# 1. ASININE (adjective) – बुद्धिहीन

**Pronunciation**: a·suh·nain

Meaning: extremely stupid or foolish

Synonyms: stupid, foolish, pointless, brainless, mindless, senseless, doltish, idiotic

Antonyms: intelligent, clever

Usage: Your asinine attempt of lying in court is going to cost you big time!

# 2. INCONCLUSIVE (adjective) – अनिर्णायात्मक

**Pronunciation**: in·kuhn·kloo·suhv

**Meaning**: not leading to a firm conclusion or result

Synonyms: indecisive, indefinite, indeterminate, undetermined, unresolved, unproved,

unsettled

Antonyms: conclusive, definitive

**Usage**: The medical tests were <u>inconclusive</u>, and will need to be repeated.

# 3. UBIQUITOUS (adjective) - सर्वव्यापक

Pronunciation: yoo·bi·kwuh·tuhs

Meaning: present, appearing, or found everywhere

Synonyms: omnipresent, everywhere, all-over, pervasive, universal, prevalent

Antonyms: rare, scarce

Usage: Many people believe you do not have to search for God because he is ubiquitous

and exists everywhere.

# 4. PARTISAN (adjective) – पक्षपातपूर्ण

**Pronunciation**: paa·tuh·zan

Meaning: prejudiced in favour of a particular cause

Synonyms: biased, prejudiced, one-sided, coloured, discriminatory, preferential, partial

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Antonyms: impartial, unbiased

**Usage**: Because of your <u>partisan</u> views, you are unwilling to look at other options.

#### 5. ALACRITY (noun) – तत्परता

Pronunciation: paa·tuh·zan

Meaning: brisk and cheerful readiness

Synonyms: eagerness, willingness, readiness, enthusiasm, ardour, fervour, keenness

Antonyms: apathy, indifference

**Usage:** They accepted the offer with <u>alacrity</u>.

# 6. RECONDITE (adjective) – गंभीर

**Pronunciation**: reh·kuhn·dait **Meaning**: little known; abstruse

Synonyms: obscure, abstruse, arcane, esoteric, abstract, deep, profound

Antonyms: straightforward, simple, familiar

Usage: The difficult concept of the physics theory was recondite to everyone but the

scientists.

### 7. DISCERN (verb) – पहचानना

Pronunciation: duh-suhn

Meaning: recognize or find out

Synonyms: perceive, detect, recognize, notice, observe, see, spot, identify

Antonyms: overlook, miss

Usage: Looking at the muddy footprints in the kitchen will make it easier for us to discern

which of the kids stole the plate of cookies.

### 8. INCOGRUOUS (adjective) - बेमेल

**Pronunciation**: uhn·kong·groo·uhs

**Meaning**: not in harmony or keeping with the surroundings or other aspects of something

Synonyms: inappropriate, unsuitable, unsuited, discordant, dissonant, conflicting, clashing

**Antonyms**: appropriate, harmonious

Usage: I do not believe your story because the statement you gave yesterday is

<u>incongruous</u> to the witness's statement.

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### 9. PROVIDENT (adjective) – चौकस

**Pronunciation**: pro·vuh·dnt

Meaning: making or indicative of timely preparation for the future

Synonyms: prudent, judicious, shrewd, circumspect, forearmed, wise, sagacious

Antonyms: improvident, thoughtless

Usage: My financier told me that I needed to be more provident when it came to my

spending.

# 10. OPULENCE (noun) – बह्तायत

Pronunciation: o pyoo · luhns

Meaning: great wealth or luxuriousness

Synonyms: richness, luxury, magnificence, grandeur, grandiosity, wealth

**Antonyms**: restraint, poverty

Usage: His eyes had never beheld such opulence.



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
