

### **1.KALEIDOSCOPIC (adjective) – सर्वदा बदलनेवाला**

**Pronunciation:** kuh·lai·duh·sko·puhk

**Meaning:** having complex patterns of colors

**Synonyms:** multicolored, psychedelic, variegated, motley, complex, intricate, complicated

**Antonyms:** monochrome, fixed, constant

**Usage:** The kaleidoscopic quality of the book is brilliantly realized on stage.

### **2.JOCULAR (adjective) – परिहासशील**

**Pronunciation:** jo·kyuh·luh

**Meaning:** humorous or playful

**Synonyms:** humorous, funny, witty, comic, comical, amusing, chucklesome

**Antonyms:** solemn, serious, earnest

**Usage:** The jocular man is known for his funny punch lines.

### **3.STIPULATE (verb) – शर्त रखना**

**Pronunciation:** sti·pyu·leit

**Meaning:** decide on conditions

**Synonyms:** specify, demand, require, bargain, condition, contract

**Antonyms:** decline, disagree, refuse

**Usage:** He stipulated certain conditions before their marriage.

### **4.EXULTATION (noun) – उमंग**

**Pronunciation:** ek·suhl·tei·shn

**Meaning:** a feeling of great happiness or triumph

**Synonyms:** jubilation, rejoicing, happiness, pleasure, joy, gladness

**Antonyms:** gloom, sadness

**Usage:** I felt a tremendous sense of relief and exultation.

### **5.ESCHEW (VERB) – परहेज़ करना**

**Pronunciation:** uhs·choo

**Meaning:** deliberately avoid using

**Synonyms:** give up, forgo, forswear, shun, renounce, swear off, abjure

**Antonyms:** consume, indulge

**Usage:** A civilized leader must eschew violence.

**6.TENUOUS (adjective) – थोड़ा, हलका**

**Pronunciation:** teh·nyoo·uhs

**Meaning:** very weak or slight

**Synonyms:** slight, insubstantial, flimsy, negligible, weak, fragile, shaky

**Antonyms:** convincing, substantial, heavy

**Usage:** He has a rather tenuous grasp of reality.

**7.IMITATIVE (adjective) – कृत्रिम**

**Pronunciation:** i·muh·tei·tuhv

**Meaning:** copying or following a model or example

**Synonyms:** mimicking, simulated, counterfeit, uninventive, unimaginative, uninspired, plagiarized

**Antonyms:** original, different, genuine

**Usage:** I found the film pretentious and imitative.

**8.GLORIOUS (adjective) – यशस्वी, तेजस्वी**

**Pronunciation:** glaw·ree·uhs

**Meaning:** having, worthy of fame or admiration

**Synonyms:** illustrious, celebrated, famous, famed, renowned, magnificent

**Antonyms:** infamous, ordinary

**Usage:** The film looks back at India's glorious past.

**9.APLOMB (noun) – आत्मविश्वास**

**Pronunciation:** uh·plom

**Meaning:** self-confidence or assurance, especially when in a demanding situation

**Synonyms:** poise, self-assurance, assurance, confidence, self-possession

**Antonyms:** fear, gaucheness

**Usage:** Henry passed the test with aplomb.

**10.ESOTERIC (adjective) – गहन, गूढ़**

**Pronunciation:** ee·suh·teh·ruhk

**Meaning:** known or understood by very few people

**Synonyms:** abstruse, obscure, arcane, mystical, cryptic, mysterious

**Antonyms:** simple, familiar, obvious

**Usage:** Some words are really too esoteric for this dictionary.
