# 1.ZESTFUL (ADJECTIVE): दिलचस्प

#### **Pronunciation:zest**·ful

Meaning: characterized by great enthusiasm and energy.Synonyms: interesting, enthralling, spirited enjoymentAntonyms: boring, drab, tediousSentence: The runners like to enter zestful competitions that will push their energy and make them work for the prize.

## 2. WEARISOME (ADJECTIVE): থকাক

#### Pronunciation:veeuh·ruh·sm

Meaning: causing one to feel tired or bored. Synonyms: tiring, exhausting, boring Antonyms: interesting, engrossing, involving Sentence: Simple repetitive tasks can be very wearisome.

# 3. PERJURY (NOUN): झूठा साक्ष्य

## Pronunciation:puh·juh·ree

Meaning: the crime of telling lies in court when you have promised to tell the truth. Synonyms: lying under oath, violation of an oath, giving false evidence Antonyms: fact, truism, veracity Sentence:Two key witnesses at her trial committed perjury.

## 4. PROPEL (VERB): प्रेरित करना

#### **Pronunciation:pruh·pel**

**Meaning:** to move, drive or push somebody/something forward or in a particular direction **Synonyms:** push, shove, thrust, drive

#### Antonyms: regulate, restrain, control

**Sentence:** In order to propel the ministry into commission, the church was accepting monetary donations.

## 5. LUCRATIVE (ADJECTIVE): लाभप्रद

## Pronunciation:loo·kruh·tuhv

Meaning: producing much money or making a significant profit.



**Synonyms:** profitable, worthwhile, remunerative **Antonyms:**unprofitable,poorly paid, loss-making, impotent **Sentence:**Mr. Chen makes a lucrative income by selling fresh tuna at the market.

## 6. LENITY (NOUN): उदारता

#### Pronunciation:len·i·ty

Meaning: kind, gentle, or compassionate treatment especially toward someone. Synonyms: mercy, clemency, empathy Antonyms: vengeance, revenge, ruthlessness Sentence: Michael was admired for his lenity and tolerance.

## 7. RENASCENCE (NOUN): नवयुग

#### **Pronunciation:re**·na·scence

**Meaning:** the revival of something that has been dormant.

Synonyms: revival, rebirth, resurgence

Antonyms: extinction, expiration, death

**Sentence:**The politician suggested there would be a renascence in the country's coal industry, but that type of revival seems unlikely.

# 8.PERSPICACIOUS (ADJECTIVE): कुशाग्र बुद्धि

#### Pronunciation:puh·spuh·kay·shuhs

Meaning: having a ready insight into and understanding of things.

Synonyms: discerning, shrewd, perceptive

Antonyms: foolish, idiotic, moronic

Sentence: He was perspicacious enough to realize that things were soon going to change.

# 9. DIVISIVE (ADJECTIVE): बांटनेवाला

## Pronunciation:duh·vise·uhv

Meaning: tending to cause disagreement or hostility between people. Synonyms: discordant, disharmonious Antonyms: unifying, accordant Sentence: The divisive proposal split the committee into two opposing sides.

# 10. EVANESCENT (ADJECTIVE): क्षणभंगुर

## Pronunciation:eh·vuh·nes·uhnt

**Meaning:** soon passing out of sight, memory, or existence; quickly fading or disappearing.

**Synonyms:** vanishing, fading, fleeting **Antonyms:** endless, eternal, everlasting



Sentence: Talk is evanescent but writing leaves footprints.

## 11. FARCE (NOUN): स्वांग

Pronunciation: faas
Meaning: a poor, insincere, or insulting imitation of something
Synonyms : parody, joke, caricature
Antonyms : tribute, homage, seriousness
Sentence : The whole procedure has become a complete farce.

#### 12. DESIRABILITY (NOUN): इच्छा

Pronunciation: duh·zai·uh·ruh·bil·uh·tee
Meaning: suitability for bringing about a desired result under the circumstances.
Synonyms : feasibility, advisability, desirableness
Antonyms : imprudence, unwisdom, inadvisability
Sentence : No one questions the desirability of cheaper fares.



## 13. INTERLUDE (NOUN): अन्तराल

#### **Pronunciation:** in·tuh·lood

Meaning: a period of time between two events or activities. Synonyms : interval, interruption, hiatus Antonyms : continuation, continuity, run Sentence : There will now be a 15. minute interlude.

## 14. IMPROPRIETY (NOUN): अनौचित्य

Pronunciation: im·pruh·prai·uh·tee
Meaning: the quality or state of not being socially proper.
Synonyms: unfitness inappropriateness, disrespect
Antonyms: propriety, correctness, decorum
Sentence : The impropriety of the song that the campers sang for the visitors was embarrassing.



#### 15. DABBLED (VERB): हाथ आजमाया

Pronunciation: da·bld
Meaning: to take part in an activity in a superficial way.
Synonyms: delighted, entertained, played
Antonyms: worked, struggled, labored
Sentence : She dabbled in drawing and painting, but sculpture was her favorite medium.

## 16. CONSCRIPTION (NOUN): भरती

Pronunciation: kuhn·skrip·shn
Meaning: the practice of ordering people by law to serve in the armed forces.
Synonyms: induction, recruitment, draft
Antonyms: removal, discharge, dismissal
Sentence : At the outbreak of war, young people knew they would soon face conscription into the army.

## 17. FAR. FLUNG (ADJECTIVE) : दूर दराज

Pronunciation: far.flenMeaning: distant or remote.Synonyms: extensive, broad, wideAntonyms: narrow, limited, restrictedSentence : The news spread to all corners of our far. flung empire.

## 18. PRODIGAL (ADJECTIVE): उड़ाऊ

Pronunciation: proh·di·gl
Meaning: given to spending money freely or foolishly.
Synonyms: wasteful, profligate, generous
Antonyms: frugal, thrifty, economical
Sentence : The prodigal child always spent her allowance the minute she got it

## 19. HITHERTO (ADVERB): अब तक

Pronunciation: hi·dhuh·too Meaning: up to this or that time. Synonyms: yet, heretofore, so far Antonyms: henceforth, hereafter, thereafter Sentence : At the talent show Kyle revealed his hitherto unknown gift for doing impressions.

## 20. LUCENT (ADJECTIVE): प्रकाशमान

**Pronunciation:** loo·snt



Meaning: glowing with or giving off light. Synonyms : luminous, glowing, shining Antonyms : dim, dusky, dark Sentence : The moon was a lucent orb in the cloudless autumn sky.

#### 21. NEGATE (VERB): इनकार करना

Pronunciation: nuh·gayt
Meaning: to stop something from having any effect.
Synonyms: annihilate, disallow, deny
Antonyms: allow, assist, confirm
Sentence: The criminal will negate all charges if you fail to prove him guilty.

## 22. QUEER (ADJECTIVE): विचित्र

Pronunciation: kveeuh
Meaning: strange or unusual.
Synonyms: erratic, weird
Antonyms: sensible, sound
Sentence: They are queer in behaviour and extremely uncultured in their lifestyle.

## 23. STIMULATE (VERB): उकसाना

Pronunciation: sti·myoo·layt
Meaning: to make something active or more active.
Synonyms: elate, arouse, provoke
Antonyms: neglect, dishearten, quell
Sentence: The teacher has to stimulate the students in order to create a hunger in them.

## 24. CORNUCOPIA (NOUN): प्रचुरता

Pronunciation: kaw.nyoo.koh.pee.uh
Meaning: a symbol of plenty consisting of a goat's horn overflowing with flowers, fruit, and corn.
Synonyms: bounty, fullness
Antonyms: need, lack
Sentence: I shall come from London Town with a cornucopia of presents.

## 25. FRET (VERB): झल्लाहट

Pronunciation: fretMeaning: to be worried and unhappy about something.Synonyms: be upset, be anxious, stressAntonyms: please, delight, comfort



Sentence: She was always fretting about something or the other.

## 26. UNLETTERED (ADJECTIVE): निरक्षर

Pronunciation: uhn·leh·tuhd
Meaning: of a person) poorly educated or illiterate.
Synonyms: ignorant, illiterate, uneducated
Antonyms: educated, literate, lettered
Sentence: Such misconceptions have not been confined to the unlettered masses.

# 27. SPRIGHTLY (ADJECTIVE): प्रमुदित

Pronunciation: sprite·lee
Meaning: (especially used about older people) full of energy and life.
Synonyms: agile, active, perky
Antonyms: spiritless, lethargic, languid
Sentence: The sprightly old woman walks two miles every day.

# 28. MYRIAD (ADJECTIVE): असंख्य

Pronunciation: mi.ree.uhdMeaning: a very large number of something.Synonyms: countless, infinite, numberlessAntonyms: numerable, identical, individualSentence: He gazed at the myriad lights of the city.

## 29. REVEL (VERB): आनंद लेना

Pronunciation: reh vl
Meaning: enjoy oneself in a lively and noisy way, especially with drinking and dancing.
Synonyms: make merry, party, bash
Antonyms: mourn, hate
Sentence: They spent the evening revelling with their guests.

## 30. VESTIGE(NOUN) : निशान

Pronunciation : veh.stuhj
Meaning : a small part of something that is left after the rest of it has gone
Synonyms : relic, trace, rest
Antonyms: information, lot
Sentence : For this flood, ministers have produced not a vestige of proof.

# 31.RELUCTANCE(NOUN): अनिच्छा

Pronunciation:ruh·luhk·tns



Meaning: an unwillingness to do something. Synonyms: Disinclination, Trepidation, hesitation Antonyms: willingness, inclination, surety Sentence: I accepted his resignation with great <u>reluctance</u>.

#### 32.TRAVESTY (NOUN): उपहासात्मक रचना

Pronunciation:tra·vuh·stee
Meaning:a cheap mockery, usually of something or someone serious.
Synonyms: Distortion , Perversion, corruption
Antonyms: Seriousness , Solemnity, homage
Sentence: This trial has proved to be a <u>travesty</u> of justice.

## 33.WHIMSY(NOUN): सनकीपन

Pronunciation: vim·zee Meaning: playfully quaint or fanciful behavior or humor. Synonyms: Fanciful , Playfulness Antonyms: Boring , Serious Sentence: The designer's new line showed a touch of <u>whimsy</u>.

## 34.DIABOLICAL(ADJECTIVE): शैतानी

Pronunciation: dai·uh·baw·luhk·uhl Meaning: very bad or annoying. Synonyms: demonic, evil, malicious Antonyms: angelic, benign, holy Sentence: The constant noise from the neighbour's party was <u>diabolical</u>.

## 35.ACCENTUATE (VERB): बल देना

Pronunciation: uhk·sen·choo·ayt
Meaning: to emphasize something or make something easier to notice.
Synonyms: Highlight , Spotlight, underline
Antonyms: Weaken, play down, disparage
Sentence: She uses make.up to <u>accentuate</u> her beautiful eyes.

## 36.CULPABLE (ADJECTIVE): अपराधिक

Pronunciation:kuhl·puh·bl

Meaning:responsible for something bad that has happened. Synonyms: Guilty, Blameworthy, to blame Antonyms: Innocent, Immune, perfect Sentence: The prime minister is highly <u>culpable</u> in this affair.



# 37.DISINCENTIVE (NOUN): निस्त्साहित

#### Pronunciation: dis·uhn·sen·tuhv

Meaning: something that makes people not want to do something or not work hard.

Synonyms: deterrent, discouragement, impediment

Antonyms: incentive, motivation, encouragement

**Sentence:** Punishments serve as a <u>disincentive</u>, attempting to deter people from doing things they shouldn't.

## 38.APPREHENSION (NOUN): आशंका

#### Pronunciation: a·pruh·hen·shn

Meaning: anxiety or fear that something bad or unpleasant will happen.

Synonyms: dread, fearfulness, anxiety

Antonyms: confidence, calmness, certainty

**Sentence:** I am feeling a great deal of <u>apprehension</u> after learning that we have a test tomorrow in my worst subject.



# 39.STIGMA (NOUN): कलंक

## **Pronunciation:** stig·muh

**Meaning:**a mark of disgrace associated with a particular circumstance, quality, or person. **Synonyms:** shame, disgrace, dishonour

Antonyms: honour, credit, award

**Sentence:** Often people are afraid to admit they have a mental illness because of the <u>stigma</u> attached to psychiatric disorders.

# 40.DECRY (VERB): निंदा करना

## Pronunciation:duh·krai

**Meaning:** publicly denounce; to criticize something as bad, without value, or unnecessary. **Synonyms:** criticize, denigrate, denounce

#### Antonyms: applaud, laud, praise

**Sentence:** Several religious organizations have chosen to <u>decry</u> the obscene cartoon about Jesus.



## 41.SALIENT(ADJECTIVE): महत्त्वपूर्ण

#### Pronunciation:say·lee·uhnt

Meaning: most noticeable or important Synonyms: remarkable, prominent, striking Antonyms: subtle, unremarkable, obscure Sentence: She began to summarize the salient features/points of the proposal.

## 42. INGENIOUS (ADJECTIVE): रचनात्मक

Pronunciation:in·jee·nee·uhs
Meaning: having the skill and imagination to create new things
Synonyms: inventive, innovative, creative
Antonyms: imitative, uninventive, unskilful
Sentence: With how skilled my chess opponent was, it would take an ingenious strategy to defeat him, and a fair amount of luck.

## 43. DUNCE (NOUN) : मूर्ख

## Pronunciation:duhns

Meaning: a person who is slow at learning; a stupid person. Synonyms: fool, idiot, simpleton Antonyms: brain, genius, intellectual Sentence: Because it takes me a long time to solve problems, I am a dunce at mathematics.

## 44.IMPETUS (NOUN): प्रोत्साहन

#### **Pronunciation:**im·puh·tuhs

**Meaning:** something that encourages a particular activity or makes that activity more energetic or effective

Synonyms: encouragement, stimulus, momentum

Antonyms: disincentive, discouragement, hindrance

**Sentence:** The high crime rate was the impetus for the hiring of one hundred new police officers in our city.

# 45. SQUANDERED (VERB): गंवाना

#### Pronunciation:skvawn·duhd

**Meaning:** waste (something, especially money or time) in a reckless and foolish manner. **Synonyms:** waste, misspend, misuse

Antonyms: conserved, preserved, save

**Sentence:** Eddie has a tendency to squander his entire allowance on comic books and movies.



## 46. SUBJUGATE (VERB): अधीन करना

#### Pronunciation:suhb·ju·gayt

**Meaning:** to defeat somebody/something and make them obey you; to gain control over somebody/something.

Synonyms: subdue, conquer, dominate

Antonyms: liberate, emancipate, enfranchise

**Sentence:** The manager tried to subjugate the employees into working late by threatening to fire them.

## 47. APARTHEID (NOUN): रंगभेद

## Pronunciation:uh·paat·ide

**Meaning:** the former official government policy in South Africa of separating people of different races and making them live apart.

Synonyms: segregation, discrimination, racism,

Antonyms: antidiscrimination, antiracism, assimilationism

**Sentence:** Nelson Mandela helped to end Apartheid, which was racial discrimination in South Africa.

# 48. PERTINENT (ADJECTIVE): उचित

## Pronunciation:puh·ti·nent

Meaning: relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite Synonyms: relevant, applicable, important Antonyms: irrelevant, impertinent, inapplicable Sentence: To ensure a prompt reply, please include all pertinent details in your email.

## 49. PANDEMONIUM (NOUN): हंगामा

## Pronunciation:pan·duh·moh·nee·uhm

Meaning: wild and noisy disorder or confusion; uproar.

Synonyms: disturbance, turmoil, stir

Antonyms: calm, rest, tranquility

Sentence: There was pandemonium in court as the judge gave his summing up.

# 50. PROPITIATE (VERB): संतुष्ट करना

## Pronunciation:pruh·pi·shee·ayt

Meaning: to make peace with somebody who is angry by trying to please them.

Synonyms: appease, placate, conciliate

Antonyms: anger, antagonize, infuriate

**Sentence:** After Bill forgot his wife's birthday, he tried to propitiate the situation by purchasing her the pearl necklace she always wanted.



## 51. MAGNANIMOUS (ADJECTIVE): उदार

**Pronunciation:** mag·na·nuh·muhs

Meaning: generous or <u>forgiving</u>, especially towards a rival or less powerful person. Synonym: generous, Noble, great Antonym: mean.spirited, Selfish, vile Sentence: The <u>magnanimous</u> leader forgave his political opponents and even helped them in their times of need.

## 52. ROBUST (ADJECTIVE): मज़बूत

Pronunciation: roh·buhst Meaning: strong and healthy; full of vigor; hardy. Synonyms: Sturdy , Rugged, Hale Antonyms: Insipid , Frail, Weak Sentence: His robust strength made him survive the disaster.

# 53. CURTAILING (VERB): कटौती

Pronunciation: kuh·tayl·uhng Meaning: to reduce or limit something. Synonyms: Lesson , Decrease, Reduce Antonyms: Lengthen , Increase, Extend Sentence: In his inability to force this nameless woman to marry him, he faced a definite curtailment of his former power.

# 54.CATERS (VERB): आवश्यकताओं का ध्यान रखना

Pronunciation: kay·tuhz
Meaning: to provide all the things that they need or want.
Synonyms: Regale , Serve, Fill
Antonyms: Disappoint
Sentence: The awards ceremony will be a <u>catered</u> event.

# 55. TAPESTRY (NOUN): कपड़ा जिसमें चित्र बने हो

Pronunciation: ta·puh·stree
Meaning: a piece of heavy cloth with pictures or designs sewn on it in coloured thread
Synonyms: Drapes, Curtains, Drapery
Antonyms: Natural object
Sentence: The interior contains tapestry of the 16th century and other works of art.

# 56.BEGUILING (ADJECTIVE): आकर्षक



#### Pronunciation: buh·gile·uhng

Meaning: agreeably or charmingly attractive or pleasing. Synonyms: Cunning, Cute, Slick Antonyms: Bore, Repel, Plain Sentence: They were <u>beguiled</u> into thinking they'd heard the whole story.

#### 57.CLUTCH(VERB): पकड़

Pronunciation: kluhchMeaning: to hold something tightly, especially because you are in pain, afraid or excitedSynonyms: Clasp , Grasp, HoldAntonyms: Loosen , Release, WeaknessSentence: The child <u>clutched</u> her mother's hand firmly.

## 58.CONTEND(VERB): संघर्ष करना

Pronunciation: kuhn·tend Meaning: to struggle in opposition Synonyms: Struggle , Protest, Fight Antonyms: Peaceful , Agreeable, Deny Sentence: The team is expected to <u>contend</u> for the championship this year.

## 59.LUSCIOUS (ADJECTIVE): सुस्वादु

Pronunciation: luh·shuhs
Meaning: having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste.
Synonyms: delicious, succulent, lush
Antonyms: distasteful, flavorless, insipid
Sentence: Since the bread smelled <u>luscious</u>, Tom decided to go into the bakery.

## 60. MARQUEE (NOUN) : एक प्रकार का बड़ा खेमा

Pronunciation: maa.kee
Meaning: a very large tent that is used for parties, shows, etc.
Synonyms: Pavilion, Dome, Canopy
Antonyms: Mansion
Sentence: The wedding will take place under a large white <u>marquee</u> to protect against aerial photographs.
