1. OFFING (noun) : आने वाला समय

2. WILLY-NILLY (adv.) : बिना सोचे समझे

Pronunciation: WILLY-NILLY

Meaning: without definite aim, direction, rule, or method Synonyms: aimlessly, desultorily, randomly Antonyms: methodically, systematically Sentence: The government was dragged <u>willy-nilly</u> into the confrontation.

3. PITTANCE (noun) : अल्प भाग

Pronunciation: pi·tns
Meaning: a very small or inadequate amount of money paid to someone as an allowance or wage.
Synonyms: very small amount, a tiny amount, an insufficient amount
Antonyms: big buck, treasure
Sentence: The internship offers only a <u>pittance</u> in salary, but it is an excellent opportunity to gain experience.

4. BOULEVARD (noun) : मार्ग

Pronunciation: boulevard **Meaning:** a wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees. **Synonyms:** avenue, street, road **Antonyms:** detour, bypass, deviation **Sentence:** They replaced the narrow streets with a wide boulevard.

5. REPENTANCE (noun) : पछतावा

Pronunciation: ruh • **pent** • uhns **Meaning:** the action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse.



Synonyms: remorse, contrition, contriteness **Antonyms:** impenitence, remorselessness **Sentence:** Confession is the first step to <u>repentance</u>.

6. LABYRINTH (noun) : भूलभुलैया

Pronunciation: la buh ruhnth
Meaning: a complicated irregular network of passages or paths in which it is difficult to find one's way; a maze.
Synonyms: maze, warren, complex network
Antonyms: ease, line, order
Sentence: We lost our way in the labyrinth of streets.

7. ASCETICISM (noun) : वैराग्य

Pronunciation: uh·seh·tuh·si·zm
Meaning: severe self-discipline and avoidance of all indulgence, typically for religious reasons.
Synonyms: austerity, self-denial, abstinence
Antonyms: kindness, lenience
Sentence: He exemplified the virtues of renunciation, <u>asceticism</u>, and restraint.

8. INCONCEIVABLE (adj.) : समझ से बाहर

Pronunciation: in·kuhn·seev·uh·bl
Meaning: not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable.
Synonyms: beyond belief, unbelievable, extremely difficult to believe
Antonyms: believable, cogitable, conceivable
Sentence: She found the idea quite inconceivable.

9. REDACT (verb) : संपादन करना

Pronunciation: ruh·dakt Meaning: edit (text) for publication. Synonyms: redraft, revamp, revise Antonyms: add, allow, endorse Sentence: You can redact a word simply by selecting it with your mouse cursor.

10. FINAGLE (verb) : छल से प्राप्त करना

Pronunciation: fuh·**nay**·gl **Meaning:** achieve something, by means of trickery or devious methods **Synonyms:** wangle, manage, contrive **Antonyms:** disorganize, disorganize, refrain



Sentence: He <u>finagled</u> the wedding by claiming he was a photographer.
