

1. INSUPERABLE (ADJECTIVE): अजेय

Pronunciation: uhn·soo·pruh·bl

Meaning: Impossible to overcome or defeat. **Synonyms:** Unbeatable, Invincible, Indomitable

Antonyms: Surmountable, Conquerable, Overcomeable

Sentence: The challenges she faced seemed insuperable, but she never gave up and

eventually succeeded.

2. APPRENTICE (NOUN): शक्

Pronunciation: a · pren · tuhs

Meaning: a person who works for low pay, in order to learn the skills needed in a

particular job.

Synonyms: Trainee, Learner, Novice **Antonyms:** Expert, Master, Veteran

Sentence: She joined a renowned chef as an apprentice to gain practical experience in the

culinary field.

3. EDACIOUS (ADJECTIVE): भूक्खड़

Pronunciation: ih.day.shuhs

Meaning: having a huge appetite or craving for food; devouring or consuming in large

quantities.

Synonyms: Voracious, Greedy, Ravenous

Antonyms: satisfied, content, full

Sentence: The <u>edacious</u> teenager finished the entire pizza by himself in just a few minutes.

4. ALLEY (NOUN): गली

Pronunciation: a·lee

Meaning: a narrow passage or lane, usually between buildings, often used for walking.

Synonyms: Lane, Pathway, Passage

Antonyms: Open space, Boulevard, Avenue

Sentence: The children played basketball in the <u>alley</u> behind their house.

5. GARGANTUAN (ADJECTIVE): বংগাল

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Pronunciation: gaa·gan·choo·uhn

Meaning: unusually large.

Synonyms: enormous, massive, giant

Antonyms: little, mini, petite

Sentence: Of all her mistakes, this was the most gargantuan.

6. IMPASSE (NOUN): गतिरोध

Pronunciation: im·paas

Meaning: a situation where progress is blocked, and no viable solution or compromise can

be reached; a deadlock.

Synonyms: Deadlock, Standstill, Stalemate

Antonyms: Resolution, Breakthrough, Agreement

Sentence: The dispute between the two countries has resulted in an impasse, with no

resolution in sight.

7. DELINQUENCY (NOUN): अपराध

Pronunciation: duh·ling·kvuhn·see

Meaning: minor crime, especially that committed by young people or violating rules or

norms.

Synonyms: Misconduct, Offense, Transgression **Antonyms:** Compliance, Goodness, Morality

Sentence The delinquency rate among teenagers has been steadily rising in recent years.

8. STASH (VERB): छुपाकर रखना

Pronunciation: stash

Meaning: store (something) safely in a hidden or secret place.

Synonyms: Stockpile, Store, Collection **Antonyms:** Reveal, Expose, Uncover

Sentence: Lindsey uses an old shoe box to <u>stash</u> all of her photos.

9. EUPHORIA (NOUN): उत्साह

Pronunciation: yoo·faw·ree·aa

Meaning: extreme happiness, sometimes more than is reasonable in a particular situation.

Synonyms: ecstasy, elation, joy

Antonyms: depression, sadness, misery

Sentence: Winning the championship filled the team with <u>euphoria</u> and celebration.

10. EMPATHY (NOUN): सहानुभूति

Pronunciation: em·puh·thee


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Meaning: the ability to understand and share the feelings of another.

Synonyms: sympathy, sensitivity, compassion **Antonyms:** ruthlessness, mercilessness, apathy

Sentence: Doctors should develop empathy between themselves and patients.



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
