**1.REMORSE (noun):** आत्मा ग्लानि

**Pronunciation:** ruh·maws

**Meaning:** deep regret or guilt for a wrong committed.

**Synonyms:** contrition, deep regret, repentance

**Antonyms:** impenitence, remorselessness

**Sentence:** He seemed to feel no remorse at all.

**2.INDECIPHERABLE (adj.):** अस्पष्ट

**Pronunciation:** in·duh·sai·fuh·ruh·bl

**Meaning:** not able to be read or understood.

**Synonyms:** hard to read, unreadable, indiscernible

**Antonyms:** decipherable, readable

**Sentence:** There was an indecipherable message on the answering machine.

**3.TOOTH AND NAIL (adv.):** पूरी ताकत के साथ

**Pronunciation:** TOOTH AND NAIL

**Meaning:** with all power or resources being used

**Synonyms:** full blast, totally

**Antonyms:** partly, partially, somewhat

**Sentence:** I'll fight tooth and nail to win the finals

**4.DISENCHANTED (adj.):** निराश

**Pronunciation:** dis·uhn·chaant·uhd

**Meaning:** disappointed by someone or something previously respected or admired; disillusioned.

**Synonyms:** disappointed, disillusioned, discontented

**Antonyms:** gratified, pleased, satisfied

**Sentence:** Many voters have become disenchanted with the government.

**5.MORTGAGING (verb):** गिरवी

**Pronunciation:** maw·guhj·uhng

**Meaning:** convey (a property) to a creditor as security on a loan.

**Synonyms:** engaging, pledging

**Antonyms:** reneging

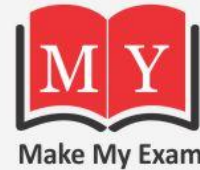
**Sentence:** The report explains how governments are mortgaging their nations' futures.

**6.SECessionISM (noun):** अलगाव**Pronunciation:** SECESSIONISM**Meaning:** the act or process of a whole separating into two or more parts**Synonyms:** bifurcation, division, partition**Antonyms:** association, aggregation, unification**Sentence:** Fundamentalism and secessionism are of course a direct result of poor governance.**7.GOSPEL (noun):** विचारधारा**Pronunciation:** gaw·spl**Meaning:** the basic beliefs or guiding principles of a person or group**Synonyms:** credo, dogma, ideology**Antonyms:** doubt,unbelief,hypothesis.**Sentence:** They continue to preach their gospel of self-reliance.**8.ACCULTURATION (noun):** संस्कृति-संक्रमण**Pronunciation:** uh·kuhl·shuh·ray·shn**Meaning:** assimilation to a different culture, typically the dominant one.**Synonyms:** agreement, conformance, conformity**Antonyms:** conflict, disagreement**Sentence:** The process of acculturation may impact both social and psychological well-being.**9.BYSTANDER (noun):** दर्शक**Pronunciation:** bai·stand·uh**Meaning:** a person who is present at an event or incident but does not take part.**Synonyms:** onlooker, spectator, nonparticipant**Antonyms:** party,member,partaker**Sentence:** It looks like an innocent bystander was killed instead of you.**10.CONFUTING (verb):** झूठा ठहराना**Pronunciation:** kuhn·fyoot·uhng**Meaning:** prove (a person or an assertion) to be wrong.**Synonyms:** disprove, show/prove to be false, contradict**Antonyms:** proving, validating, verifying**Sentence:** Theories that will eventually be confirmed or confuted by experience.

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
