### **1. FULMINATION (noun) : विरोध**

**Pronunciation:** fuhl·muh·nay·shn

**Meaning:** an expression of vehement protest.

**Synonyms:** vituperation, invective, criticism

**Antonyms:** praise, applause

**Sentence:** Players were told they had a right to be spared the foulmouthed fulmination of the hockey coach.

### **2. PERNICIOUS (adj.) : हानिकारक**

**Pronunciation:** puh·ni·shuhs

**Meaning:** having a harmful effect, especially in a gradual or subtle way.

**Synonyms:** harmful, damaging, noxious

**Antonyms:** benign, harmless, beneficial

**Sentence:** Business may be troublesome, but idleness is pernicious.

### **3. PLENARY (adj.) : परिपूर्ण**

**Pronunciation:** plee·nuh·ree

**Meaning:** not lacking any part or member that properly belongs to it

**Synonyms:** entire, whole, complete

**Antonyms:** partial, incomplete

**Sentence:** The conference ended with a plenary debate.

### **4. PREPONDERANT (adj.) : प्रबल**

**Pronunciation:** pruh·pawn·duh·ruhnt

**Meaning:** predominant in influence, number, or importance.

**Synonyms:** dominant, predominant, prevalent

**Antonyms:** unwonted, insignificant

**Sentence:** Music does not play a very preponderant role in the school's teaching.

### **5. SALUTARY (adj.) : लाभदायक**

**Pronunciation:** sa·lyoo·tuh·ree

**Meaning:** (especially with reference to something unwelcome or unpleasant) producing good effects; beneficial.

**Synonyms:** beneficial, advantageous, profitable

**Antonyms:** unfavorable, disadvantageous, unprofitable

**Sentence:** The team's defeat is a salutary warning before the World Cup.

### **6. GARISH (adj.) : भड़कीला**

**Pronunciation:** geuh·ruhsh

**Meaning:** obtrusively bright and showy; lurid.

**Synonyms:** gaudy, lurid, loud

**Antonyms:** quiet, muted, subdued

**Sentence:** It's a little too garish for my taste.

### **7. ADMONISHMENT (noun) : चेतावनी**

**Pronunciation:** uhd·maw·nuhsh·muhnt

**Meaning:** a firm warning or reprimand.

**Synonyms:** admonition, warning, caution

**Antonyms:** allow, compliment, flatter

**Sentence:** Sometimes he gave them a severe admonishment.

### **8. EXCORIATING (verb) : आलोचना**

**Pronunciation:** uhk·skaw·ree·ayt·uhng

**Meaning:** to criticize harshly and usually publicly

**Synonyms:** attacking, slamming, scolding

**Antonyms:** praising, commending, complimenting

**Sentence:** His latest novel received excoriating reviews.

### **9. CREDENCE (noun) : विश्वास**

**Pronunciation:** kree·dns

**Meaning:** belief in or acceptance of something as true.

**Synonyms:** acceptance, belief, faith

**Antonyms:** distrust, mistrust, doubt

**Sentence:** I don't give any credence to these rumors.

### **10. CHATTEL (noun) : संपत्ति**

**Pronunciation:** cha·tl

**Meaning:** transportable items that one owns

**Synonyms:** possession, belongings, stuff

**Antonyms:** immobile, unportable

**Sentence:** She packed up all her chattels and moved to a new state.



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
