1. CLINCHES (NOUN):कड़ी

Pronunciation: klinch·uhz

Meaning: the decisive or final moves, actions, or factors that secure a victory, success, or

resolution of a situation. **Synonyms:** Confirms **Antonyms:** Fails, Misses

Sentence: His last.minute goal in the championship match clinches the victory for the team

and secures their place in the finals.

2. COMPLICITY (NOUN): सहापराध

Pronunciation: kuhm·pli·suh·tee

Meaning: the state of being involved in a wrongful act or illegal activity as an accomplice

or partner.

Synonyms: Conspiracy, Connivance **Antonyms:** Ignorance, Innocence

Sentence: The investigation revealed that several high ranking officials were in complicity

with the organized crime syndicate, leading to their arrests and subsequent trials.

3. MULLING (VERB): विचार करना

Pronunciation: muh·luhng

Meaning: the act of deep and careful thought or consideration.

Synonyms: Ruminating, Meditating **Antonyms:** Rushing, Neglecting

Sentence: After receiving the job offer, she spent the weekend mulling over whether

to accept it, considering all the pros and cons carefully.

4. HOAX (NOUN): छल

Pronunciation: hokes

Meaning: a deceptive or misleading act or scheme intended to trick, deceive, or fool people into believing something false or untrue.

Synonyms: Deception, fraud, trick

Antonyms: Truth, authenticity, sincerity

Sentence: Noun: The email claiming that you won a million dollars from a lottery you

never entered turned out to be a hoax.



Verb: He attempted to hoax his friends by pretending to be a famous celebrity on social media.

5. BURNISH (VERB): पालिश

Pronunciation: buh nuhsh

Meaning: to polish, shine, or make something smooth and shiny, typically by rubbing or

buffing it.

Synonyms: Buff, Smooth **Antonyms:** Corrode, Rust

Sentence: The marketing team worked hard to burnish the company's image inthe eyes of

the public.

6. REPOSITORIES (NOUN): खजाने

Pronunciation: ruh·paw·zuh·tuh·reez

Meaning: to store and organize a collection of items, such as data, documents, or objects,

in a systematic manner.

Synonyms: Vaults, Collections **Antonyms:** Ejectors, Dispensers

Sentence: Government archives are important repositories of historical records and

officialdocuments.

7. SCION (NOUN): वंशज

Pronunciation: sai·uhn

Meaning: a descendant or heir, especially a young one who is expected to continue afamily's legacy, often in terms of wealth, status, or a particular tradition or business.

Synonyms: Inheritor, Progeny **Antonyms:** Forbear, Ancestor

Sentence: She was the scion of a long line of artists and had a natural talent for painting.

8. SABOTAGE (VERB): तोड.फोड

Pronunciation: sa·buh·taazh

Meaning: to deliberately destroy, damage, or disrupt something, such as a plan, project,

relationship, or process, often for malicious or self serving reasons.

Synonyms: Subvert, Wreck **Antonyms:** Assist, Foster

Sentence: She feared that revealing her secret plans would lead someone to try to sabotage

her ambitions.

9. INTRICATE (ADJECTIVE): जटिल



Pronunciation: in truh kuht

Meaning: very complicated, detailed, or complex in structure or design.

Synonyms: Complex, Intricacy

Antonyms: Simple, Basic

Sentence: The intricate patterns in the stained glass windows of the cathedral were a

testament to the skill and craftsmanship of the artisans who created them.

10. BENIGN (ADJECTIVE): सौम्य

Pronunciation: buh nine

Meaning: a something that is not harmful, threatening, or malignant.

Synonyms: Benevolent, Harmless **Antonyms:** Malicious, Hostile

Sentence: The doctor assured the patient that the tumour was benign and could be easily

removed without posing any serious health risks.

11. STAMPEDE (NOUN): भगदड़

Pronunciation: stam·peed

Meaning: a situation where a large group of frightened animals, esp. horses or cattle.

Synonyms: Panic, Scattering

Sentence: The crowd stampeded and many were crushed or trampled underfoot.

12. CONVERGENCE (NOUN): संमिलन

Pronunciation: kuhn·vuh·jns

Meaning: the meeting or merging of things that were previously separate or

distinct, resulting in a shared focus.

Synonyms: Conflux, Junction **Antonyms:** Dispersal, Deviation

Sentence: The convergence of various cultures at the international festival showcased the

beauty of diversity.

13. DENOVO (ADJECTIVE AND ADVERB): नए सिरे से या श्रूस

Pronunciation: de no·vo

Meaning: starting over or from the beginning.

Synonyms: Anew, Again

Antonyms: Incessantly, Persistently

Sentence: The research team took a Denovo approach to solving the problem, breaking

away from traditional methods.

The legal team decided to present the case of Denovo to ensure a fair trial for the

defendant.

14. HETEROGENEITY (NOUN): विजातिता

Pronunciation: heh·troh·jeh·ni·tee

Meaning: the presence of various distinct elements, differences, or variations within a

larger whole.

Synonyms: Assortment, Mixture **Antonyms:** Conformity, Uniformity

Sentence: The economic challenges faced by the region were exacerbated by

the heterogeneity of industries and income levels.

15. DRUDGERY (NOUN): कठिन परिश्रम

Pronunciation: druhj·uh·ree

Meaning: dull, repetitive, or menial tasks that are often considered tedious

and uninteresting.

Synonyms: Tedium, Routine **Antonyms:** Variety, Stimulation

Sentence: The endless drudgery of commuting took a toll on his overall well being.

16. SHUDDERING (VERB): कांपना, थरथराना

Pronunciation: shuh·duh·ruhng

Meaning: a sudden and brief convulsive movement.

Synonyms: Tremors, quivering **Antonyms:** Composure, Steadiness

Sentence: The artist intentionally incorporated dissonance into his artwork to evoke a

sense of unease and contemplation.

17. EXORBITANT (ADJECTIVE): अत्यधिक

Pronunciation: uhg·zaw·buh·tnt

Meaning: unreasonably high or excessive, especially in terms of price, cost, or demand.

Synonyms: Extravagant, Inflated **Antonyms:** Sensible, Moderate

Sentence: She was shocked by the exorbitant fees charged by the designer for a custom

made gown.

18. FURORE (NOUN): हंगामा

Pronunciation: fyoo·raw·ree

Meaning: a state of intense excitement, anger, or controversy.

Synonyms: Outrage, Uproar

Antonyms: Calmness



Sentence: The sudden increase in prices of essential goods led to a furore among the consumers, prompting calls for government intervention.

19. VEXATIOUS (ADJECTIVE): अफ़सोसनाक

Pronunciation: veks·av·shuhs

Meaning: causing annoyance, frustration, or distress, often persistently or repeatedly.

Synonyms: Annoying, Irritating

Antonyms: Pleasant

Sentence: Dealing with the faulty internet connection on a daily basis was a vexatious

issue for the remote workers.

20. EXPULSION (NOUN): निष्कासन

Pronunciation: uhk·spuhl·zhn

Meaning: the act of forcing someone to leave a place, organization, or group, often as

a disciplinary action.

Synonyms: Ejection, Eviction

Antonyms: Admission

Sentence: The company announced the expulsion of the employee who was found guilty

of leaking confidential information.

21. AMNESTY (Noun): क्षमादान

Pronunciation: am·nuh·stee

Meaning: an official pardon for people who have been convicted of political offences.

Synonyms: Pardon, forgiveness **Antonyms:** Punishment, penalty

Sentence: "After being caught, the prisoner sought amnesty for his crimes, hoping for a

chance to start a new life."

22. PONDEROUS (Adjective): भारी भरकम

Pronunciation: pawn·duh·ruhs

Meaning: slow and clumsy because of great weight.

Synonyms: Heavy, weighty **Antonyms:** Light, agile, nimble

Sentence: "The elephant moved with a ponderous gait, its massive body commanding

attention and respect."

23. GORGE (Noun and Verb): घाटी, जीभ भर कर खाना

Pronunciation: gawj



Meaning: a narrow valley between hills or mountains, typically with steep rocky walls and

a stream running through it.

Synonyms: eat heartily, consume **Antonyms:** Abstain, fast, starve

Sentence: "After a day of fasting, he gorged on a hearty meal, relishing every bite."

24. Abeyance (Noun): स्थगित

Pronunciation: uh·bay·uhns

Meaning: temporary suspension or cessation of activity or condition.

Synonyms: Suspension, Dormancy, Inactivity **Antonyms:** Continuation, Resumption, Activity

Sentence: The project is currently in abeyance due to funding issues, but it isexpected to

resume once the financial situation improves.

25. EXTANT (ADJECTIVE): वर्तमान में मौजूद

Pronunciation: ek·stant

Meaning: still in existence; surviving.

Synonyms: existing, Surviving, Remaining, Enduring, Persistent

Antonyms: extinct, Nonexistent, Lost, Defunct, Obsolete

Sentence: The manuscript is one of the few extant copies of the ancient text.

26. MEAGRE (ADJECTIVE): कम, थोड़ा

Pronunciation: mea·ger

Meaning: lacking in quantity or quality; inadequate; small in amount.

Synonyms: scanty, Sparse, Inadequate, Insufficient, Paltry **Antonyms:** abundant, Plentiful, Ample, Generous, Lavish

Sentence: Despite working hard, his salary remained meagre and he struggled to make

ends meet.

27. MENACE (NOUN): खतरा

Pronunciation: meh·nuhs

Meaning: a person or thing that is likely to cause harm; a threat or danger.

Synonyms: danger, threat, peril, risk **Antonyms:** safety, protection, security

Sentence: Drunk drivers are a menace to everyone.

28. PICKLE (NOUN): कठिन स्थिति

Pronunciation: pi·kl

Meaning: a difficult situation; a troublesome or awkward state of affairs.



Synonyms: predicament, dilemma, quandary

Antonyms: solution, ease, simplicity

Sentence: The student found himself in a pickle hen he was caught cheating in the

examination.

29. PROLIX (ADJECTIVE): अतिविस्तृत

Pronunciation: proh·luhks

Meaning: (of speech or writing) using or containing too many words; tediously lengthy.

Synonyms: lengthy, long-winded, verbose

Antonyms: concise, compact, brief

Sentence: The author's prolix style has done nothing to encourage sales of the book.

30. CONSTERNATION (NOUN): चिंता

Pronunciation: kawn·stuh·nay·shn

Meaning: feelings of anxiety or dismay, typically at something unexpected.

Synonyms: dismay, perturbation, anxiety **Antonyms:** comfort, consolation, relief

Sentence: The government's plans have caused considerable consternation among many

Americans.

31. EMASCULATED (VERB): शक्तिहीन करना

Pronunciation: uh·ma·skyoo·layt·uhd

Meaning: the act of making someone feel less confident or less like a man

Synonyms: Weaken, Castrate **Antonyms:** Vitalize, Assert

Sentence: The constant belittling and criticism from his supervisor left John

feeling emasculated and undermined in his role at work, causing him to lose confidence in

his abilities.

32. SYNAGOGUE (NOUN): यह्दी मंदिर

Pronunciation: sin.uh.gog

Meaning: a building or place where Jewish people gather for religious services, prayer,

and community activities. **Synonyms:** Temple, Shul

Sentence: The local synagogue is the heart of the Jewish community, where People come

together to celebrate religious festivals, study the Torah, and offer prayers.

33. ABERRATION (NOUN): पतन

Pronunciation: a·buh·ray·shn

Meaning: a deviation from a moral or ethical standard.

Synonyms: Anomaly, Oddity

Antonyms: Consistency, Standard

Sentence: The sudden spike in temperature during the middle of winter was an aberration

that surprised everyone in the town, as winters there are usually quite cold.

34. STEWARDSHIP (NOUN): परिचारक का पद

Pronunciation: styoo·uhd·shuhp

Meaning: the responsible and ethical management, care, and protection of something that

has been entrusted to one's care. **Synonyms:** Custodian, Oversight **Antonyms:** Squander, Abandonment

Sentence: She took her role as the team captain with great stewardship, always looking out

for the well being and development of her teammates.

35. ADAMANT (NOUN AND ADJECTIVE): अटल

Pronunciation: a·duh·muhnt

Meaning: an imaginary hard substance that is believed to be unbreakable.

Adjective: to be persuaded or to change one's mind.

Synonyms: Resolute, Stubborn **Antonyms:** Pliable, Willing

Sentence: She was adamant about her decision to resign from her job, despite

her colleagues' efforts to convince her to stay.

36. SHODDY (NOUN AND ADJECTIVE): तुच्छ

Pronunciation: shaw·dee

Meaning: Something of low quality or inferior workmanship. **Adjective:** poor quality, cheaply made, or badly constructed.

Synonyms: Inferior, Cheap **Antonyms:** Superior, Excellent

Sentence: The shoddy craftsmanship of the furniture became apparent when it started

falling apart after just a few months of use.

37. RESCINDED (VERB): रद्द कर दिया

Pronunciation: ruh·sind·uhd

Meaning: to revoke, cancel, or annul a decision, order, or agreement.

Synonyms: repeal, withdraw

Antonyms: Enact, implement, establish

Sentence: The company rescinded its previous decision to lay off employees.



38. EX PARTE (ADVERBIAL PHRASE): कानूनी कार्यवाही

Pronunciation: eks paa·tee

Meaning: used in the context of legal motions, hearings or orders

Synonyms: One sidedly **Antonyms:** Mutually

Sentence: In a surprise move, the judge granted an exparte injunction without hearing

from the opposing counsel.

39. SCRAMBLE (VERB): संघर्ष

Pronunciation: skram·bld

Meaning: to move or climb quickly and with difficulty, often in a disorderly or hasty

manner.

Synonyms: Scuttle, Clamber **Antonyms:** Neaten, Systemize

Sentence: When the alarm sounded, the pilots had to scramble to their planes and take off

immediately.

40. STIMULUS (NOUN): प्रोत्साहन

Pronunciation: sti·myoo·luhs

Meaning: something that excites or arouses activity or energy in a person.

Synonyms: Trigger, Impetus **Antonyms:** Hindrance, Inhibition

Sentence: The government introduced a financial stimulus package to boost the economy

during the recession.
