### **1. BOORISH (adj.) : अशिष्ट**

**Pronunciation:** boo·ruhsh

**Meaning:** rough and bad-mannered; coarse.

**Synonyms:** loutish, uncouth, rude

**Antonyms:** genteel, polite, civil

**Sentence:** I found him rather boorish and aggressive.

### **2. IMPOVERISHED (adj.) : गरीब**

**Pronunciation:** uhm·paw·vuh·ruhsht

**Meaning:** lacking money or material possessions.

**Synonyms:** poor, broke, beggared

**Antonyms:** affluent, wealthy, rich

**Sentence:** They were impoverished by a prolonged spell of unemployment.

### **3. RENASCENCE (noun) : नवयुग**

**Pronunciation:** *renascence*

**Meaning:** the revival of something that has been dormant.

**Synonyms:** revival, rebirth, resurgence

**Antonyms:** death, extinction, expiration

**Sentence:** While, both revival and renascence are based on the new choice made by ourselves.

### **4. NOSEDIVE (noun) : पतन**

**Pronunciation:** noze·dive

**Meaning:** the act or process of going to a lower level or altitude

**Synonyms:** drop, dip, decline

**Antonyms:** rise, climb, ascent

**Sentence:** Oil prices took a nosedive in the crisis.

### **5. PERSONAGE (noun) : व्यक्ति**

**Pronunciation:** puh·suhn·uhj

**Meaning:** a person (often used to express their significance, importance, or elevated status).

**Synonyms:** person, man, human

**Antonyms:** nobody, nonentity

**Sentence:** There is no evidence for such a historical personage.

### 6. LENITY (noun) : सज्जनता

**Pronunciation:** lenity

**Meaning:** kind, gentle, or compassionate treatment especially towards someone

**Synonyms:** mercy, clemency, empathy

**Antonyms:** vengeance, revenge, ruthlessness

**Sentence:** Michael was admired for his lenity and tolerance.

### 7. RECONDITE (adj.) : गंभीर

**Pronunciation:** reh·kuhn·dite

**Meaning:** difficult for one of ordinary knowledge or intelligence to understand

**Synonyms:** esoteric, profound, abstruse

**Antonyms:** superficial, shallow, simple

**Sentence:** Such teachings are very recondite and need a considerable study to understand fully.

### 8. INTRICACY (noun) : जटिलता

**Pronunciation:** in·truh·kuh·see

**Meaning:** something that makes a situation more complicated or difficult

**Synonyms:** complexity, difficulty, complication

**Antonyms:** simplicity, simpleness

**Sentence:** The price depends on the intricacy of the work.

### 9. APPANAGE (noun) : विशेषण

**Pronunciation:** a·puh·nuhj

**Meaning:** something granted as a special favor

**Synonyms:** privilege, boon, entitlement

**Antonyms:** duty, responsibility, obligation

**Sentence:** Use of the grounds was just one appanage he bestowed upon the caretakers of his estate.

### 10. REGALE (verb) : मनोरंजन करना

**Pronunciation:** ruh·gayl

**Meaning:** entertain or amuse (someone) with talk.

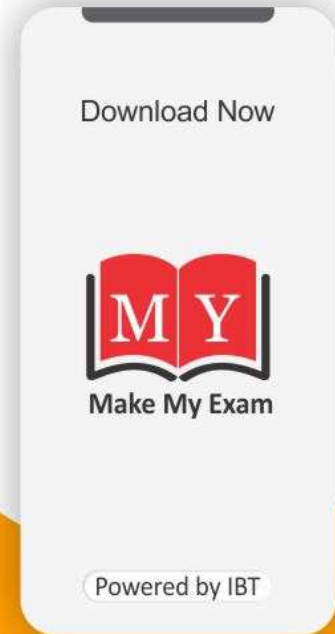
**Synonyms:** entertain, amuse, delighted

**Antonyms:** bored, tired

**Sentence:** She regaled the guests with the best dishes she could offer.

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
