

1. BERSERK (adj.) : पागल

Pronunciation: buh · zuhk **Meaning:** out of control with anger or excitement; wild or frenzied. **Synonyms:** mad, crazy, insane **Antonyms:** calm, sensible, wise **Sentence:** The dog went <u>berserk</u> when a wasp stung him.

2. NIHILISTIC (adj.) : शून्यवाद संबंधी

Pronunciation: nai·uh·list·uhk
Meaning: rejecting all religious and moral principles in the belief that life is meaningless.
Synonyms: hopeless, discouraging, unpromising
Antonyms: hopeful, cheerful, cheery
Sentence: Her latest play is a <u>nihilistic</u> vision of the world of the future.

3. GLINT (noun) : चमक

Pronunciation: glintMeaning: give out or reflect small flashes of light.Synonyms: shine, gleam, sparkleAntonyms: dimness, dinginess, dullnessSentence: There was a glint of mischief in her eyes.

4. DISRELISH (verb) : नापसंद करना

Pronunciation: dis-'re-lish
Meaning: regard (something) with dislike or distaste.
Synonyms: aversion, disfavor, dislike
Antonyms: appetite, affection, fondness
Sentence: I disrelish the thought of sitting through endless meetings on the matter.

5.THY (article) : तेरा

Pronunciation: *thy* **Meaning:** archaic or dialect form of yours. **Synonyms:** thine, thee, yours **Antonyms:** hers, his, its



Sentence: Hide nothing from thy physician.

6. DUNCE (noun) : मूर्ख

Pronunciation: duhnsMeaning: a person who is slow at learning; a stupid person.Synonyms: fool, idiot, stupid personAntonyms: brainy, genius, intellectSentence: It is very impolite to call others a <u>dunce</u>.

7. HOLLER (verb) : चिल्लाई

Pronunciation: haw·luh
Meaning: (of a person) give a loud shout or cry.
Synonyms: shout, yell, cry
Antonyms: murmur, mutter, whisper
Sentence: There's no need to holler, I'm in the next room.

8. HAGGLE (verb) : सौदेबाज़ी करना

Pronunciation: ha·gl
Meaning: dispute or bargain persistently, especially over the cost of something.
Synonyms: barter, bargain, negotiate
Antonyms: agree, concur,comply
Sentence: Ella taught her how to haggle with used furniture dealers.

9. FLOUTED (verb) : उल्लंघन

Pronunciation: flawt·uhd
Meaning: openly disregard (a rule, law, or convention).
Synonyms: defy, refuse to obey, disdain
Antonyms: accepted, approved
Sentence: The union had openly <u>flouted</u> the law.

10. PREDILECTION (noun) : लाग-लपेट

Pronunciation: pree duh lek shn
Meaning: a preference or special liking for something; a bias in favor of something.
Synonyms: liking, fondness, preference
Antonyms: apathy, dislike
Sentence: He has a predilection for fast food.
