1. MERRIMENT (NOUN): आमोद

Pronunciation: meh·ruh·muhnt

Meaning: gaiety and fun.

Synonyms: exuberance, cheerfulness, gaiety

Antonyms: dejection, depression, despondence

Sentence: Their unexpected merriment made him nervously inquire as to the reason for it.

2. NEOTERIC (ADJECTIVE): नवीन

Pronunciation: ne·o·ter·ic

Meaning: new or modern; recent.

Synonyms: latest, modern, recent

Antonyms: old, oldfangled

Sentence: The neoteric design of the building stood out among the surrounding traditional structures.

3. REACTIONARY (ADJECTIVE): प्रति क्रयावादी

Pronunciation: ree·ak·shuhn·uh·ree

Meaning: opposing political or social liberalization or reform.

Synonyms: conservative, rightist, orthodox

Antonyms: liberal, nonconservative

Sentence: The reactionary officer then ordered him arrested.

4. CATAclysmic (ADJECTIVE): दुर्घटना

Pronunciation: ka·tuh·kliz·muhk

Meaning: relating to or denoting a violent natural event.

Synonyms: disastrous, catastrophic, calamitous

Antonyms: non-destructive, protective

Sentence: These countries are on the brink of cataclysmic famine.

5. OBSEQUIIOUS (ADJECTIVE): चापलूस

Pronunciation: uhb·see·kvee·uhs

Meaning: obedient or attentive to an excessive or servile degree.

Synonyms: servile, ingratiating, unctuous

Antonyms: insurgent, mutinous, mulish

Sentence: The salesman's obsequious manner was beginning to irritate me.

6. PORTENTOUS (ADJECTIVE): अमंगल**Pronunciation:** paw·tent·uhs**Meaning:** of or like a portent.**Synonyms:** ominous, warning, foreshadowing**Antonyms:** unthreatening, auspicious, benign**Sentence:** There was nothing portentous or solemn about him.**7. ENRAPTURED (VERB):** मंत्रमुग्ध**Pronunciation:** uhn·rap·chuhd**Meaning:** give intense pleasure or joy to.**Synonyms:** delight, give great pleasure to, give joy to**Antonyms:** depressed, discouraged, disheartened**Sentence:** The audience was enraptured by her beautiful voice.**8. OVATION (NOUN):** वाहवाही**Pronunciation:** oh·vay·shn**Meaning:** a sustained and enthusiastic show of appreciation from an audience, especially by means of applause.**Synonyms:** applause, handclapping, clapping**Antonyms:** booing, hissing, taunt**Sentence:** He received the longest ovation of the evening.**9. ADDENDUM (NOUN):** परि शष्ट**Pronunciation:** uh·den·dm**Meaning:** an item of additional material, typically omissions, added at the end of a book or other publication.**Synonyms:** appendix, codicil, postscript**Antonyms:** introduction, preface, prologue**Sentence:** I follow this letter with the addendum duly signed for your attention.**10. EXECRABLE (ADJECTIVE):** भद्दा**Pronunciation:** ek·suh·kruh·bl**Meaning:** extremely bad or unpleasant.**Synonyms:** appalling, awful, dreadful**Antonyms:** excellent, fine, wonderful**Sentence:** He stood at the desk, laboring in his execrable handwriting.**11. ERGO (ADVERB):** फलस्वरूप**Pronunciation:** uh·goh

Meaning: for this or that reason

Synonyms: therefore, consequently, so

Antonyms: however, nevertheless, still

Sentence: She was the sole beneficiary of the will, ergo the prime suspect.

12. MISERLINESS (NOUN): कंजूसी

Pronunciation: mai·zuh·lee·nuhs

Meaning: excessive desire to save money; extreme meanness.

Synonyms: avarice, acquisitiveness, parsimony

Antonyms: bounty, generosity, largesse

Sentence: The party earned a damaging reputation for miserliness by cutting pensions.

13. PARLEY (NOUN): बातचीत

Pronunciation: paa·lee

Meaning: a conference between opposing sides in a dispute, especially a discussion of terms for an armistice.

Synonyms: negotiation, talk, meeting

Antonyms: quiet, disagree, ignored

Sentence: The governor was forced to parley with the rebels.

14. BOGGED (VERB): फंस गया

Pronunciation: bawgd

Meaning: be or become stuck in mud or wet ground.

Synonyms: trapped, stuck

Antonyms: freed, released

Sentence: Your car will bog down in the mud.

15. BEGET (VERB): उत्पन्न करना

Pronunciation: buh·get

Meaning: give rise to; bring about.

Synonyms: cause, give rise to, lead to

Antonyms: impede, limit, restrict

Sentence: One change in the natural environment will beget others.

16. CHEESEPARING (ADJECTIVE): कंजूस

Pronunciation: cheez·peuh·ruhng

Meaning: careful or stingy with money.

Synonyms: cheapness, penny-pinching, penuriousness

Antonyms: generosity, largesse

Sentence: I have never been in favour of cheeseparings in education.

17. CORUSCATE (VERB): उज्ज्वल होना

Pronunciation: kaw·ruh·skayt

Meaning: (of light) flash or sparkle.

Synonyms: flash, glance, gleam

Antonyms: dim, dull

Sentence: The light was coruscating from the walls.

18. PROBITY (NOUN): ईमानदारी

Pronunciation: proh·buh·tee

Meaning: the quality of having strong moral principles; honesty and decency.

Synonyms: integrity, honesty, decency

Antonyms: mendaciousness, mendacity, dishonesty

Sentence: Her probity and integrity are beyond question.

19. DERANGE (VERB): पागल या व क्षप्त कर देना

Pronunciation: duh·raynj

Meaning: cause (someone) to become insane.

Synonyms: demented, unhinge

Antonyms: relax, soothe, tranquilize

Sentence: Being stranded at night on a lonely road would derange anyone.

20. TRAVESTY (NOUN): अन्याय

Pronunciation: tra·vuh·stee

Meaning: a false, absurd, or distorted representation of something.

Synonyms: misrepresentation, distortion, perversion

Antonyms: applause, commendation

Sentence: The trial was a travesty of justice.

21. NIMBLE (ADJECTIVE): चतुर

Pronunciation: nim·bl

Meaning: quick and light in movement or action; agile.

Synonyms: agile, lithe, sprightly

Antonyms: vacuous, weak-minded

Sentence: She showed some nimble footwork and looked a promising player.

22. IMPEDIMENT (NOUN): बाधा

Pronunciation: uhm·peh·duh·muhnt

Meaning: a hindrance or obstruction in doing something.

Synonyms: hindrance, obstruction, obstacle

Antonyms: catalyst, goad, impetus

Sentence: He was satisfied there was no legal impediment to the marriage.

23. EXPIATION (NOUN): प्रयाश्चित्त

Pronunciation: ek·spee·ay·shn

Meaning: the act of making amends or reparation for guilt or wrongdoing; atonement.

Synonyms: atonement, redemption, redress

Antonyms: corruption, debasement, perversion

Sentence: He made expiation for our sins on the cross.

24. NEBULOUS (ADJECTIVE): अस्पष्ट

Pronunciation: neh·byoo·luhs

Meaning: having an often intentionally veiled or uncertain meaning.

Synonyms: indistinct, indefinite, unclear

Antonyms: accessible, clear, nonambiguous

Sentence: The rules are too nebulous to be applied consistently.

25. GAFFE (NOUN): चूक

Pronunciation: gaf

Meaning: an unintentional act or remark causing embarrassment to its originator; a blunder.

Synonyms: blunder, mistake, error

Antonyms: accuracy, correctness, perfection

Sentence: He didn't realize what a gaffe he'd made.

26. FIDGETY (ADJECTIVE): बेचैन

Pronunciation: fi·juht·ee

Meaning: inclined to fidget; restless or uneasy.

Synonyms: restless, restive, nervous

Antonyms: calm, cool

Sentence: As the questioning continued, he became fidgety and uneasy.

27. PROBITY (NOUN): ईमानदारी

Pronunciation: proh·buh·tee

Meaning: the quality of having strong moral principles; honesty and decency.

Synonyms: integrity, honesty, uprightness

Antonyms: badness, evil, evildoing

Sentence: Her probity and integrity are beyond question.

28. TWEAK (VERB): बदलाव

Pronunciation: tweek

Meaning: improve (a mechanism or system) by making fine adjustments to it.

Synonyms: modify, alter, change

Antonyms: fixation, stabilization

Sentence: Engineers tweak the car's operating systems during the race.

29. VALOROUS (ADJECTIVE): बहादुर

Pronunciation: va·luh·ruhs

Meaning: showing great courage in the face of danger, especially in battle.

Synonyms: bold, brave, courageous

Antonyms: coward, ungallant, unheroic

Sentence: The warriors were very valorous in the battle.

30. INGRAINED (ADJECTIVE): दीर्घस्थायी

Pronunciation: in·graynd

Meaning: (of a habit, belief, or attitude) firmly fixed or established; difficult to change.

Synonyms: built-in, entrenched, established

Antonyms: adventitious, extraneous, extrinsic

Sentence: Morals tend to be deeply ingrained.

31. CULINARY (ADJECTIVE): रसोईया

Pronunciation: kuh·luh·nuh·ree

Meaning: a relating to cooking, food preparation, or the art of preparing and presenting food.

Synonyms: Gastronomic, Epicurean

Antonyms: Non cooking

Sentence: The culinary delights of the restaurant impressed the diners, who savored each expertly prepared dish.

32. FLURRY (NOUN): घबराहट

Pronunciation: fluh·ree

Meaning: a short time in which there is suddenly a lot of activity.

Synonyms: Bustle, Commotion

Antonyms: Calm, Stillness

Sentence: As the snow started falling, children ran outside with great excitement, creating a flurry of laughter and snowball fights in the neighborhood.

33. PROCURE (VERB): प्राप्त करना**Pronunciation:** pruh·kyaw**Meaning:** obtain (something), especially with care or effort.**Synonyms:** Obtain, Acquire**Antonyms:** Lose, Surrender**Sentence:** She managed to procure a rare book from the library.**34. WILDERNESSES (NOUN):** जंगली इलाका**Pronunciation:** vil·duh·nuhs·uhz**Meaning:** an uncultivated, uninhabited, and inhospitable region.**Synonyms:** Wilds, Forests**Antonyms:** Civilization, Urbanization**Sentence:** They embarked on a challenging expedition through the remote wildernesses of Alaska.**35. EXTERMINATE (VERB):** समाप्त करना**Pronunciation:** uhk·stuh·muh·nayt**Meaning:** destroy completely.**Synonyms:** Eliminate, Eradicate**Antonyms:** Preserve, Protect**Sentence:** The authorities are taking measures to exterminate the pests infesting the crops.**36. EXACERBATED (VERB):** बिगाड़ देना**Pronunciation:** uhg·za·suh·bayt·uhd**Meaning:** make (a problem, bad situation, or negative feeling) worse.**Synonyms:** Aggravate, Intensify**Antonyms:** Aid, Alleviate**Sentence:** His angry comments have exacerbated tensions in the negotiation process.**37. SEEPED (VERB):** रिसना**Pronunciation:** seep**Meaning:** (of a liquid) flow or leak slowly through porous material or small holes.**Synonyms:** Ooze, Trickle**Antonyms:** Flooded, Surged**Sentence:** The chemicals seeped into the ground.**38. MALAISE (NOUN):** बेचैनी**Pronunciation:** muh·layz

Meaning: a general feeling of being slightly ill or unhappy without any particular reason.

Synonyms: Uneasiness, Unhappiness

Antonyms: Wellness

Sentence: The country's current economic problems are symptoms of a deeper malaise.

39. DOGGED (ADJECTIVE): हठी

Pronunciation: dog·ged

Meaning: refusing to give up even when something is difficult.

Synonyms: Tenacious, Obstinate

Antonyms: Hesitant, Flexible

Sentence: Her dogged determination to uncover the truth about the scandal led to her winning a reporting prize.

40. SWASHBUCKLING (ADJECTIVE): रोमांचक और उत्साहपूर्ण

Pronunciation: svawsh·buh·kuhl·uhng

Meaning: engaging in daring and romantic adventures with bravado or flamboyance.

Synonyms: Swaggering, Heroic

Antonyms: Timid

Sentence: He has not been the same swashbuckling player since suffering a knee injury.

41. INDICT (VERB): दोषी ठहराने

Pronunciation: uhn·dite

Meaning: to make a claim of wrongdoing against.

Synonyms: accuse, prosecute, incriminate

Antonyms: acquit, exonerate, vindicate

Sentence: The grand jury could indict the mayor for fraud and embezzlement.

42. MEASLY (ADJECTIVE): अल्प

Pronunciation: meez·lee

Meaning: contemptibly small or few.

Synonyms: paltry, meager, scanty

Antonyms: significant, considerable, enough

Sentence: That measly little paycheck barely covered the rent.

43. INTERCESSION (NOUN): बीच-बचाव

Pronunciation: in·tuh·seh·shn

Meaning: the action of intervening on behalf of another.

Synonyms: intermediation, negotiation, intervention

Sentence: His intercession could be of help to the tribe.

BLOT (VERB): धब्बा लगाना**Pronunciation:** *Blat***Meaning:** mark or stain (something).**Synonyms:** stain, taint, smudge**Antonyms:** cleanse, purify**Sentence:** Dark patches of dirt blotted the gray dress.**45. PAROCHIAL (ADJECTIVE): संकीर्ण****Pronunciation:** puh·roh·kee·uhl**Meaning:** not broad or open in views or opinions**Synonyms:** petty, small-minded, narrow**Antonyms:** liberal, cosmopolitan, open**Sentence:** Local newspapers tend to be very parochial.**46. FRAGILITIES (NOUN): नाजुकता****Pronunciation:** fru-jil-i-tees**Meaning:** the quality of being easily broken or damaged.**Synonyms:** frailty, flimsiness, weakness**Antonyms:** strong, sturdy, tough**Sentence:** Osteoporosis is characterized by bone fragility.**47. DEFTLY (ADVERB): चतुराई से****Pronunciation:** deft·lee**Meaning:** in a way that is neatly skillful and quick in movement.**Synonyms:** masterfully, skillfully, adroitly**Antonyms:** ineptly, inexpertly, unskillfully**Sentence:** The company spokesperson deftly sidestepped the investigative reporter's questions.**48. SENTENTIOUS (ADJECTIVE): उपदेशात्मक****Pronunciation:** sen·ten·shuhs**Meaning:** given to moralizing in a pompous or affected manner.**Synonyms:** moralistic, moralizing, sanctimonious**Antonyms:****Sentence:** The document was sententious and pompous.**49. UNSWERVING (ADJECTIVE): अ डग****Pronunciation:** uhn·svuhv·uhng**Meaning:** not changing or becoming weaker; steady or constant.**Synonyms:** unwavering, unfaltering, unhesitating

Antonyms: timid, diffident, heedful

Sentence: The general had an unswerving devotion to duty.

50. FRAZZLE (NOUN): थकी हुई अवस्था

Pronunciation: fra·zl

Meaning: the state of being completely exhausted.

Synonyms: exhaustion, fatigue, lethargy

Antonyms: refreshment, energy, rejuvenation

Sentence: The meeting left me feeling completely frazzled.

51. APATHETIC (ADJECTIVE): उदासीन

Pronunciation: a·puh·theh·tuhk

Meaning: showing or feeling no interest, enthusiasm, or concern.

Synonyms: uninterested, indifferent, unconcerned

Antonyms: interested, conscientious, concerned

Sentence: I realised I was becoming increasingly depressed and apathetic.

52. DWINDLING (ADJECTIVE): कम होना

Pronunciation: dvind·ling

Meaning: gradually diminishing in size, amount, or strength.

Synonyms: decreasing, diminishing, subsiding

Antonyms: increasing, growing, rising

Sentence: The elephant population is dwindling.

53. TEED OFF (VERB): गुस्सा होना

Pronunciation: tee-d awf

Meaning: feeling or showing anger.

Synonyms: ballistic, angry, infuriated

Antonyms: pleased, accepting, delighted

Sentence: He teed off on the Labour Government policies.

54. SINGE (VERB): जलाना

Pronunciation: sinj

Meaning: burn (something) superficially or lightly.

Synonyms: scorch, burn, sear

Antonyms: smother, chok

Sentence: My jumper started to singe when I leaned over a burning candle.

55. GOOF (NOUN): मूर्ख

Pronunciation: goof

Meaning: a stupid person.

Synonyms: idiot, moron, stupid

Antonyms: genius, brain, whiz

Sentence: I just stood there like a goof waiting for him to introduce her.

56. DULCET (ADJECTIVE): आनंद कर

Pronunciation: duhl·suht

Meaning: giving pleasure or contentment to the mind or senses.

Synonyms: delightful, enjoyable, felicitous

Antonyms: unpalatable, unpleasant, disturbing

Sentence: She recorded the dulcet tones of her family and friends.

57. INSULARITY (NOUN): संकीर्णता

Pronunciation: ins·yoo·la·ruh·tee

Meaning: ignorance of or lack of interest in cultures, ideas outside one's own experience.

Synonyms: narrow-mindedness, parochialism, provincialism

Antonyms: tolerance, liberalism

Sentence: But will Dublin's insularity prove to be its downfall?

58. VIRTUOSO (NOUN): कलाप्रवीण व्यक्ति

Pronunciation: vuh·tyoo·oh·soh

Meaning: a person highly skilled in music or another artistic pursuit.

Synonyms: genius, expert, prodigy

Antonyms: amateur, amateurish, inexperienced

Sentence: He was gaining a reputation as a remarkable virtuoso.

59. EXHORT (VERB): समझाना

Pronunciation: uhg·zawt

Meaning: strongly encourage or urge (someone) to do something.

Synonyms: urge, encourage, adjure

Antonyms: deter, discourage, dissuade

Sentence: The governor exhorted the prisoners not to riot.

60. INKLING (NOUN): आभास

Pronunciation: ing·kluhng

Meaning: a slight knowledge or suspicion; a hint.

Synonyms: idea, sense, notion

Antonyms: answer, solution

Sentence: The records give us an inkling of how people saw the world.
