




DAILY VOCAB DOSE

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Exceptional words of English vocabulary from the newspaper 'The Hindu' are listed here. 1. SHREDDED (adj.): कटा

Pronunciation: shred·uhd

Meaning: torn or cut into shreds. **Synonyms:** tear, cut, reduce

Antonyms: mend, sew

Sentence: She ran, crying out as glass shredded her feet.

2. CLAMOR (noun) : कोलाहल

Pronunciation: clam.or

Meaning: a loud and confused noise, especially that of people shouting vehemently.

Synonyms: babel, uproar, loud noise

Antonyms: quiet, silence, calm

Sentence: There was a <u>clamor</u> of voices outside the office.

3. CONSTRUE (verb) : टीका करना

Pronunciation: kuhn·stroo

Meaning: interpret (a word or action) in a particular way.

Synonyms: interpret, understand, read **Antonyms:** obscure, confuse, befog

Sentence: His words could hardly be <u>construed</u> as an apology.

4. DIDACTIC (adj.) : शिक्षाप्रद

Pronunciation: duh·dak·tuhk

Meaning: intended to teach, particularly in having moral instruction as an ulterior motive.

Synonyms: instructive, instructional, educational **Antonyms:** erroneous, pernicious, misleading

Sentence: A <u>didactic</u> novel that set out to expose social injustice.

5. FATUOUS (adj.) : बुद्धिहीन

Pronunciation: fa·choo·uhs
Meaning: silly and pointless.
Synonyms: silly, foolish, stupid
Antonyms: brainy, prudent, sapient

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Sentence: The Chief was left speechless by this <u>fatuous</u> remark.

6. PEJORATIVE (adj.) : अपमानजनक

Pronunciation: puh·jaw·ruh·tuhv

Meaning: expressing contempt or disapproval. **Synonyms:** disparaging, derogatory, denigratory

Antonyms: commendatory, complimentary, laudative

Sentence: Permissiveness is used almost universally as a <u>pejorative</u> term

7. VOCIFEROUS (adj.) : म्खर

Pronunciation: vo·cif·er·ous

Meaning: (especially of a person or speech) vehement or clamorous.

Synonyms: vehement, outspoken, vocal

Antonyms: noiseless, quiet, silent

Sentence: He was a <u>vociferous</u> opponent of Conservatism.

8. DIRGE (noun) : शोकगीत

Pronunciation: duhj

Meaning: a lament for the dead, especially one forming part of a funeral rite.

Synonyms: elegy, lament, funeral song **Antonyms:** encomium, eulogy, paean

Sentence: Their song, or their dirge, remained unsung, or at any rate unheard.

9. GOURMAND (noun) : चटोरा

Pronunciation: gour · mand

Meaning: a person who enjoys eating and often eats too much.

Synonyms: glutton, gourmandizer, overeater

Antonyms: dieter, nibbler, picker

Sentence: I think a gourmand is someone who eats an excessive amount of food.

10. BEGUILE (verb) : मोहना

Pronunciation: buh gile


Meaning: charm or enchant (someone), sometimes in a deceptive way.

Synonyms: charm, attract, enchant **Antonyms:** expose, undeceive, reveal

Sentence: The teacher used to <u>beguile</u> her pupils with fairy tales.

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
