1. Dharmendra Pradhan gets Kalinga Ratna Award from President Murmu

- Award Presentation: President Droupadi Murmu presented the Kalinga Ratna Award 2024 to Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan at a ceremony in Cuttack, Odisha, on July 15, 2025.
- **Significance**: The Kalinga Ratna Award is one of Odisha's most esteemed honors, given to individuals who have made remarkable contributions at the national or international level across diverse fields.



• Occasion: The award ceremony coincided with the 600th birth anniversary celebrations of Adikabi Sarala Das, a legendary 15th-century Odia poet and literary figure.

2. Andre Russell Announces Retirement from International Cricket

- **Retirement Plans**: Andre Russell had initially hinted at retiring from international cricket after the 2024 T20 World Cup, but he has since changed his mind and plans to continue playing until after the 2026 T20 World Cup.
- Conversation with Coach: Russell's decision to extend his international career was made after discussions with West Indies white-ball head coach Daren Sammy, indicating a renewed commitment to the team.



- **Targeting 2026 World Cup**: Russell has explicitly stated his desire to play in the 2026 T20 World Cup, which will be jointly hosted by India and Sri Lanka, showing his enthusiasm for the tournament.
- **Current Focus: Russell** is currently focused on the T20 Global Super League 2025, playing for Rangpur Riders, and has upcoming matches against Central Stags and other teams in the tournament.

3. Indian Army Successfully Tests Akash Prime Air Defence System

- **Successful Test-Firing**: The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully test-fired the Akash Prime missile, an advanced version of the Akash surface-to-air missile system, at the Integrated Test Range (ITR) Chandipur in Odisha on September 27, 2021.
- **Improved Accuracy**: Akash Prime is equipped with an indigenous active Radio Frequency (RF) seeker, providing improved accuracy while intercepting targets in various conditions, and has a 360-degree engagement capability.
- **Range and Capabilities**: The Akash Prime missile has a target range of 50-80 kilometers at heights of 18,000 meters and is capable of neutralizing fighter planes, cruise missiles, and air-to-surface or ballistic missiles.
- **Operational Significance**: The successful test demonstrates the DRDO's expertise in designing and building world-class missile systems, boosting the confidence of the Indian Army and Indian Air Force in the Akash Prime system.

4. Ancy Sojan won bronze in women's long jump at Lignano Continental Tour event

- Event Details: Ancy Sojan secured the bronze medal at the Lignano Meeting, a World Athletics Continental Tour Bronze event held in Lignano Sabbiadoro, Italy, on July 13, 2025.
- Jumping Sequence: Ancy's jump sequence was impressive, with five of her six jumps crossing the 6.15m mark. Her jumps were: 6.26m, 6.35m, 6.19m, 6.36m, 6.18m, and 6.11m.
- **Best Jump**: Ancy's best jump of the day was 6.36m, achieved on her fourth attempt, although it was below her season's best of 6.54m registered in May 2025.
- **Medal Winners**: Australia's Delta Amidzovski took gold with a 6.47m jump, while South Africa's Danielle Nolte secured silver with a 6.44m jump.





5. Bihar won U18 boys' rugby title, complete golden double

- Championship Victory: Bihar won the U18 Boys' title at the 10th Junior National Rugby 7s Championship 2025, defeating defending champions Odisha 17-15 in a thrilling final at Maharana Pratap Sports College in Dehradun.
- **Golden Double Achievement**: This victory completed a remarkable double for Bihar, who had also captured the Girls' U18 crown earlier in the week, mirroring their golden sweep from 2022.
- **The Winning Match**: Bihar's win was sealed with Goldan Kumar's try and conversion early on, followed by Odisha's comeback attempts through Mantu Tudu, Subash Hansdah, and Eswar Pujari's tries. However, Goldan Kumar's last-minute winning try gave Bihar the 17-15 victory.
- Unbeaten Campaign: Bihar remained unbeaten throughout the tournament, with dominant wins over Chandigarh (49-0), Haryana (62-0), Punjab (29-0), West Bengal (39-0), and Maharashtra (10-5).

6. Ajay Kumar Shrivastava appointed as Director (Engineering & R&D), HAL

- **Appointment**: Ajay Kumar Shrivastava assumed charge as Director (Engineering and R&D) of HAL on July 15, 2025, bringing 37 years of experience in aircraft design and development to the role.

9. World Day for International Justice observed on 17th July

- **History**: The Rome Statute was adopted on July 17, 1998, by 120 countries in Rome, creating the





International Criminal Court (ICC), which became operational on July 1, 2002.

- **Objectives**: The day aims to promote awareness about international justice systems, encourage cooperation among nations, support victims' rights, and strengthen the rule of law as a foundation for peace and security.
- **Theme**: The theme for World Day for International Justice 2024 was "Overcoming Barriers and Unleashing Opportunities for Social Justice," highlighting the need for the international justice system to fill gaps in the changing global landscape while maintaining core principles.

10. World's Oldest Marathon Runner Fauja Singh passed away

- **Tragic Death**: Fauja Singh was struck by an unidentified vehicle while crossing the road on July 14, 2025, and succumbed to his injuries at a nearby hospital.
- **Running Career**: Singh began his running journey at 89 to cope with grief and went on to set numerous age-group world records, including becoming the first centenarian to complete a marathon.



- Legacy: He was known as the "Turbaned Tornado" and was a symbol of resilience, inspiring many with his achievements. Singh participated in numerous marathons worldwide, including events in London, New York, Toronto, and Mumbai.
- Awards and Recognition: Fauja Singh was the first non-American to receive the Ellis Island Medal of Honor in 2003 for promoting racial tolerance and was awarded the Pride of India title in 2011.
