

1. M. Rajeshwar Rao Reappointed as RBI Deputy Governor

The Central Government has re-appointed M Rajeshwar Rao as Deputy Governor of the Reserve Bank of India for one year, effective October 9, 2024, or until further notice. Rao initially took on the role in September 2020 for three years and received a one-year extension in 2023. He joined the Reserve Bank in 1984 and has extensive experience in various aspects of central banking.

2. Dipa Karmakar, India's trailblazing gymnast officially announced her retirement

Indian gymnast Dipa Karmakar has officially retired from professional competition after 25 years in the sport. She stepped back due to the physical demands on her body. Dipa is a celebrated figure in gymnastics, having made history as the first Indian woman to win a bronze medal in vault at the 2014 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow, followed by another bronze at the 2015 Asian Championships. **Foot notes:**





- Dipa Karmakar achieved a landmark feat at the 2016 Rio Olympics by becoming the first Indian female gymnast to qualify for the final vault event, finishing in fourth place.
- In 2021, she showcased resilience by winning a gold medal at the Asian Gymnastics Championships in Tashkent, despite career setbacks.
- Dipa has received numerous prestigious awards, including the Padma Shri, Arjuna Award, and Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award.
- He will now focus on mentoring and supporting young athletes, ensuring her legacy continues to shape Indian gymnastics for years to come.

3. Sarthak clinches his maiden National crown

Pune's Sarthak Chavan, 17, made history by becoming the youngest to win the Open class title in the MRF MMSC FMSCI Indian National Motorcycle Racing Championship. He secured the crown with his eighth win in nine races at the Madras International Circuit, ensuring an unassailable lead in the points tally.

Foot notes:

- 17-year-old Sarthak Chavan became the youngest champion in the Pro-Stock 301-400cc category with his eighth win of the season.
- He tactically followed teammate Chiranth Vishwanath before overtaking on the final lap.
- Sarthak's win gave him a 57-point lead, securing the title with one race remaining.
- Veteran Rajini Krishnan finished third, adding to his impressive career podiums.

4. Coco Gauff won China Open Tennis Tournament title

Coco Gauff clinched victory in the 2024 China Open final, defeating Czech player Karolina Muchová 6-1, 6-3 in just 76 minutes. At 20 years old, the sixth-ranked American and last year's US Open champion became the youngest China Open champion in 14 years and the second American to win the tournament, following Serena Williams. She has now won eight singles titles in her career, with an impressive 8-1 record in finals and a perfect 7-0 record in hard-court finals in the Open era.

- Coco Gauff hit 24 winners in a dominant performance to win the Beijing trophy.
- This victory adds to her Auckland Classic win earlier this year.
- Gauff has now secured her second WTA 1000 title, following her 2023 Cincinnati victory, where she also defeated Muchová in the final.

6. Nestle India Appoints Manish Tiwari as New MD

Nestle India has announced that Manish Tiwary, former country manager of Amazon India, will take over as Managing Director from August 1, 2025, following the retirement of current MD and Chairman Suresh Narayanan on July 31, 2025. Narayanan will step down after 26 years with the company. The appointments were nominated by Nestle SA, the Swiss parent company.

7. Ajit Vinayak Gupte appointed as India's Ambassador to Germany

Ajit Vinayak Gupte, currently India's Ambassador to Egypt, has been appointed as the next Ambassador to Germany, the Ministry of External Affairs announced. A 1991 batch







IFS officer, Gupte previously served as Ambassador to Denmark from November 2017 to March 2021. He will assume the new role soon. **Foot notes:**

- Ajit Vinayak Gupte studied Chinese (Mandarin) and handled China-related roles, including as Under Secretary (1995-1998) and in postings to Hong Kong (1998-2000) and Beijing (2000-2004).
- He served in Dhaka, Bangladesh (2004-2008) as First Secretary/Counsellor.
- He was Deputy Director General at ICCR (2008-2010), promoting India's cultural diplomacy.
- From 2010 to 2014, Gupte was Deputy Chief of Mission in Berlin and acted as Charge d'Affaires for 9 months.
- He held the roles of Joint Secretary (Haj) and Joint Secretary (Development Partnership Administration) from 2015 to 2017.

8. Maharashtra & SAI Sign MoU for National Centre of Excellence

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed today between the Government of Maharashtra and the Sports Authority of India to establish a National Centre of Excellence in Kandivali, Mumbai, in the presence of Union Minister Piyush Goyal. Goyal emphasized the Central Government's efforts to enhance India's performance at global sports events and expressed confidence that India will host the 2036 Olympics, highlighting the Centre's significant role in achieving this goal.

- The Sports Authority of India plans to develop international-standard sports infrastructure on a 37-acre leased land for 30 years at a nominal rate of Rs. 1 per annum.
- Sports Authority of India plans to develop modern sports infrastructure of international standards at the said land parcel of 37 acres which has been leased for 30 years at the rate of Re. 1 per annum to SAI.
