


1. INCULCATE (verb) : मन में बैठाना

Pronunciation: in·kuhl·kayt

Meaning: instill (an attitude, idea, or habit) by persistent instruction.

Synonyms: instill, implant, imbue

Antonyms: deprive, clear, empty

Sentence: Not all schools manage to successfully inculcate a love of learning.

2. INIMICAL (adj.) : विरोधी

Pronunciation: uh·ni·muh·kl

Meaning: tending to obstruct or harm.

Synonyms: adversarial, adversary, antagonistic

Antonyms: friendly, hospitable, nonantagonistic

Sentence: These policies are inimical to the interests of society.

3. ACCRETION (noun) : एक साथ वृद्धि

Pronunciation: uh·kree·shn

Meaning: the process of growth or increase, typically by the gradual accumulation of additional layers or matter.

Synonyms: accrual, boost, addition

Antonyms: abatement, decline, decrease

Sentence: The fund was increased by the accretion of new shareholders.

4. PIDDLING (adj.) : तुच्छ

Pronunciation: pi·duhl·uhng

Meaning: pathetically trivial; trifling.

Synonyms: trivial, trifling, petty

Antonyms: consequential, considerable, important

Sentence: I don't want to hear all the piddling little details!

5. GENIALITY (adj.) : नेकी

Pronunciation: jee·nee·al·uh·tee

Meaning: the quality of having a friendly and cheerful manner.

Synonyms: friendliness, affability, cordiality

Antonyms: impoliteness, incivility, rudeness

Sentence: His geniality, reliability, and ability made him a popular figure.

6. HORRENDOUS (adj.) : खराब

Pronunciation: huh·ren·duhs

Meaning: extremely unpleasant, horrifying or terrible.

Synonyms: direful, dreadful, fearful

Antonyms: calming, comforting, consoling

Sentence: He described it as the most horrendous experience of his life.

7. IMMURED (verb) : कैद करना

Pronunciation: uh·myawd

Meaning: enclose or confine (someone) against their will.

Synonyms: caged, imprisoned, enclosed

Antonyms: free, loose, unbound

Sentence: He was immured in a dark room.

8. BICKER (verb) : झगड़ना

Pronunciation: bi·kuh

Meaning: argue about petty and trivial matters.

Synonyms: squabble, argue, quarrel

Antonyms: accept, agree, assent

Sentence: I wish you two would stop bickering.

9. DEPORTATION (noun) : निर्वासन

Pronunciation: dee·pawt·ay·shn

Meaning: the action of deporting a foreigner from a country.

Synonyms: expulsion, expelling, banishment

Antonyms: repatriation, return, immigration

Sentence: Several asylum seekers now face deportation.

10. RUBRIC (noun) : शीर्ष

Pronunciation: roo·bruhk

Meaning: a word or series of words often in larger letters placed at the beginning of a passage or at the top of a page in order to introduce or categorize

Synonyms: caption, head, header


Antonyms: unimportance, roughness

Sentence: The rubrics at the beginning of the chapters are intended to be humorous.

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
