



1. Palak-Amit pair won mixed air pistol Gold

Palak Gulia and Amit Sharma clinched the gold medal in the air pistol mixed team event at the World University Shooting Championship, defeating their fellow Indians, Sainyam and Samrat Rana, with a dominant 16-12 victory. This win was part of India's impressive five-medal haul on day 2, which also included three silver medals. The competition took place at the Karni Singh Range, where the Hungarian pair of Sara Rahel Fabian and Redecsi Mate secured the bronze by defeating Chinese-Taipei 16-12.



Foot notes:

- In the qualification round, Sainyam (289) and Samrat (290) topped the leaderboard with a combined score of 579, while Palak (285) and Amit (293) finished second with a total score of 578.
- In women's trap, Neeru won silver with 43, Kirti Gupta took bronze with 32, and Zina Hrdlickova of the Czech Republic claimed gold with 45.
- Kirti topped the qualification round with 118/125, and Neeru made the final with 115.
- Aishwary Pratap Singh Tomar, an Olympian and 2021 World University Games gold medalist, secured silver in the 50m rifle 3-positions with a score of 458.2.
- Palak Gulia and Amit Sharma won gold in the mixed air pistol event, beating Sainyam and Samrat 16-12, with Palak also securing a team gold earlier in women's air pistol.



• In the men's 50m rifle 3-position, Jiri Privratsky edged Aishwary by 4.7 points to take the gold.

2. London is world's top city brand for second consecutive year

London has claimed the top position for the second year in a row in the newly released Brand Finance Global City Index 2024. Manchester, Liverpool, and Edinburgh each received recognition for their unique attractions, ranging from sports and music to scenic beauty. Following London in the global ranking are New York and Paris, completing the top three, with Tokyo and Dubai rising to 4th and 5th places. This ranking is based on a survey of



15,000 respondents across 20 countries, offering comprehensive global insights into the world's leading city brands.

- London ranks 3rd in Familiarity and Reputation, reflecting its strong global appeal, but lags in Consideration (19th), particularly in affordability (97th).

3. IIT Ropar developed patented Mechanical Knee Rehab Device

Researchers at IIT Ropar have made a major breakthrough in postsurgical knee rehabilitation with the development of a Completely Mechanical Passive Motion (CPM) Machine for Knee Rehabilitation, which has been awarded patent No. 553407. Unlike traditional motorized CPM machines, which are costly and require electricity, this new device is entirely mechanical. It operates using a piston and pulley system that stores air as the user pulls a handle, providing smooth, controlled motion for knee rehabilitation.

- This design eliminates the need for electricity, batteries, or motors, making it lightweight, portable, and more affordable.
- The mechanical CPM machine offers a cost-effective alternative to expensive electric models, which are often inaccessible, particularly in rural areas with unreliable power supply.
- Its portability makes it easy for patients to use at home, reducing the need for extended hospital stays and frequent rehabilitation visits.
- Continuous passive motion (CPM) therapy is vital for knee surgery recovery, aiding joint mobility, reducing stiffness, and speeding up healing.
- The new mechanical CPM machine provides a cost-effective, eco-friendly alternative to traditional electric models, making knee rehabilitation more affordable.
- The development is expected to have a lasting impact on knee rehabilitation, both in India and globally.

4. India Launches First Space Defense Exercise Antariksha Abhyas

"Antariksha Abhyas -2024," a pioneering three-day space defense exercise, is being conducted from November 11 to 13, 2024. Organized by the Defence Space Agency under the Headquarters Integrated Defence Staff, the exercise is designed to simulate and address potential threats to space-based assets and services.

6. Justice Sanjiv Khanna takes oath as 51st Chief Justice of India

Justice Sanjiv Khanna took the oath of office as the 51st Chief Justice of India, succeeding Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, whose term concluded on November 10, 2024. Justice Khanna's appointment, based on Justice Chandrachud's recommendation, was officially announced by the Centre on October 24. He will hold the position for a six-month term, until May 13, 2025, bringing with him a legacy of landmark rulings. The oath was administered by President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan.

8. Tata Power, Noida International Airport partnered for renewable energy



- The first phase of NIA, featuring one runway and terminal, will handle up to 12 million passengers annually, with a projected capacity of 70 million upon full completion.

His mortal remains are in Ramapuram, Chennai, with last rites planned for November 11. Delhi Ganesh's career spanned over 400 films,



where he skillfully portrayed roles ranging from comedic to villainous and touching supporting characters.
