# 1. WEASEL (adj.) : चालक आदमी

Pronunciation: vee·zl Meaning: a deceitful or treacherous person. Synonyms: scoundrel, wretch, serpent Antonyms: innocent, saint, good Sentence: He was a double-crossing weasel.

#### 2. IMPRESARIO (noun) : आयोजक

**Pronunciation:** im·pruh·saa·ree·oh **Meaning:** a person who organizes and often finances concerts, plays, or operas. **Synonyms:** organizer, manager, producer **Antonyms:** agent, attendant, clerk **Sentence:** It was the actor's dream to work under the renowned <u>impresario</u>.

# 3. DISSENSION (noun) : मतभेद

Pronunciation: duh·sen·shn
Meaning: disagreement that leads to discord.
Synonyms: disagreement, difference of opinion, dispute
Antonyms: accord, agreement, concord
Sentence: You won't sow <u>dissension</u> between us.

# 4. EXIGUOUS (adj.) : अल्प

Pronunciation: uhg·zi·gyoo·uhs
Meaning: very small in size or amount.
Synonyms: meagre, inadequate, insufficient
Antonyms: abundant, ample, bountiful
Sentence: The rest of the old man's <u>exiguous</u> savings are donated to that boy.

# 5. MINATORY (adj.) : धमकी

**Pronunciation:** 'mi-nə- tör-ē **Meaning:** expressing or conveying a threat. **Synonyms:** menacing, threatening, baleful **Antonyms:** unthreatening, propitious



Sentence: The novel's protagonist is haunted by a minatory black spectre.

# 6. ATAVISTIC (adj.) : पैतृक

Pronunciation: a·tuh·vi·stuhk
Meaning: relating to or characterized by reversion to something ancient or ancestral.
Synonyms: bygone, erstwhile, former
Antonyms: contemporary, current, modern
Sentence: It would be wrong to interpret them as <u>atavistic</u> remnants.

# 7. ACOLYTES (noun) : अन्यायी

Pronunciation: a·kuh·lites
Meaning: one who follows the opinions or teachings of another
Synonyms: adherents, converts, disciples
Antonyms: defectors, renegades, traitors
Sentence: He is flanked by his two acolytes, Asanga and his brother, Vasubandhu.

# 8. PRUNED (verb) : कम कर दिए हैं

Pronunciation: proondMeaning: to make (something) shorter or smaller with the use of a cutting instrumentSynonyms: bobbed, clipped, croppedAntonyms: elongated, extended, lengthenedSentence: He pruned the dead branches from the old apple tree.

# 9. POMP (noun) : वैभव

Pronunciation: pawmpMeaning: ceremony and splendid display, especially at a public event.Synonyms: ceremony, grandeur, pageantryAntonyms: simplicity, severitySentence: The coronation was conducted with great pomp.

#### 10. CON (verb) : ठगना

Pronunciation: kawn
Meaning: persuade (someone) to do or believe something, typically by use of deception.
Synonyms: swindle, defraud, cheat
Antonyms: undeceive, disclose, reveal
Sentence: Tried to <u>con</u> me into thinking that he had won the lottery.

# 11. RETROSPECTIVE (adj.) : पूर्वप्रभावी

**Pronunciation:** reh•truh•spek•tiv



Meaning: looking again at the past/effective from past date Synonyms: introspective, analytic Antonyms: farsighted, forward, unreflecting Sentence: Teachers settled for a 4.2% pay rise with <u>retrospective</u> effect from 1 April.

# 12. AMNESTY (noun) : आम माफ़ी

**Pronunciation:** am•nuh•stee **Meaning :** a time when a government forgives political crime **Synonyms:** parole, acquittal, exculpation **Antonyms:** conviction, sentence, assessment, charge, fine **Sentence:** President granted the <u>amnesty</u> to some prisoners.

# 13. SLUMP (verb) : मंदी

**Pronunciation:** sluhmp **Meaning:** to fall suddenly and by a large amount **Synonyms:** depressing, recession, crash **Antonyms:** development, growth, advancement **Sentence:** What cause the price of Real Estate <u>slump</u>?



# 14. DELINEATE (verb) : चित्रित करना

Pronunciation: duh•li•nee•ayt
Meaning: describe precisely
Synonyms: define, delimit, describe, draw
Antonyms: distort, misdescribe
Sentence: MRI can <u>delineate</u> the cause of disease easily.

# 15. DECEPTIVE (adj) : कपटी

#### **Pronunciation:** duh•sep•tuhv

**Meaning:** likely to give a false impression or to make somebody believe something that is not true



**Synonyms:** beguile, deceive, devious **Antonyms:** candid, direct, clarifying **Sentence:** Appearance can often be <u>deceptive</u>.

# 16. EXTREMISM (noun) : अतिवाद

Pronunciation: uhk•stree•mi•zm
Meaning : the holding of extreme political or religious views; fanaticism.
Synonyms: radicalism, zealotry
Antonym: moderation
Sentence: The dangers of racist extremism are present everywhere.

# 17. ARBITRARY (adj) : बेतरतीब

Pronunciation: aar•buh•treh•ree
Meaning : based on random choice or personal whim, rather than any reason or system.
Synonyms: whimsical, random
Antonym: rational
Sentence: Raja just ends up taking <u>arbitrary</u> decisions.

# 18. QUESTIONABLE (adj) : शंकास्पद

Pronunciation: kwes•chuh•nuh•bl
Meaning : doubtful as regards truth or validity.
Synonyms: contentious, doubt
Antonym: certain
Sentence: It is <u>questionable</u> whether any of these exceptions is genuine.

#### 19. EXUBERANCE (noun) : उत्साह

Pronunciation: ig•zoo•br•uhns
Meaning : the quality of being full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness; ebullience.
Synonyms: buoyancy, cheerfulness
Antonym: gloom
Sentence : Ram has a sense of youthful <u>exuberance</u>.

# 20. CHOPPY (adj) : अशांत

Pronunciation: chaa•pee
Meaning : (of a sea, lake, or river) having many small waves.
Synonyms: turbulent, heavy
Antonym: calm
Sentence: Sea conditions are often very <u>choppy</u>.



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# 21. PRESCIENT (adj.) : पूर्वज्ञान रखनेवाला

**Pronunciation:** preh•shee•uhnt **Meaning:** knowing about event before they taking place **Synonyms:** farsighted, forehanded, visionary **Antonyms:** careless, heedless, incautious **Sentence:** It was a remarkably <u>prescient</u> vision.

# 22. PLUNGE (verb) : डुबकी

Pronunciation: pluhnjMeaning: to jump, drop with forceSynonyms: dip, immerse, declineAntonyms: surface, expand, increase & ariseSentence: Stock price bounced back after steep plunge earlier this week.

#### 23. PROLONG (adj.) : लम्बा

Pronunciation: pruh•laangMeaning: continuing for a long timeSynonyms: elongate, drag out, attenuateAntonyms: diminish, reduce, thicken, curtailSentence: I don't want to prolong the class unnecessarily.

#### 24. DILAPIDATED (verb) : तबाह करना, नष्ट होना, ग़बन करना

Pronunciation: duh•la•puh•day•tuhd Meaning: demolish/ deface Synonyms: ramshackle, tumbledown, run down, decayed Antonyms: ameliorate, improve, better, upgrade Sentence: The hotel we stayed in was <u>dilapidated</u>.

# 25. HEADLONG (adj, adverb) : अननयंत्रित

**Pronunciation:** hed•laang **Meaning:** too quickly / without enough thought **Synonyms:** cursory, hasty, quick, rapid **Antonyms:** measured, calculated, circumspect **Sentence:** I ran <u>headlong</u> for the open door.

# 26. REIMBURSE (verb) : प्रतिपूर्ति करना

**Pronunciation:** ree•uhm•burs **Meaning:** to pay money back to somebody **Synonyms:** refund, repay, reciprocate



**Antonyms:** deprive, lose, penalise **Sentence:** The company will <u>reimburse</u> you for your travelling expenses.

#### 27. DISDAIN (noun) : नतरस्कार

Pronunciation: duhs•daynMeaning: the feeling that somebody is not good enough to be respected.Synonyms: contempt, hate, execrationAntonyms: acceptance, toleranceSentence: He turned his head away in <u>disdain</u>.

# 28. CRONIES (noun) : साथी

**Pronunciation:** krow•neez **Meaning:** friends or relatives **Synonyms:** associate, companions, comrades **Antonyms:** antagonists, rivals, competitors **Sentence:** He was playing with his <u>cronies</u>.



# 29. LAUDATORY (adj.) : सराहने योग्य, प्रशंसनीय

Pronunciation: laa•duh•taw•ree
Meaning: expressing praise
Synonyms: auditory, predatory, oratory
Antonym: disrespect
Sentence: Her Teaching way is most <u>laudatory</u> among all in the college.

# 30. EXPLICIT (adj) : स्पष्ट

**Pronunciation:** uhk•spli•suht **Meaning:** making something easy to understand **Synonyms:** declared, specific, stated **Antonyms:** obscure, incorrect, inaccurate **Sentence:** He gave me <u>explicit</u> directions on how to get here.



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#### 31. RECESSED (verb) : स्थगित

**Pronunciation:** ruh·sest **Meaning:** to bring to a formal close for a period of time **Synonyms:** adjourned, prorogued, suspended **Antonyms:** inaugurated, launched, opened **Sentence:** The judge <u>recessed</u> the court for lunch.

#### 32. BEDRAGGLED (adj.) : गंदा

Pronunciation: buh·dra·gld
Meaning: dirty and disheveled.
Synonyms: disheveled, disordered, untidy
Antonyms: clean, cleanly, immaculate
Sentence: They found flood victims in <u>bedraggled</u> clothes.

#### 33. HARROWING (adj.) : शोकजनक

Pronunciation: ha·roh·uhng
Meaning: acutely distressing.
Synonyms: agonizing, excruciating, racking
Antonyms: gratifying, pleasing, acceptable
Sentence: There was a harrowing portrayal of the ravages of war.

# 34. VIGNETTE (noun) : शब्दचित्र

Pronunciation: vee.nyet
Meaning: a vivid representation in words of someone or something
Synonyms: definition, delineation, depiction
Antonyms: color, twist, distort
Sentence: Each <u>vignette</u> represents one of the four seasons.

# 35.STARTLED (adj.) : चौंका

Pronunciation: staa·tld
Meaning: feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm.
Synonyms: surprised, amazed, astonished
Antonyms: disinterested, incurious
Sentence: She was momentarily <u>startled</u> by the sight before her.

# 36. QUASHING (verb) : रद्द करने

**Pronunciation:** kvawsh·uhng **Meaning:** reject or void, especially by legal procedure. **Synonyms:** cancel, reverse, rescind



Antonyms: enact, establish, endorse Sentence: His conviction was <u>quashed</u> on appeal.

#### 37. PERSEVERE (verb) : दृढ़ रहें

Pronunciation: puh·suh·veeuh
Meaning: continue in a course of action even in the face of difficulty or with little or no prospect of success.
Synonyms: persist, continue, carry on
Antonyms: give up, quit
Sentence: If you persevere with the work, you'll succeed in the end.

#### 38. AMASSING (verb) : एकत्र करना

Pronunciation: uh·mas·uhng
Meaning: gather together or accumulate (a large amount or number of valuable material or things) over a period of time.
Synonyms: gather, collect, assemble
Antonyms: separating, disbanding, disintegrating
Sentence: Starting from nothing he had <u>amassed</u> a huge fortune.

# 39. CALIGINOUS (adj.) : अंधेरा

Pronunciation: ca·lig·i·nous
Meaning: being without light or without much light
Synonyms: black, dark, darkened
Antonyms: bright, brightened, illuminated
Sentence: Without a flashlight, there was no way to tell what kind of creatures lurked in the <u>caliginous</u> cave.

# 40. DRENCH (verb) : भिगाना

Pronunciation: drenchMeaning: wet thoroughly; soak.Synonyms: soak, saturate, wet throughAntonyms: desiccate, dry, parchedSentence: We were drenched by the sudden rainstorm.

# 41. ESPIONAGE (noun) : जासूसी

**Pronunciation:** eh•spee•uh•naazh **Meaning:** act of finding out secret information about another country or org **Synonyms:** observation, eavesdropping, surveillance **Antonyms:** malfunctioning, insignificant



Sentence: Many people were arrested under the Espionage Act.

# 42. VERISIMILITUDE (noun) : संभाव्यता

Pronunciation: veh•ruh•suh•mi•luh•tood
Meaning: the appearance or quality of seeing to be true.
Synonyms: realism, literalism
Antonyms: falseness, dissimilarity
Sentence: To add verisimilitude, the stage is covered with sand for the desert scene.

# 43. ANTAGONIST (noun) : प्रतिपक्षी

Pronunciation: an•ta•guh•nuhst
Meaning: a person who is strongly against somebody/ something.
Synonyms: adversary, competitor, opposer
Antonyms: associate, protagonist, supporter
Sentence: He hit upon a plan to defeat his <u>antagonist</u>.



# 44. THRALL (noun) : गुलाम

Pronunciation: thraalMeaning: the state of being in someone's powerSynonyms: servitude, slaveryAntonym: masterSentence: The country's economy is in <u>thrall</u> to the big companies.

#### 45. FISSURE (noun) : दरार

Pronunciation: fi•shr
Meaning: a long narrow depression in a surface
Synonyms: crack, cleft
Antonyms: closure, solid
Sentence: Ahead lay a arge <u>fissure</u> in the ice, three feet across



#### 46. OMINOUS (adj.) : अमंगल

Pronunciation: aa•muh•nuhs
Meaning: giving the worrying impression that something bad is going to happen
Synonyms: threatening, menacing
Antonyms: auspicious, bright
Sentence: Those black cloud look a bit <u>ominous</u>.

#### 47. DAUNTING (adj.) : कठिन

Pronunciation: daan•tuhngMeaning: seeming difficult to deal with/IntimidatingSynonyms: troubling, troublesome, dishearteningAntonyms: calming, soothing, relaxingSentence: The prospect of meeting with Principal is quite daunting

#### 48. COMPUNCTION (noun) : मलाल

Pronunciation: kuhm•puhngk•chn Meaning: feeling of deep Regret Synonyms: unease, misgiving, guilt Antonyms: disdain, meanness, happiness Sentence: Actress kept Director and team waiting without the slightest <u>compunction</u>.

# 49. CONCILIATORY (adj.) : मिलाप करनेवाला

Pronunciation: kuhn•si•lee•uh•taw•ree
Meaning : intended or likely to placate or pacify
Synonyms: calm, pacify, quiet
Antonyms: antagonist, fight, stubborn
Sentence: Everyone is in conciliatory mood at the start of the class.

#### 50. PROPHYLACTIC (noun) : रोगनिरोधी

Pronunciation: prow•fuh•lak•tuhk Meaning: intended to prevent diseases Synonyms: preventive, contraceptive Antonyms: unprotective, insecure Sentence: Vaccination and other <u>prophylactic</u> measures are using to prevent COVID-19.

# 51. ORDAIN (verb) : ह्क्म देना

**Pronunciation:** aw dayn **Meaning:** order or decree (something) officially.



Synonyms: decree, command, order Antonyms: ignore, refuse, veto Sentence: Equal punishment was <u>ordained</u> for the two crimes.

# 52. ENTRANT (noun) : शामिल होनेवाला

Pronunciation: en truhnt
Meaning: a person or group that enters, joins, or takes part in something.
Synonyms: beginner, newcomer, fresher
Antonyms: dropout, noncandidate
Sentence: The prize will be awarded to the entrant who wins the tiebreak.

#### 53. HABITUDE (noun) : लगन

Pronunciation: ha·buh·chood
Meaning: a habitual tendency or way of behaving.
Synonyms: affection, affinity, aptitude
Antonyms: apathy, disfavor
Sentence: They have a lifelong habitude of talking too much.

# 54. PHILIPPIC (noun) : निंदापूर्ण वाक्य

**Pronunciation:** phi·lip·pic **Meaning:** a bitter attack or denunciation, especially a verbal one. **Synonyms:** tirade, diatribe, invective **Antonyms:** approval, blessing, commendation **Sentence:** The lecture was a tremendous <u>philippic</u> against our culture.

# 55. ESOTERIC (adj.) : गुप्त

**Pronunciation:** ee·suh·teh·ruhk **Meaning:** intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with specialized knowledge or interest. **Synonyms:** abstruse, obscure, arcane **Antonyms:** common, facile, lucid **Sentence:** Some words are really too esoteric for this dictionary.

# 56. ALIBIS (noun) : बहाना

Pronunciation: a·luh·bize
Meaning: an explanation that frees one from fault or blame
Synonyms: apologies, reasons, excuses
Antonyms: denial, question, request
Sentence: Those students always have a very creative <u>alibi</u> for undone homework.



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# 57. AVID (adj.) : उत्सुक

Pronunciation: ay vuhd
Meaning: having or showing a keen interest in or enthusiasm for something.
Synonyms: keen, eager, enthusiastic
Antonyms: apathetic, indifferent, insouciant
Sentence: She's an avid reader of historical novels.

# 58. REPERTOIRE (noun) : सूची

Pronunciation: reh·puh·tvaa
Meaning: a stock of plays, dances, or pieces that a company or a performer knows or is prepared to perform.
Synonyms: collection, stock, store
Antonyms: fauna, flora, defense.
Sentence: That tune is not in my repertoire.



#### 59. YEARN (verb) : इच्छा करना

#### **Pronunciation:** yuhn

**Meaning:** have an intense feeling of longing for something, typically something that one has lost or been separated from.

Synonyms: crave, desire, want

Antonyms: abjure, dislike, hate

Sentence: She <u>yearned</u> for a glimpse of him.

#### 60. VANITY (noun) : घमंड

#### **Pronunciation:** van·uh·tee

Meaning: excessive pride in or admiration of one's own appearance or achievements. Synonyms: conceit, conceitedness, self-admiration Antonyms: diffidence, self-doubt, self-disgust Sentence: His <u>vanity</u> was his downfall.



#### 61. EGREGIOUS (adj.) : भरंकर

Pronunciation: uh·gree·juhs
Meaning: outstandingly bad or shocking
Synonyms: appalling, horrific, terrible
Antonyms: marvelous, excellent
Sentence: It was an egregious performance in the GRE exam.

# 62. PLAUSIBLE (adj.) : मुमकिन

Pronunciation: plaw·zuh·bl
Meaning: that you can believe
Synonyms: believable, credible, probable
Antonyms: absurd, doubtful, fantastic
Sentence: She could find no plausible explanation for its disappearance.

#### 63. EMBELLISH (verb) : संवारना

Pronunciation: uhm·beh·luhsh
Meaning: make more attractive by the addition of decorative details
Synonyms: elaborate, amplify, enhance
Antonyms: simplify, bare
Sentence: I asked him not to embellish the truth with ideas of his own.

#### 64. WAIVER (noun) : त्याग

Pronunciation: vay·vuh
Meaning: a situation in which somebody gives up a legal claim or right
Synonyms: disclaimer, release
Antonyms: allowance, accept, approval
Sentence: We had to sign a <u>waiver</u>, giving up any rights to the land in the future.

#### 65. SUBSTANTIVE (adj.): मूल

Pronunciation: sub·stan·tive
Meaning: having a firm basis in reality and so important, meaningful
Synonyms: considerable, biggish, major, significant
Antonyms: minute, trivial, marginal
Sentence: Substantive research on the subject needs to be carried out.

# 66. TANDEM (adverb) : मिलकर

**Pronunciation:** tan·dem **Meaning:** alongside each other **Synonym:** together



Antonyms: individual, single

Sentence: The two teams are designed to work in <u>tandem</u>.

# 67. IMPERATIVE (adj.) : अनिवार्य

Pronunciation: im·per·a·tive
Meaning: not to be avoided
Synonyms: compulsory, incumbent, necessary
Antonyms: unnecessary, optional
Sentence: It is imperative that politician should be good communicators.

#### 68. DETERRENCE (noun) : अवरोध

**Pronunciation:** de·ter·rence **Meaning:** action of discouraging through fear of the consequence **Synonyms:** discouragement, dictation **Antonyms:** allowance, permission, approval **Sentence:** This guideline stresses the <u>deterrence</u> of war.

# 69. NAIVE (adj.) : अनुभवहीन

**Pronunciation:** na·ive **Meaning:** without enough experience **Synonyms:** innocent, primitive, unwary **Antonyms:** incredulous, wary, critical **Sentence:** Riya is <u>naïve</u> in this field.

#### 70. ASTOUND (verb) : हक्का बक्का

Pronunciation: as tound
Meaning: to surprise somebody very much
Synonyms: amaze, astonish, flabbergas
Antonyms: expect, calm, clarify, enlighten
Sentence: He wants to surpass & astound them by transforming the district.
