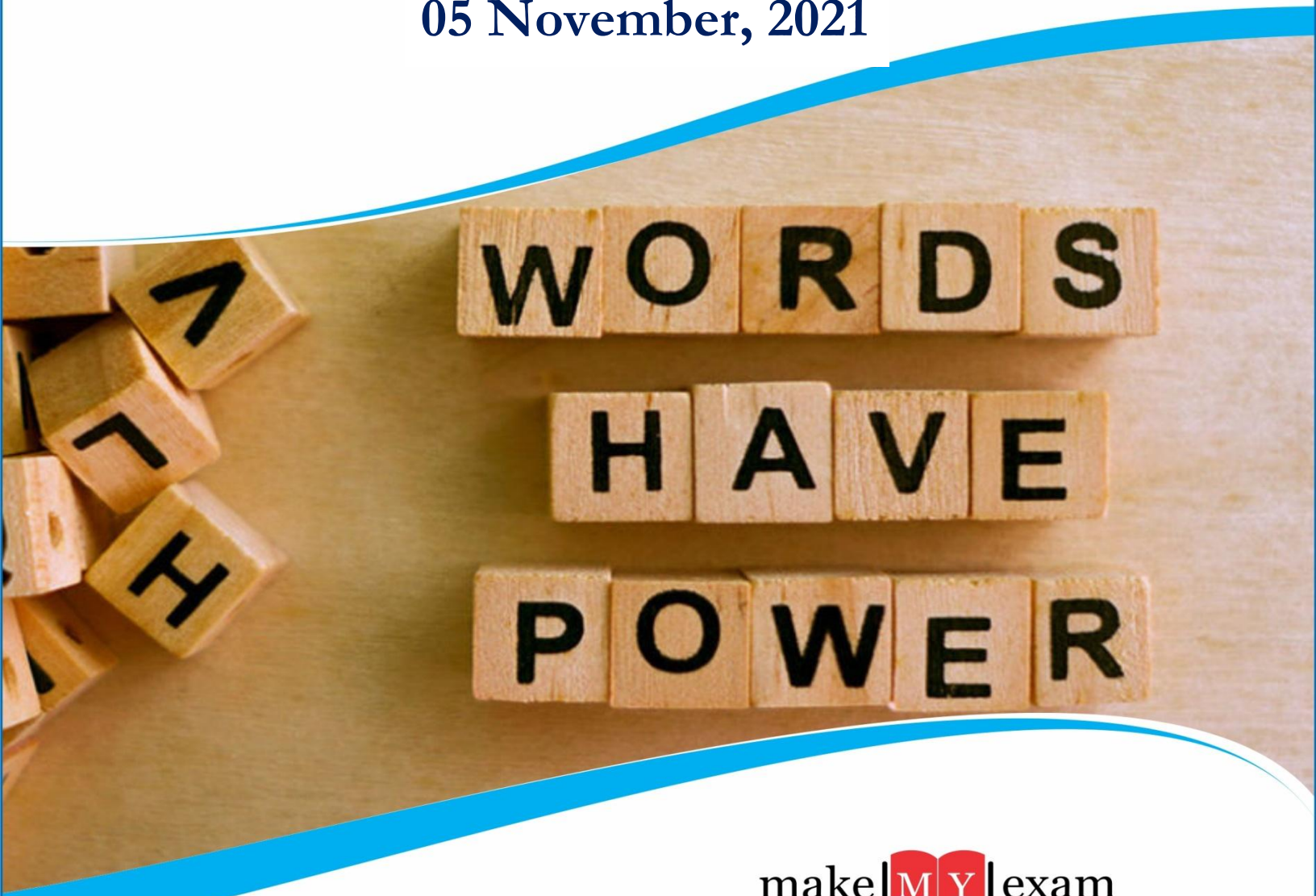

**1. HARDIHOOD (noun) – वीरता**

**Pronunciation:** haad•ee•hud

**Meaning:** boldness; daring.

**Synonyms:** bravery, courage, boldness

**Antonyms:** lethargy, listlessness, sluggishness

**Sentence:** With great hardihood he forced into the room of the gangster.

**2. VOLUNTARILY (adverb) – स्वेच्छा से**

**Pronunciation:** vaw•luhn•teh•ruh•lee

**Meaning:** of one's own free will.

**Synonyms:** of one's own free will, of one's own accord, of one's own volition

**Antonyms:** involuntarily, unwillingly

**Sentence:** Many restaurants voluntarily removed it from their menus

**3. COFFER (noun) – लोहा का संदूक**

**Pronunciation:** kaw•fuh

**Meaning:** a strongbox or small chest for holding valuables.

**Synonyms:** strongbox, money box, cash box

**Sentence:** The nation's coffers are empty.

**4. SNAZZY (adj) – अत्यधिक आकर्षित**

**Pronunciation:** sna•zee

**Meaning:** stylish and attractive.

**Synonyms:** stylish, smart, attractive

**Antonyms:** simple, unadorned, unfashionable

**Sentence:** Paula's wearing a very snaazzy pair of shoes!

**5. INSUPERABLE (adj) – अजेय**

**Pronunciation:** uhn•soo•pruh•bl

**Meaning:** (of a difficulty or obstacle) impossible to overcome.

**Synonyms:** insurmountable, unconquerable, invincible

**Antonyms:** superable, surmountable, vincible

**Sentence:** The difficulties that confront us seem insuperable.

**6. BRAZEN (adj) – बेशर्म**

**Pronunciation:** bray•zn

**Meaning:** bold and without shame.

**Synonyms:** bold, shameless, forward

**Antonyms:** shy, timid, meek

**Sentence:** He went about his illegal business with a brazen assurance

### 7. SCALD (verb) – जला देना

**Pronunciation:** skawld

**Meaning:** injure with very hot liquid or steam.

**Synonyms:** burn, scorch, sear

**Antonyms:** cure, fix, heal

**Sentence:** The tea scalded his tongue.

### 8. ELOQUENCE (noun) – वाग्मिता

**Pronunciation:** eh•luh•kvns

**Meaning:** fluent or persuasive speaking or writing.

**Synonyms:** oratory, rhetoric, grandiloquence

**Antonym:** inarticulateness

**Sentence:** Love and business teach eloquence.

### 9. DILATE (verb) – चौड़ा करना

**Pronunciation:** dai•layt

**Meaning:** make or become wider, larger, or more open.

**Synonyms:** enlarge, become larger, widen

**Antonyms:** shorten, compress, reduce

**Sentence:** The pupils of the eyes dilate as darkness increases.

### 10. HEED (verb) – सावधान

**Pronunciation:** heed

**Meaning:** pay attention to; take notice of.

**Synonyms:** pay attention to, take notice of, take note of

**Antonyms:** disregard, ignore, tune out

**Sentence:** Take heed of your doctor's advice.

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
