1. INADEQUACY (noun) – अपर्याप्तता

Pronunciation: in-adi-kwesiMeaning: lack of the quantity or qualitySynonyms: insufficiency, deficiency, scantness, scarcityAntonyms: abundance, surplus, competence, strong pointUsage: My grades reflect the shocking <u>inadequacy</u> of school system.

2. ACCOUNTABLE (adjective) - उत्तरदायी, जवाबदार

Pronunciation: uk-auntub(u)l
Meaning: required or expected to justify actions or decisions; able to be explained or understood
Synonyms: responsible, liable, answerable; explicable, understandable, comprehensible
Antonym: unaccountable
Usage: Politicians are ultimately accountable to the voters.

3. IRRESPECTIVE (adjective) - निरपेक्ष

Pronunciation: iri-spek-tiv
Meaning: not taking (something) into account
Synonyms: disregarding, ignoring, notwithstanding
Antonyms: according to
Usage: Every adult pays the same amount of tax, <u>irrespective</u> of income.

4. STRIKING (adjective) - विचित्र, अनोखा

Pronunciation: strai-king **Meaning:** attracting attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent; dramatically good-looking or beautiful **Synonyms:** noticeable, obvious, conspicuous, evident, salient, visible; impressive, imposing, grand, splendid, magnificent **Antonyms:** inconspicuous, unremarkable; ordinary, unimpressive, unattractive, unremarkable **Usage:** His eyes are his most <u>striking</u> feature.

5. INSURMOUNTABLE (adjective) – अजेय

Pronunciation: in-suh-maunt-ub(u)lMeaning: too great to be overcomeSynonyms: insuperable, unconquerable, invincible, unassailableAntonym: surmountableUsage: The age barrier appeared insurmountable.





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6. SWATHE (verb) – लपेटना

Pronunciation: sweith **Meaning:** wrap in several layers of fabric **Synonyms:** wrap, envelop, bind, swaddle, bandage **Usage:** His hands were <u>swathed</u> in bandages.

7. DOWNCAST (adj) – (उदास, मायूस)

Meaning: feeling hopeless or devoid of courage; (of a person's eyes) looking downwards **Synonyms:** disheartened, discouraged, dispirited, downhearted, low-spirited **Antonym:** elated **Usage:**

• With <u>downcast</u> eyes, she continued eating and did not speak again.

• You must not be <u>downcast</u>.

8. CALUMNY (noun, verb) – चुगली, मिथ्यापवाद

Pronunciation: kal-umni **Meaning:** the making of false and defamatory statements about someone in order to damage their reputation; slander smeone **Synonyms:** slander, libel, muckraking **Usage:** <u>Calumny</u> is answered best with silence.

9. FLUMMOX (verb) – उलझाना

Pronunciation: flum(u)ksMeaning: perplex (someone) greatlySynonyms: baffle, bewilder, mystify, bemuse, perplex, puzzle, confuseUsage: She was <u>flummoxed</u> by the question.

10. INADVERTENTLY (adverb) – अनजाने में

Pronunciation: inud-vuh-tuntli
Meaning: without intention
Synonyms: accidentally, by accident, unintentionally, unwittingly, unawares
Antonyms: deliberately
Usage: I <u>inadvertently</u> pressed the wrong button.
