




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Some exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. Go through these words and read their usages to learn how to use them in sentences. This will really help you boost up your learning.

1. CAVERNOUS (adjective) - कंदरायुक्त, गुफा सा

Pronunciation: kavunus

Meaning: giving the impression of vast, dark depths

Synonyms: vast, huge, large, immense

Antonyms: small, poky

Usage: My main reason for buying the house was the cavernous garage, a space so vast that it can hold three cars and all of my

fishing stuff.

2. OPPROBRIUM (noun) – अपमान, निरादर

Pronunciation: upro-bri-um

Meaning: harsh criticism; public disgrace arising from shameful conduct

Synonyms: vilification, abuse, vituperation, condemnation, criticism; disgrace, shame, dishonour

Antonyms: praise; honour

Usage: That drunkard was the opprobrium of our society.

3. AMITY (noun) – मेल-जोल, मित्रता

Pronunciation: amiti **Meaning:** friendly relations

Synonyms: friendship, friendliness, peace, harmony

Antonyms: animosity, enmity

Usage: He lives in <u>amity</u> with his neighbours.

4. PUTRESCENT (adjective) – सड़ता हआ

Pronunciation: pyoo-tres(u)nt

Meaning: undergoing the process of decay

Synonyms: decaying, rotting, putrefying, decomposing, festering **Usage:** The odour of <u>putrescent</u> flesh was really disturbing.

5. IRIDESCENT (adjective) - रंग-बिरंग, चमकीला

Pronunciation: iri-desunt

Meaning: showing luminous colours that seem to change when seen from different angles **Synonyms:** shimmering, shimmery, glittering, sparkling, coruscating, dazzling, shining, gleaming

Usage: The singer's iridescent necklace glowed brightly under the spotlight.

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6. PROBITY (noun) - सत्यनिष्ठा, ईमानदारी

Pronunciation: pro-biti

Meaning: the quality of having strong moral principles; honesty and decency **Synonyms:** integrity, honesty, uprightness, decency, morality, rectitude

Antonym: untrustworthiness

Usage: Her probity and integrity are beyond question.

7. AVERSION (noun) - घृणा, दवेष

Pronunciation: uvuh-shun

Meaning: a strong dislike or disinclination

Synonyms: abhorrence, hatred, hate, loathing, detestation, odium, antipathy, hostility

Antonyms: liking, inclination, desire **Usage:** She has an <u>aversion</u> to pets.

8. NATTER (verb) - गपशप करना

Pronunciation: natuh

Meaning: talk casually, especially on unimportant matters

Synonyms: chat, chatter, prattle, prate, gossip **Usage:** We had a long <u>natter</u> over coffee.

9. HULKING (adjective) - भीमकाय

Pronunciation: hulk-ing

Meaning: (of a person or object) very large, heavy, or clumsy **Synonyms:** large, big, heavy, heavily built, well built

Antonyms: light, small

Usage: We were stopped by two hulking security guards.

10. ARMISTICE (noun) – युद्ध-विराम

Pronunciation: aa-mis-tis

Meaning: an agreement made by opposing sides in a war to stop fighting for a certain time

Synonyms: truce, ceasefire, break, respite, lull

Antonym: hostilities

Usage: The two nations signed an armistice.



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
