

1. ENTHRALL (verb) - मंत्रमुग्ध करना

Pronunciation: uhn · thrawl

Meaning: capture the fascinated attention of

Synonyms: captivate, charm, enchant, bewitch, fascinate, beguile, entrance

Antonyms: bore, repel, dull

Usage: This book will enthrall readers of all ages.

2. TRUCE (noun) – युद्धविराम

Pronunciation: troos

Meaning: a time period in which opposing sides agree to stop fighting **Synonyms**: ceasefire, armistice, peace, break, respite, lull, moratorium

Antonyms: fighting, hostilities

Usage: When the truce ends at noon tomorrow, it will only be a matter of time before

gunfire is heard again.

3. RETICENT (adjective) - अल्पभाषी

Pronunciation: reh·tuh·snt

Meaning: not revealing one's thoughts or feelings readily

Synonyms: reserved, withdrawn, introverted, restrained, inhibited, diffident, shy

Antonyms: garrulous, talkative, verbose

Usage: Because Ann is so reticent, you hardly ever know what she's thinking.

4. SATURNINE (adjective) – उदास

Pronunciation: sa·tuh·nain **Meaning**: sad and solemn

Synonyms: gloomy, melancholy, melancholic, moody, miserable, lugubrious

Antonyms: cheerful, jovial





Usage: Since Natasha has been ill, she has been in a saturnine mood.

5. INSCRUTABLE (adjective) – गूढ़

Pronunciation: uhn·skroo·tuh·bl

Meaning: impossible to understand or interpret

Synonyms: enigmatic, mysterious, unreadable, impenetrable, cryptic, unexpressive

Antonyms: expressive, transparent

Usage: The riddle remains inscrutable to us.



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6. EBULLIENCE (noun) – उल्लास

Pronunciation: uh.buh.lee.uhns

Meaning: a state of energetic happiness

Synonyms: exuberance, buoyancy, cheerfulness, joy, merriment, jollity, exhilaration

Antonyms: depression, melancholy, sadness

Usage: Ebullience filled the air as the newly married couple, and their excited guests

danced the night away.

7. INSULARITY (noun) - संकीर्णता

Pronunciation: in syoo · la · ruh · tee

Meaning: ignorance of or lack of interest in cultures, ideas, or peoples outside one's own

experience



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Synonyms: parochialism, provincialism, localism, narrowness, pettiness, myopia,

inflexibility

Antonyms: tolerance, accessibility

Usage: It was a typical case of British chauvinism and insularity.

8. COMPACT (adjective) – सघन

Pronunciation: kuhm·pakt

Meaning: closely and neatly packed together **Synonyms**: dense, thick, tight, firm, solid

Antonyms: loose

Usage: The <u>compact</u> design of the machine allows it to be stored easily.

9. SELDOM (adverb) - कभी कभी

Pronunciation: sel·dm **Meaning**: not often

Synonyms: rarely, infrequently, hardly, scarcely, sporadically

Antonyms: often, frequently

Usage: Barking dogs <u>seldom</u> bite.

10. INSENSIBLE (adjective) – बेसुध

Pronunciation: in·sen·suh·bl

Meaning: incapable of physical sensation

Synonyms: unconscious, insensate, senseless, insentient, comatose, inert, numbed

Antonyms: conscious, responsive

Usage: He fell on the ground, <u>insensible</u>.



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
