2. Rajasthan launched the 'Mukhyamantri Khet Suraksha Yojana'

The 'Mukhyamantri Khet Suraksha Yojana' was launched by the Rajasthan government to protect farmers' crops from damage caused by stray and wild animals. Under this scheme, farmers receive financial assistance to install solarpowered electric fencing around their fields, which delivers a mild, non-harmful shock to deter animals without causing



injury. The government provides a subsidy covering 60% of the installation cost, up to 1.43 lakh per hectare, making it accessible to small and marginal farmers. This initiative aims to reduce crop losses, enhance agricultural productivity, and improve the livelihoods of farmers across the state..

Foot notes:

- **Financial Assistance**: Small and marginal farmers in Uttar Pradesh are eligible for a grant of 1.43 lakh per hectare, covering 60% of the total cost.
- **Eligibility**: The scheme is open to all small and marginal farmers in Uttar Pradesh, provided they are residents of the state and have land in their name.
- **Required Documents**: To apply, farmers will need to submit documents such as their Aadhaar card, residence certificate, income certificate, land documents, and bank account details linked to their Aadhaar.
- **Implementation**: The scheme is expected to be implemented across Uttar Pradesh, with a proposed budget of 350 crore.

3. Anjali Singh made history as the first Indian-origin woman Speaker in NZ Parliament

Anjali Singh has made history by becoming the first woman of Indian origin to be elected as Speaker of the New Zealand Parliament. Her appointment marks a significant milestone in New Zealand's political landscape, highlighting the growing





representation of the Indian diaspora in the country's governance. Singh's leadership is expected to bring a fresh perspective to parliamentary proceedings, fostering inclusivity and diversity. Her rise to this prominent position reflects the increasing participation of women and minorities in politics, setting a precedent for future generations.

4. Indian Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa Won Superbet Chess Classic In Romania

Indian Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa achieved a significant milestone by winning the Superbet Chess Classic Romania 2025, marking his first Grand Chess Tour (GCT) title. The 19-year-old prodigy tied for first place with Maxime Vachier-Lagrave and Alireza Firouzja, each scoring 5.5 points out of 9 rounds, leading to a three-way blitz playoff. Praggnanandhaa secured a draw against



Firouzja and then defeated Vachier-Lagrave, clinching the championship in Bucharest. This victory earned him \$77,667 and 10 GCT points, elevating his total to 18 points for the season. It also marked his second major triumph of the year, following his win at the Tata Steel Masters in January.

Foot notes:



- **Tournament Performance**: Praggnanandhaa scored 5.5 points out of nine in the classical rounds, tying with Vachier-Lagrave and Firouzja. He then won the blitz playoffs, defeating Vachier-Lagrave in the final game.
- Youngest Grandmaster: Praggnanandhaa is one of the youngest players to achieve the Grandmaster title. At 19 years old, he has already secured two major titles this year, including the Tata Steel Masters in January.

5. Neeraj Chopra Breaks 90m Mark at Doha Diamond League Men's Javelin Throw Event

At the 2025 Doha Diamond League, Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra achieved a historic milestone by surpassing the 90-meter mark for the first time in his career. His throw of 90.23 meters not only set a new personal best but also established a national record for India. Despite this remarkable feat, Chopra secured second place, as Germany's Julian Weber



clinched the top spot with a throw of 91.06 meters. Chopra's achievement places him among an elite group of javelin throwers worldwide who have crossed the 90-meter threshold, highlighting his status as one of the sport's leading athletes.

Foot notes:

- **Personal Best**: Chopra's throw of 90.23m was a significant improvement from his previous season's best of 84.52m, showcasing his growing prowess in the sport.
- **New Coach**: Neeraj credits his new coach, Czech legend Jan Zelezny, for playing a key role in his milestone achievement. The duo began working together in February 2025.
- **Social Media Pressure**: Chopra has spoken about the pressure he faces on social media, particularly after inviting Pakistani athlete Arshad Nadeem to the Neeraj Chopra Classic. He emphasized that he focuses on his work and doesn't let negative comments affect him.



• **Patriotism**: Neeraj prioritizes his country's interests, as evident from his response to criticism over Arshad Nadeem's invitation. He stated that his country's interests will always come first, and he was hurt by the hate and abuse he and his family received online.

6. Prashant Kumar appointed as new Director of the CBI

Prashant Kumar has been appointed as the new Director General of Police (DGP) of Uttar Pradesh. A 1990-batch Indian Police Service (IPS) officer, he has previously served as the acting DGP of the state and has a distinguished career marked by four President's Gallantry Medals. His leadership has been instrumental in addressing law and order challenges, including handling the Kheri



violence in 2021. With his extensive experience and proven track record, Kumar's appointment is expected to bring stability and effective policing to Uttar Pradesh. The state government anticipates that his tenure will enhance the efficiency and responsiveness of the police force.

Foot notes:

- **Experience**: Kumar has over three decades of experience in various important posts, including Additional DG, Law and Order, and Additional DG of Meerut zone. He has successfully led operations against criminals and has a notable track record with four President's Gallantry Medals.
- **Background**: Prashant Kumar hails from Bihar's Siwan district and was initially allotted to the Tamil Nadu cadre before getting a transfer to Uttar Pradesh in 1994 due to personal reasons.



7. A.K. Singh appointed as the new Chairperson of the Cauvery Water Management Authority



A.K. Singh has been appointed as the new Chairperson of the Cauvery Water Management Authority (CWMA). This appointment follows the Supreme Court's directive for the establishment of a full-time leadership for the CWMA to ensure effective implementation of the Cauvery Water Disputes Tribunal's award. A.K. Singh, an experienced civil servant, brings a wealth of expertise in water resource management and inter-state coordination. The CWMA,



under his guidance, aims to enhance transparency, strengthen monitoring mechanisms, and foster collaborative efforts to resolve ongoing water-sharing issues.

Foot notes:

- **Establishment**: The CWMA was constituted in June 2018, following a Supreme Court directive, to address the Cauvery water sharing dispute among Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and Puducherry.
- **Composition**: The authority comprises a chairman, a secretary, and eight members, with two full-time and two part-time members from the center's side, and four part-time members from the states.
- **Function**: The main mandate of the CWMA is to secure implementation and compliance of the Supreme Court's order regarding storage, apportionment, regulation, and control of Cauvery waters.
- Role of Central Government: The central government provides help in implementing the modified award if any state or UT party doesn't cooperate, and initially contributed Rs. 2 crore for the authority's functioning.

8. Antonio Guterres received the UNESCO Peace Prize 2025

António Guterres, the United Nations Secretary-General, has been honored with the 2025 Félix Houphouët-Boigny – UNESCO Peace recognizes prestigious award his Prize. This unwavering dialogue, commitment to multilateralism, and sustainable development. Guterres' leadership has been instrumental addressing global challenges such as climate change, humanitarian crises, and the promotion of peace and security. The award ceremony took place on February 24, 2025, in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire,



underscoring his significant contributions to fostering a culture of peace worldwide. This accolade not only celebrates his achievements but also reaffirms the importance of collaborative efforts in achieving lasting global peace.

• Role as Secretary-General: Guterres has been serving as the UN Secretary-General since 2017, working to maintain international peace and security,



- protect human rights, deliver humanitarian aid, promote sustainable development, and uphold international law.

9. Sanjay Khare appointed as the new Chief Vigilance Commissioner of India

Sanjay Khare has been appointed as the new Chief Vigilance Commissioner (CVC) of India, succeeding Praveen Kumar Srivastava. His appointment was confirmed by the President of India following a recommendation from the high-powered selection committee, which includes the Prime Minister, the Home Minister, and the Leader of the



Opposition in the Lok Sabha. Khare, a retired 1984-batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer from the Uttar Pradesh cadre, brings over three decades of experience in public administration to the role. His tenure is expected to focus on strengthening the integrity of governmental processes and enhancing public trust in administrative systems.

- **Background**: Kothari is a retired 1978-batch IAS officer of the Haryana cadre, with experience serving as Secretary to President Ram Nath Kovind and chief of the Public Enterprises Selection Board (PESB).
- **Tenure**: The CVC chief serves a four-year term or until attaining the age of 65. Kothari's appointment was met with opposition from the Congress, which questioned the selection process.
- Role and Responsibilities: As CVC, Kothari oversees vigilance activities in the Central government, advises authorities on planning and reforming vigilance work, and refers corruption cases to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).
- **Autonomy**: The CVC is an autonomous body, free from executive control, ensuring impartiality in its functions and decision-making processes.

10. World Telecommunication and Information Society Day' observed on 17th May



World Telecommunication and Information Society Day is observed on 17 May every year to raise awareness about the importance of communication and information technologies. This day marks the founding of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the signing of the first International Telegraph Convention in 1865.
