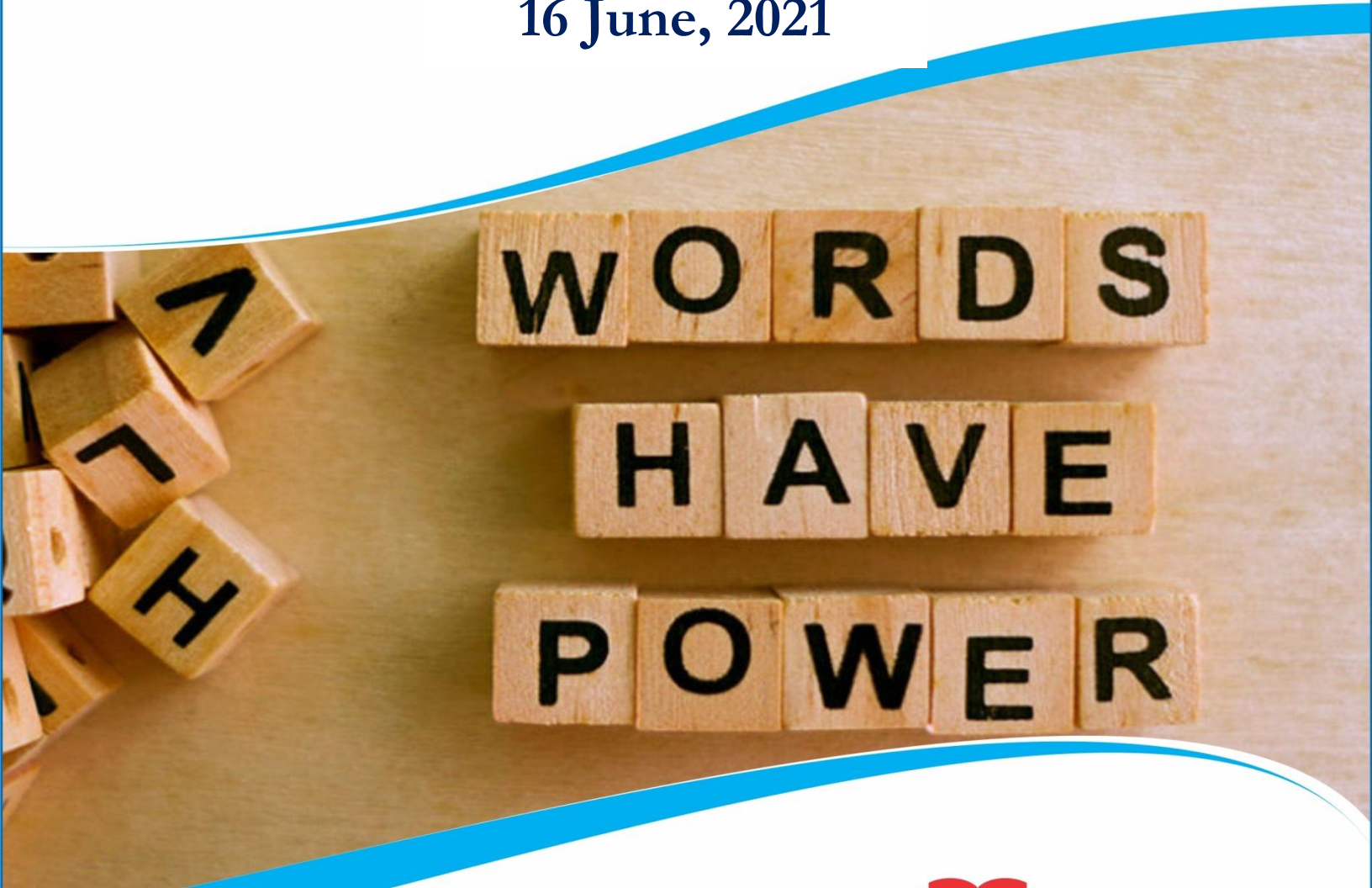


### **1. ORATE (verb) – भाषण देना**

**Pronunciation:** aw·reit

**Meaning:** make a speech, especially pompously or at length

**Synonyms:** declaim, speak, discourse, pontificate, preach, sermonize, spiel

**Antonym:** whisper

**Usage:** It certainly is a fine thing to be able to orate.

### **2. SUBJUGATE (verb) – अधीन करना**

**Pronunciation:** suhb·joo·geit

**Meaning:** bring under domination or control, especially by conquest

**Synonyms:** enslave, conquer, vanquish, defeat, crush, quell, quash

**Antonym:** liberate

**Usage:** Good pet owners are unwilling to subjugate their dogs by placing them in cages.

### **3. DEMURE (adjective) – संकोची**

**Pronunciation:** duh·myuor

**Meaning:** reserved, modest, and shy

**Synonyms:** modest, meek, mild, reserved, retiring, quiet, shy, bashful

**Antonyms:** brazen, shameless, bold

**Usage:** The princess was a demure woman who hated being in the spotlight.

### **4. INSOUCIANT (adjective) – लापरवाह**

**Pronunciation:** uhn·soo·see·uhnt

**Meaning:** showing a casual lack of concern

**Synonyms:** indifferent, heedless, relaxed, unconcerned, equable, carefree, unruffled

**Antonyms:** anxious, concerned, worried

**Usage:** Since Jane is insouciant about her health, she does not bother to take her medication.

### **5. DISCERN (verb) – पहचानना**

**Pronunciation:** duh·suhn

**Meaning:** recognize or find out

**Synonyms:** perceive, detect, recognize, notice, observe, see, spot, identify

**Antonyms:** overlook, miss

**Usage:** Looking at the muddy footprints in the kitchen will make it easier for us to discern which of the kids stole the plate of cookies.

### **6.OPULENCE (noun) – बहुतायत**

**Pronunciation:** o·pyoo·luhns

**Meaning:** great wealth or luxuriousness

**Synonyms:** richness, luxury, magnificence, grandeur, grandiosity, wealth

**Antonyms:** restraint, poverty

**Usage:** His eyes had never beheld such opulence.

### **7.BEWILDER (verb) – उलझन में डालना**

**Pronunciation:** buh·wil·duh

**Meaning:** cause someone to become perplexed and confused

**Synonyms:** baffle, mystify, bemuse, perplex, puzzle, confuse, confound

**Antonym:** enlighten

**Usage:** Those shifting attitudes bewilder me.

### **8.FERVID (adjective) – जुनूनी**

**Pronunciation:** fuh·vuhd

**Meaning:** intensely enthusiastic or passionate

**Synonyms:** fervent, ardent, passionate, impassioned, intense, vehement, heated

**Antonyms:** unenthusiastic, perfunctory

**Usage:** Although Stewart was fervid about basketball, he really could not play the game very well.

### **9.OFFEND (verb) – अपमान करना**

**Pronunciation:** uh·fend

**Meaning:** to cause another to feel upset or angry

**Synonyms:** affront, upset, displease, distress, hurt, annoy, irritate

**Antonyms:** calm, comfort, please

**Usage:** Neil did not mean to offend anybody with his joke.

### **10.BOUNDLESS (adjective) – असीम**

**Pronunciation:** bawnd·luhs

**Meaning:** unlimited or immense

**Synonyms:** limitless, unlimited, illimitable, unbounded, bottomless, immeasurable

**Antonyms:** limited, bounded, restricted

**Usage:** The toddler's boundless energy seemed endless, as he played from sun up to sun down.
