1. Srinivas Nayak Indaje to receive Universal Media Award 2025 in Dubai



3. India's First Wildlife Biobank Opens at Darjeeling Zoo

India's first Wildlife Biobank has been inaugurated at the Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park in Darjeeling. This biobank aims to preserve genetic materials such as DNA, tissues, and cells of endangered wildlife species. It will support conservation efforts by aiding research, breeding programs, and species restoration. The initiative aligns with India's commitment to biodiversity protection and wildlife conservation. Scientists believe it will play a crucial role in safeguarding the genetic heritage of rare and threatened species.

- **National Significance**: This biobank is part of a national plan to establish similar facilities in other zoos, including the National Zoo in Delhi and Nandankanan Zoo in Odisha, to aid in conservation efforts across the country.

4. Kash Patel Sworn in as the Ninth Director of the FBI

Kash Patel has been sworn in as the ninth Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). A former national security official, Patel has held key roles in the U.S. government, including positions in the Department of Defense and intelligence agencies. 
global recognition highlights her impact on biodiversity preservation and environmental advocacy.
