1.HARROWING (adj.): शोकजनक

Pronunciation: ha·roh·uhng **Meaning:** acutely distressing.

Synonyms: agonizing, excruciating, racking **Antonyms:** gratifying, pleasing, acceptable

Sentence: There was a harrowing portrayal of the ravages of war.

2.WONT (noun) : स्वभाव

Pronunciation: vonet

Meaning: a usual manner of behaving or doing **Synonyms:** habit, habitude, second nature **Antonyms:** unlikely, unwonted, unaccustomed

Sentence: He got up early, as is his wont.

3.MINATORY (adj.): धमकी

Pronunciation: *minatory*

Meaning: expressing or conveying a threat. **Synonyms:** menacing, threatening, baleful **Antonyms:** unthreatening, propitious

Sentence: The novel's protagonist is haunted by a <u>minatory</u> black spectre.

4.VIE (verb) : स्पर्धा करना

Pronunciation: *vie*

Meaning: compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something.

Synonyms: compete, contend, contest

Antonyms: agree, aid, assist

Sentence: Several political parties <u>vie</u> with each other in pulling more votes for

themselves.

5.SNUGLY (adv.) : आराम से

Pronunciation: snuhg-lee

Meaning: in a comfortable, warm, and cozy or well-protected manner.

Synonyms: comfortable, comfy, cozy

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Antonyms: uncomfortable, troubled

Sentence: I left the children tucked up <u>snugly</u> in bed.

6.PRIM (adj.) : नैतिक

Pronunciation: prim

Meaning: stiffly formal and respectable; feeling or showing disapproval of anything

regarded as improper.

Synonyms: puritanical, proper, moral

Antonyms: permissive, improper, indecent

Sentence: A very <u>prim</u> and proper matron was in charge of the girls' dorm.

7.VAUNT (verb) : अपनी बड़ाई करना

Pronunciation: vawnt.uhd

Meaning: boast about or praise (something), especially excessively.

Synonyms: boast, brag, pride **Antonyms:** belittle, underrate

Sentence: Even the noblest of fellows have been known to vaunt a bit.

8.HALE AND HEARTY (adj.) : चुस्त और तंदुरुस्त

Pronunciation: hayl uhnd haa.tee

Meaning: (of a person, especially an elderly one) strong and healthy.

Synonyms: healthy, well, fit **Antonyms:** ill, feeble, sick

Sentence: She was still <u>hale and hearty</u> in her nineties.

9.TRAMMEL (noun) : प्रतिबंध

Pronunciation: tra·muhl

Meaning: a restriction or impediment to someone's freedom of action.

Synonyms: restraint, obstacle, barrier

Antonyms: freedom, latitude

Sentence: We will forge our own future, free from the <u>trammels</u> of materialism.

10.IFFY (adj.): अनिश्चितता

Pronunciation: if ·ee

Meaning: full of uncertainty; doubtful.


Synonyms: doubtful, undecided, questionable

Antonyms: sure, convinced, certain

Sentence: Simon's still kind of <u>iffy</u> about going to Columbia.

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
