran·dm

Meaning: without method or conscious decision

Synonyms: accidental, aimless, arbitrary, incidental, indiscriminate, irregular, odd, un-

planned

Antonyms: methodical, planned, systematic

Usage: To fairly choose the winner, the store owner pulled a random slip out of a hat full

of numbered papers.

3. BURGEON (verb) – तेजी से बढ़ना

Pronunciation: buh.jn

Meaning: begin to grow or increase rapidly

Synonyms: expand, swell, explode, boom, proliferate, flourish, thrive, prosper

Antonyms: shrink, contract, diminish

Usage: The actor hopes the use of social media will <u>burgeon</u> his popularity.

4. BLAND (adjective) – नरम

Pronunciation: bland

Meaning: showing no strong emotion

Synonyms: temperate, mild, soft, calm, balmy, soothing, benign

Antonyms: violent, destructive, caustic

Usage: His expression was <u>bland</u> and unreadable.

5. LEVITY (noun) – चंचलता

Pronunciation: leh·vuh·tee **Meaning:** a lack of seriousness

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Synonyms: vivacity, frivolity, liveliness, conviviality, cheerfulness, humor, amusement

Antonyms: seriousness, gravity, depression

Usage: Karen's parents were serious people who did not seem to appreciate her acts of lev-

ity during church service.

6. BROOK (verb) - बर्दाश्त करना

Pronunciation: bruk

Meaning: put up with something or somebody unpleasant **Synonyms:** countenance, tolerate, bear, suffer, withstand

Antonyms: resist, combat, repel

Usage: He won't brook any criticism of his work.

7. CROOK (noun) – धूर्त

Pronunciation: kruk

Meaning: a dishonest individual

Synonyms: cheat, fraudster, shoplifter, thief, mugger, outlaw, lawbreaker

Antonym: lawman

Usage: The man is a crook and a liar.

8. RELEVANCY (noun) - प्रासंगिकता

Pronunciation: reh·luh·vuhn·see

Meaning: the connectedness or appropriateness of a situation

Synonyms: accordance, applicability, significance, application, appositeness, aptness

Antonym: insignificance

Usage: The attorney questioned the <u>relevancy</u> of the opposing council's queries.

9. TRITE (adjective) – घिसा-पिटा

Pronunciation: trait

Meaning: repeated too often

Synonyms: hackneyed, banal, corny, dull, common, exhausted, worn

Antonyms: fresh, new, original

Usage: I did not finish the novel because the story's plot was <u>trite</u> and uninspiring.

10. EULOGY (noun) – गुणगान

Pronunciation: yoo·luh·jee

Meaning: a formal expression of praise

Synonyms: praise, citation, paean, tribute, acclaim, accolade, adulation, applause

Antonyms: blame, censure, criticism

Usage: They chanted the <u>eulogy</u> of the king.

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
